

The following text has been developed by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G), Division of Sport Fish in response to a request from the North Pacific Fishery Management Council (NPFMC)

Bullet #5: Provide a paragraph or so that explains the missing halibut data issue and who could be excluded if the Council uses that data for determining QS allocations – ballpark estimate on the number of individuals excluded, or percent of catch history.

The missing halibut data question makes it difficult to accurately determine eligibility for businesses to qualify for QS, moratoria, or limited entry, as the Department cannot provide clear determinations of who actually took clients fishing for halibut. There are other proxies that could be used, but all are proxies and thus estimates of who may have chartered clients for halibut. Some will exclude people who may have actually chartered clients for halibut while others will likely include those that may not have chartered clients for halibut. For example using groundfish areas as a proxy may exclude people who did not record a groundfish if the only species they chartered for was halibut. Conversely, using overall effort may grant fishing privileges to people who only fish salmon.

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2nd fish alternative

If the state could be delegated authority to manage the charter fleet to stay within either a GHF or an allocation, the state would likely expand the tools it could potentially employ. One such item would include a 2nd fish restriction. This would allow a guided angler to keep one halibut of any size, but would restrict the 2nd fish to a trophy size (e.g., over 100 pounds). This would allow anglers to continue to fish for a trophy, thereby allowing participation in derbies. It would also likely reduce harvest as less than 5% of the halibut caught are over 100 pounds.

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As was discussed at the GHF Committee meeting, if the Board of Fish or the Council were to take action to limit crew harvest, ADF&G would have to modify its methods of estimating harvest for the current year, at least for Area 3A.

In Area 3A, harvest is estimated from a simple linear projection of the past 5 years of mail survey estimates. We don't estimate harvest, but we do conduct interviews to estimate characteristics of the harvest and the fishery (there is a huge difference in cost). Without any other current information, for the first year we would likely project the

harvest as usual, then adjust the projection for the anticipated reduction due to the regulation change. Crew and client harvest are not separated in our interview data, so it might tough teasing out how much of a reduction in harvest is due to the regulation versus year-to-year variation.

In Area 2C, harvest is estimated from a projection of the ratio of creel survey and mail survey estimates for the past several years. In some subareas of 2C the recent 5-year time series is used, in other subareas 3 years is used, and in some subareas a different method is used all together. Methods differ by subarea based on the amount of available data. But at least for most of 2C, inseason harvest data from the creel survey is available that should reflect a change in harvest due to changes in regulations. Thus, methods shouldn't have to change significantly.

Instructions for Completing the Logbook Forms

As the licensed skipper operating this vessel, you are required to complete an entry into this logbook after:

1. returning to the dock and prior to offloading any fish caught and kept during a particular trip.
- OR*
2. if the vessel is launched from a trailer in an area without docking facilities, before the vessel departs the area or is removed from the site of landing, and prior to offloading any fish caught and kept during a particular trip.

The following instructions will assist you in filling in all applicable fields. If you have specific questions regarding logbook entries, please call your local ADF&G office for further clarification.

