- Identifies various categories of weather conditions
- Indicates what the City's response will be to each category
- Indicates how residents and businesses can help

This helpful information prepares citizens for disruptive winter weather and alerts them regarding the following:

- How snow and ice treatment and removal may affect road conditions
- When rubbish and recycling collections may be delayed
- When to move your vehicle from a Snow Emergency route
- Whether to be on alert for a Snow Emergency declaration

SnowCat 1

warns of street




and road conditions that require caution but do not need major efforts by the City, residents, or business owners.



SnowCat 2 alerts us to a

level of snow that can significantly affect our ability to travel. It can remain and accumulate if freezing temperatures continue.



SnowCat 3

is a heavier

snow fall that requires more extensive use of lifting, salting, and plowing vehicles. Trash and recycling collection may be affected.



DEEP SNOW! Extreme winter conditions. Mayor <u>may</u> declare a "SNOW EMERGENCY." Plan ahead for travel to work, school, and shopping. Below freezing temperatures can create health risks.
