SUBJECT: SAFEGUARDING FEDERAL TAX INFORMATION – WARNING BANNER

Internal Revenue Code Section 6103(p)(4)(C) requires agencies receiving federal tax information (FTI) to restrict access to those people whose duties and responsibilities require access. As a result, employee warning banners must be posted at all logon points to computers and systems to comply with Security Guidelines for Federal, State, and Local Agencies. Additionally, this policy must be included in all orientation materials for new/transferring users. To assist in this endeavor, the Department of Child Support Services has prepared the enclosed warning banner. This banner must appear at each computer system logon screen when an employee will be permitted immediate access to FTI.

The enclosed banner warns all employees who attempt to gain access to the system that the system may contain Government information which is restricted to authorized users only. It also advises employees who attempt to misuse the system or illegally logon to it that they could be prosecuted. Finally, the banner details the civil and criminal penalties for unauthorized access or disclosure of FTI.

You may refer to IRS Publication 1075, Tax Information Security Guidelines for Federal, State, and Local Agencies, for additional information on this subject. The publication can be reviewed on the Internet by going to http://ftp.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/p1075.pdf.

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In addition to potential legal considerations, the use of banners is a good management and security practice. It is important that staff clearly understand that use of government computers is subject to monitoring, and that there can be no expectation of personal privacy.