- ADF&G No.: Record the 5 digit number assigned to the vessel by the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC). A vessel must have this number in order to be a legally licensed charter vessel in Alaska.
- Vessel Name: Record the Vessel Name which corresponds to the ADF&G No. issued by the CFEC.
- Date: Note that the dates are printed on the forms. Make sure that the row being recorded is the actual date of the trip. If you are beginning your season earlier than the starting date of the 1st form in your logbook, or are ending your season later than the last date of the final form in your logbook, you will need to use one of the *Supplemental Logbook Forms* located toward the back of your logbook. Turn in *Supplemental Logbook Forms* along with your weekly form by the due date listed on the weekly form *OR within 7 days following the last entry on the Supplemental Form if prior or later than the pre-printed form.* If you need additional forms, contact your nearest Fish and Game office.
- Inactive (X): If you did not do any business on this vessel for an assigned date, mark an "X" in this column—otherwise, leave blank, and continue to fill in the remaining fields.
- Trip No.: *A trip is defined as the activity of leaving port with paying clients onboard your vessel to go sport fishing. Each trip requires an entry after the vessel returns to port (OR is removed from the site of landing), and/or prior to off-loading fish.* Notice that for each day, there are 2 possible trips listed. This is for those who possibly have more than 1 trip in a given day. Therefore, if you have 2 trips in 1 day, then you are required to fill out the 2 separate lines provided for that day. If you have more than 2 trips in a day, you will also need to fill out one of the *Supplemental Logbook Forms* located toward the back of your logbook. If additional forms are needed, contact your nearest Fish and Game office.
- Day No. of Multi-day trip: If you have a trip that goes on into the next day (or several days), then you will need to denote which day of the trip on each date line to which the harvest pertains. For example, you leave on Wed. Sept. 30th for a 4 day trip, and plan to return Sat. Oct. 3rd. You would record a "1" on Wed., "2" on Thurs., "3" on Fri., etc... Each day would also have to contain all the effort and harvest information pertaining to that specific day, and it must be filled in after completing fishing for that day, even though you are not returning to your primary port (Note: see "Port of Landing for Trip" below).
- USCG Lic. No.: Enter the USCG license number assigned to you as it appears on your license. This is the License issued to you by the US Coast Guard allowing you to legally conduct commercial activities aboard a vessel (i.e. 6-pak license, and the various ton classes).
- Skipper Initials: Requires the initials of the captain whose USCG License Number is listed for this particular trip.
- Port of Landing for Trip: Record the port (or site) to which you are returning for off-loading clients and fish. On a multi-day trip, you would not record a port until the day the trip actually ends (when you off-load your clients and their fish).
- Primary Area Fished for Salmon: Record the 6-digit area code (using the maps provided to you) where you caught the **highest percentage of your salmon catch** (if you fished for salmon on this trip).
- Primary Area Fished for Bottomfish: Record the 6-digit area code (using the maps provided to you) where you caught the **highest percentage of your bottomfish catch** (if you fished for bottomfish on this trip).
- Hours Fishing For Salmon: Record the total number of boat hours where fishing gear was actually deployed fishing for salmon. **DO NOT** include the time it took to run to the fishing grounds from port. Record to the nearest whole hour.
- Hours Fishing For Bottomfish: Record the total number of boat hours where fishing gear was actually deployed fishing for bottomfish. **DO NOT** include the time it took to run to the fishing grounds from port. Record to the nearest whole hour.

The Following Fields Require Catch and Effort break-outs by Residency: residents are those holding a valid State of Alaska RESIDENT Sport Fishing License for the given year, and nonresidents are those holding a valid State of Alaska NONRESIDENT Sport Fishing License for the given year.

No. of Clients: Record the number of clients on-board the vessel for this trip that actively sport fished (do not include those clients who were just whale watching, etc...). Break out by the number of residents and the number of nonresidents on this trip.

Salmon Rods: Record the maximum number of rods/lines fished for salmon at any one time during this trip. Be sure to break out the number of rods used by residents, and the number used by nonresidents while fishing for salmon during this trip.

Bottomfish
Rods: Record the maximum number of rods/lines fished for bottomfish at any one time during this trip. Be sure to break out the number of rods used by residents, and the number used by nonresidents while fishing for bottomfish during this trip.

Catch and
Harvest Info.: Record the total number of fish kept (by species indicated) by resident and nonresident, and when indicated, the total number that were released (by species indicated).

Special Notes regarding Species Categories:

“Shakers”--- are chinook (king) salmon that are under the 28” minimum size (defined only in the Southeast Region) that must be released upon capture.

Pelagic
Rockfish--- are the following species commonly classed into this grouping:

- 1) Dusky rockfish
- 2) Yellowtail rockfish
- 3) Black rockfish

These species of rockfish are uniformly gray, green, brown, or black (see rockfish ID chart in your regulation booklet).

Other (Non-pelagic)

Rockfish--- are all other rockfish not mentioned above. Yelloweye (commonly called “red snapper”) are to be included in this grouping.

NOTE: Harvest Kept by Captain and/or Crew must be recorded on the “***Crew Sport Harvest Logbook Form***” located toward the back of your logbook. This form is to be turned in along with your FINAL logbook form for the season.

Instructions for Saltwater Charter Vessel Logbook

NOTE:

Both the Logbook form and the Supplemental form require a break down by residency. “Residents” hold a valid State of Alaska **resident** sport fishing license for the given year. “Nonresidents” hold a valid State of Alaska **nonresident** sport fishing license for the given year.

Catch information must ALSO be recorded for captains, crew and/or non-paying clients.

When Must the Logbook Forms be Completed?

As the owner or agent of the business operating this vessel, you are required to complete an entry into this logbook:

1. **After** returning to the dock and **before** off-loading any fish caught and kept during a particular trip.

OR

2. If the vessel is launched from a trailer in an area without docking facilities, **before the vessel departs the area** or is removed from the site of landing, and **before** off-loading any fish caught and kept during a particular trip.

How to Complete the Logbook Forms

If you have any questions, please call your local ADF&G office for further clarification.

ADF&G No. (CFEC Triangle)

Write the 5-digit number (the “triangle number”) assigned to the vessel by the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC). A vessel must have this number to be a legally licensed sport charter vessel in Alaska.

Vessel Name

Write the name of the vessel, or identify the vessel so that it corresponds to the CFEC Triangle No.

Date

PLEASE NOTE: the dates are preprinted on the Weekly forms. Make sure that the row you’re writing in is the actual date of the trip!

If your charter season starts before or ends after the preprinted dates (before April 26 or after September 26), use one of the Supplemental Logbook Forms located toward the back of your logbook. Turn in the Supplemental Logbook Form when you have filled it up completely or when you are through chartering for the season. If you need additional forms, contact your nearest ADF&G office.

Inactive

If you do not go charter sport fishing on this vessel for a date that is preprinted, mark an “X” in the inactive box and leave the rest of the row blank. Resume filling in the sheet when you are active again (charter sport fishing). Be sure the preprinted date matches the date of your next active charter.

Day No. of Multi-day Trip

If you have a trip that goes more than one day (or several days), then you will need to mark which day of the trip it is (day 1, 2, or 3...etc.). Information should be recorded for each day of the trip.

For example; you leave on Wed. Sept. 30 for a 4-day trip, and plan to return Sat. Oct. 3. You would write down “1” on Wed., “2” on Thurs., “3” on Fri., ...etc. Each day’s entry should also contain all the effort and harvest information for that specific day, and it must be filled in after completing fishing for that day, even though you are not returning to your primary port (*see* “Port or Site of Off-Loading”).

Port or Site of Off-Loading

Record the port (or site) to which you are returning for off-loading clients and fish. On a multi-day trip, you would **not** record a port until the day the trip actually ends (when you off-load your clients and their fish).

Number of Clients and Crew

For each trip, write the number of clients who **actively** sport fished from your vessel (do **not** include those clients who were just whale watching, bear viewing, etc.) Break down the number of **residents** and the number of **nonresidents**.

Write the number of crew who sport fished.

Primary Area Fished (For Salmon)

Write the 6-digit area code (from the maps provided) where you caught the **highest percentage** of your salmon catch (if you fished for salmon on this trip). Enter only one code per salmon fishing trip.

No. Rods Fished for Salmon

Write down the **highest** number of rods/lines fished for salmon at any one time during this trip. Be sure to break out the number of rods used by residents, and the number used by nonresidents while fishing for salmon during this trip.

Boat Hours Fished (For Salmon)

Write the number of boat hours that active salmon fishing occurred. **DO NOT include the time it took to run to the fishing grounds from port.** Record to the nearest whole hour.

Number of King Salmon

Write the number of king salmon kept and the number released; distinguish **resident** and **nonresident** catch and harvest.

“**Shakers**” are chinook (king) salmon that are under Southeast Alaska’s 28” minimum size. In Southeast Alaska, shakers must be released upon capture.

Number of Other Salmon

Write the number of fish kept for each species, and the number of coho released; distinguish **resident** and **nonresident** catch and harvest.

Primary Area Fished (For Bottomfish)

Write the 6-digit area code (from the maps provided) where you caught the **highest percentage** of your bottomfish catch (if you fished for bottomfish on this trip). Enter only one code per bottomfish fishing trip.

No. Rods Fished for Bottomfish

Write the **highest** number of rods/lines fished for bottomfish at any one time during this trip. Break out the number of rods used by residents, and the number used by nonresidents while fishing for bottomfish during this trip.

Boat Hours Fished (For Bottomfish)

Write the number of boat hours that active bottomfish fishing occurred. **DO NOT include the time it took to run to the fishing grounds from port.** Record to the nearest whole hour.

Number of Halibut

Write the number of halibut kept and the number released.

Number of Pelagic Rockfish (Black Bass); Number of Other Rockfish (Red Snapper)

Write the number of the various rockfish that are caught and the number released. You may want to refer to the full-color rockfish ID page found in most of the Sport Fishing Regulation Summaries.

Pelagic rockfish are commonly called:

- 1) Dusky rockfish
- 2) Yellowtail rockfish
- 3) Black rockfish (commonly called Black Sea Bass)

Pelagic rockfish are uniformly gray, green, brown, or black.

“Other rockfish,” or non-pelagic rockfish, are all other rockfish not mentioned above. Yelloweye (commonly called “red snapper”) are included in the “other rockfish” category.

Number of Lingcod

Write the number of lingcod caught and the number released. Show resident vs. nonresident information.

ALL forms (Weekly and Supplemental) **must** be signed by the owner or agent of the business operating the vessel to which this logbook was assigned. **Failure to do so may invalidate your report.**

Supplemental Logbook Sheet Instructions

The instructions for this sheet are the same, with the addition of:

Trip No. for a Day

A “**trip**” is defined as “the activity of leaving port with paying clients onboard your vessel to go sport fishing.” Each trip requires an entry after the vessel returns to port (OR is removed from the site of landing), and/or before off-loading fish.

If you have more than 1 trip in a given day, record the first trip on the preprinted Weekly logbook sheets. Record each additional trip for that same day in the Supplemental Logbook Forms located toward the back of your logbook. Write the date, and that it is trip 2, 3, etc. for that day.

Instructions for Saltwater Charter Vessel Logbook

NOTE:

Both the Logbook form and the Supplemental form require a break down by residency. “**Residents**” hold a valid State of Alaska **resident** sport fishing license for the given year. “**Nonresidents**” hold a valid State of Alaska **nonresident** sport fishing license for the given year.

Catch information must ALSO be recorded for captains, crew and/or non-paying clients.

When Must the Logbook Forms be Completed?

As the owner or agent of the business operating this vessel, you are required to complete an entry into this logbook:

1. **After** returning to the dock and **before** off-loading any fish caught and kept during a particular trip.

OR

2. If the vessel is launched from a trailer in an area without docking facilities, **before the vessel departs the area** or is removed from the site of landing, and **before** off-loading any fish caught and kept during a particular trip.

How to Complete the Logbook Forms

If you have any questions, please call your local ADF&G office for further clarification.

ADF&G No. (CFEC Triangle)

Write the 5-digit number (the “triangle number”) assigned to the vessel by the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC). A vessel must have this number to be a legally licensed sport charter vessel in Alaska.

Vessel Name

Write the name of the vessel, or identify the vessel so that it corresponds to the CFEC Triangle No.

Date

PLEASE NOTE: the dates are preprinted on the Weekly forms. Make sure that the row you’re writing in is the actual date of the trip!

If your charter season starts before or ends after the preprinted dates (before April 24 or after October 1), use one of the Supplemental Logbook Forms located toward the back of your logbook. Turn in the Supplemental Logbook Form when you have filled it up completely or when you are through chartering for the season. If you need additional forms, contact your nearest ADF&G office.

Inactive

If you do not go charter sport fishing on this vessel for a date that is preprinted, mark an “X” in the inactive box and leave the rest of the row blank. Day No. of Multi-day Trip

Number of Clients and Crew

For each trip, write the number of clients who **actively** sport fished from your vessel (do **not** include those clients who were just whale watching, bear viewing, etc.) Break down the number of **residents** and the number of **nonresidents**.

Write the number of crew who sport fished.

Primary Area Fished (For Salmon)

Write the 6-digit area code (from the maps provided) where you caught the **highest percentage** of your salmon catch (if you fished for salmon on this trip). Enter only one code per salmon fishing trip.

No. Rods Fished for Salmon

Write down the **highest** number of rods/lines fished for salmon at any one time during this trip. Be sure to break out the number of rods used by residents, and the number used by nonresidents while fishing for salmon during this trip.

Boat Hours Fished (For Salmon)

Write the number of boat hours that active salmon fishing occurred. **DO NOT include the time it took to run to the fishing grounds from port.** Record to the nearest whole hour.



Instructions, Continued

Number of King Salmon

Write the number of king salmon kept and the number released; distinguish **resident** and **nonresident** catch and harvest.

“**Shakers**” are chinook (king) salmon that are under Southeast Alaska’s 28” minimum size. In Southeast Alaska, shakers must be released upon capture.

Number of Other Salmon

Write the number of fish kept for each species, and the number of coho released; distinguish **resident** and **nonresident** catch and harvest.

Primary Area Fished (For Bottomfish)

Write the 6-digit area code (from the maps provided) where you caught the **highest percentage** of your bottomfish catch (if you fished for bottomfish on this trip). Enter only one code per bottomfish fishing trip.

No. Rods Fished for Bottomfish

Write the **highest** number of rods/lines fished for bottomfish at any one time during this trip. Break out the number of rods used by residents, and the number used by nonresidents while fishing for bottomfish during this trip.

Boat Hours Fished (For Bottomfish)

Write the number of boat hours that active bottomfish fishing occurred. **DO NOT include the time it took to run to the fishing grounds from port.** Record to the nearest whole hour.

Number of Halibut

Write the number of halibut kept and the number released.

Number of Pelagic Rockfish (Black Bass); Number of Other Rockfish (Red Snapper)

Write the number of the various rockfish that are caught and the number released. You may want to refer to the full-color rockfish ID page found in most of the Sport Fishing Regulation Summaries.

Pelagic rockfish are commonly called:

- 1) Dusky rockfish
- 2) Yellowtail rockfish
- 3) Black rockfish (commonly called Black Sea Bass)

Pelagic rockfish are uniformly gray, green, brown, or black.

“Other rockfish,” or non-pelagic rockfish, are all other rockfish not mentioned above. Yelloweye (commonly called “red snapper”) are included in the “other rockfish” category.

Number of Lingcod

Write the number of lingcod caught and the number released. Show resident vs. nonresident information.

Certification

ALL forms (Weekly and Supplemental) **must** be signed by the owner or agent of the business operating the vessel to which this logbook was assigned. **Failure to do so may invalidate your report.**

Supplemental Logbook Sheet Instructions

The instructions for this sheet are the same, with the addition of:

Trip No. for a Day

A “**trip**” is defined as “the activity of leaving port with paying clients onboard your vessel to go sport fishing.” Each trip requires an entry after the vessel returns to port (OR is removed from the site of landing), and/or before off-loading fish.

If you have more than 1 trip in a given day, record the first trip on the preprinted Weekly logbook sheets. Record each additional trip for that same day in the Supplemental Logbook Forms located toward the back of your logbook. Write the date, and that it is trip 2, 3, etc. for that day.

No. Boat Hours Fished	The number of boat hours at least one rod/line was fishing for bottomfish. This is NOT the number of hours the boat was on the water. DO NOT include the time it took to run to the fishing grounds from port. Round to the nearest whole hour.
Fish Kept & Released	The total number of fish kept and released by client and crew as indicated. Do NOT combine client and crew information.

SPECIAL NOTES—RODS, BOAT HOURS.

What species group was targeted?	An operator must decide if gear and fishing methods were effectively targeting salmon, bottomfish, or both species groups.
BASIC RULE	Simply write the number of rods and boat hours under each target species group. The sum of targeted boat hours may or may not exceed the hours the boat was engaged in fishing (see below)
EXAMPLE:	If SALMON were targeted, write the number of rods and number of boat hours under the SALMON section, even if no salmon were caught or kept.

Salmon Shark	This is a single species <i>Lamna ditropis</i> . These sharks are firm, dark brown or black on top, bellies white with black blotches.

Supplemental Logbook Sheets used after April 22 should be submitted when a form is full or when you are through fishing for the season (whichever comes first).

Supplemental Logbook Sheets may be adapted to special needs. For example, two trips are taken in a day, then the vessel departs on a multi-day trip. Use the **Supplemental Form** to report the first day of the multi-day trip.

Additional **Supplemental Logbooks Sheets** beyond the five in this logbook are available from local ADF&G offices.

Number of Clients and Crew Fishing	The number of clients and crew who fished any part of the trip, whether or not they landed a fish. If crew do not fish, leave crew blank. DO NOT add crew information to client information.

No. Boat Hours Fished	The number of boat hours that at least one rod/line was targeting bottomfish (incl. halibut) and targeting salmon and bottomfish simultaneously. Record only number of hours spent fishing, NOT hours spent running to or from fishing areas. Round to the nearest whole hour.
Fish Kept & Released	The total number of fish kept and released by client and crew as indicated. DO NOT combine client and crew information. DO NOT record harvests of finfish other than those indicated. Halibut information is no longer being collected in logbooks. This information is collected through established survey programs.

SPECIAL NOTES—RODS, BOAT HOURS.

What species or group was targeted?	An operator must decide if gear and fishing methods were effectively targeting salmon, bottomfish, or both species groups.
EXAMPLE 1: ONE TARGET SALMON	After completing the first five columns, record the maximum number of rods and number of boat hours in the appropriate columns in the salmon section, even if no salmon were caught or kept. 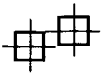

FIRST AND LAST TRIPS

Mark your first and last trips of the season by checking the box on the lower right portion of the logbook sheet.

COMPLETE LOGBOOKS DAILY

During the period April 19-September 26, 2004, once a vessel has been used for charter fishing, the logbook must be completed daily (including inactive days) through the last trip of the season. It is not necessary to start logbook entries until the vessel is actually used for a charter fishing trip during 2004.

The owner or agent of the business operating this vessel is required to make an entry into this logbook per the following schedule.

RETURNING TO A DOCK

- **FISH KEPT**
Complete the logbook before offloading any clients or fish.
- **NO FISH KEPT**
Complete the logbook before the operator leaves the vessel.

NO DOCKING FACILITIES (e.g., trailered vessels)

- **FISH KEPT**
Complete the logbook before the vessel or operator departs the landing site and before offloading any fish.
- **NO FISH KEPT**
Complete the logbook before the vessel or operator departs the landing site.

MULTIPLE TRIPS PER DAY

Complete the logbook at the end of each trip, as described above.

MULTIPLE DAY TRIPS

Complete the logbook at day's end for each day of the trip; complete the last day's activity as described above.

PERIODS OF INACTIVITY

Once a vessel has been used for a charter trip between April 19-Sept 26, 2004, the logbook must be completed daily to report inactivity or fishing trips. A logbook sheet must be submitted weekly, even if no trips were taken for the entire week.

TRIPS PRIOR TO APRIL 19 OR AFTER SEPT. 26, 2004

Should be recorded on the Supplemental sheets provided in the logbook.

RETURN LOGBOOK REPORTS WEEKLY

Once a vessel has been used for a charter fishing trip, the logbook must be completed daily and returned per the schedule printed on each logbook sheet until a sheet is submitted indicating that the vessel has taken its last trip for the year. Logbook sheets must be received by ADF&G offices or postmarked by the date specified on each logbook sheet.

WEEKLY & SUPPLEMENTAL SHEETS

Weekly Logbook Sheets should be used to report charter fishing trips and inactive days between April 19 and September 26, 2004.

Supplemental Logbook Sheets should be used to report charter fishing activity before April 19 or after September 26, or to report trips in addition to the first two trips taken on any day.

Supplemental Logbook Sheets used prior to April 19 should be postmarked by May 3.

Supplemental Logbook Sheets used after April 19 should be submitted with the concurrent weekly sheet with the deadline noted on top of the page or monthly if used after September 26, 2004.

Supplemental Logbook Sheets may be adapted to special needs. For example, two trips are taken in a day, then the vessel departs on a multi-day trip. Use the **Supplemental Form** to report the first day of the multi-day trip.

DO NOT sum information for two or more trips; each trip must be reported separately in the Logbook. The first two trips on a day should be reported on the Weekly Logbook Sheets ; all additional trips for the same day would be reported on a Supplemental Logbook Sheet . Day No. of Multi-day trip	This applies to trips that span two or more calendar days (see definition of Trip above). A "1" would be entered for the first day of a trip, "2" would be written for the second day, and so on until the trip is completed.

Number of Clients and Crew Fishing	The number of clients and crew who fished any part of the trip, whether or not they landed a fish. If crew do not fish, leave crew blank. DO NOT add crew information to client information.

Maximum Rods Fished	The maximum number of rods/lines fished when targeting salmon and targeting both salmon and bottomfish (incl. halibut) simultaneously. Record this information separately for clients and crew; DO NOT combine client and crew information.
No. Boat Hours Fished	The number of boat hours at least one rod/line was targeting salmon and targeting salmon and bottomfish (incl. halibut) simultaneously. Record only number of hours spent fishing, NOT hours spent running to or from fishing areas. Round to the nearest whole hour.
Fish Kept & Released	The total number of fish kept and released by client and crew as indicated. DO NOT combine client and crew information.

BOTTOMFISH

Primary Stat Area Fished (Incl. Halibut)	The 6-digit area code where you caught most of the bottomfish on this trip. If you fished for bottomfish, but caught none, write the 6-digit code for the location fished the most time on this date and trip.
Maximum Rods Fished	The maximum number of rods/lines fished when targeting bottomfish (incl. halibut) and targeting both salmon and bottomfish simultaneously. Record this information separately for clients and crew; DO NOT combine client and crew information.
No. Boat Hours Fished	The number of boat hours that at least one rod/line was targeting bottomfish (incl. halibut) and targeting salmon and bottomfish simultaneously. Record only number of hours spent fishing, NOT hours spent running to or from fishing areas. Round to the nearest whole hour.
Fish Kept & Released	The total number of fish kept and released by client and crew. DO NOT combine client and crew information. DO NOT record harvests of finfish other than those indicated. Halibut kept & released is no longer being collected in logbooks, but effort continues to be collected. Halibut kept and released data is collected through established survey programs.

NOTES AND EXAMPLES—RODS, BOAT HOURS

What species group was targeted?	An operator must decide if gear and fishing methods were effectively targeting salmon, bottomfish, or both species groups.
EXAMPLE 1: ONE TARGET SALMON	After completing the first five columns, record the maximum number of rods and number of boat hours in the appropriate columns in the salmon section, even if no salmon were caught or kept. NOTE: If bottomfish are caught when targeting salmon only, record the number of bottomfish in the appropriate columns in the bottomfish section, but leave columns for maximum number of rods and boat hours fished in the bottomfish section blank-DO NOT record information in these columns.
EXAMPLE 2: ONE TARGET BOTTOMFISH (including halibut)	After completing the first five columns, record the maximum number of rods and number of boat hours in the appropriate columns in the bottomfish section, even if no bottomfish were caught or kept. EXAMPLE 3: TWO TARGETS SALMON AND BOTTOMFISH (including halibut) simultaneously (i.e. mooching)	After completing the first five columns, record the maximum number of rods and boat hours spent fishing simultaneously for salmon and bottomfish in the appropriate columns in BOTH the salmon and bottomfish sections. For example, if mooching for 4 hours with up to 4 rods, record 4 hours and 4 rods in the salmon effort columns, and 4 hours and 4 rods in the bottomfish effort columns.

SPECIAL NOTES AND INSTRUCTIONS

“Halibut”	The number of halibut kept and released is no longer requested in the logbook. However, we ask that you continue to record your effort . Complete the first five columns on the far left of each logbook page and the first three columns under the Bottomfish section (stat area, no. rods, and boat hrs).
“Shakers”	Chinook (king) salmon that are under the 28” minimum size (Southeast Region only) that must be released upon capture, unless caught in designated terminal harvest areas.
Pelagic Rockfish	Includes black and dusky rockfish (commonly called "black bass") and yellowtail rockfish. These species of rockfish are uniformly gray, green, brown, or black (see rockfish ID chart in your regulation booklet).
Non-pelagic Rockfish	All other rockfish not mentioned above. Includes yelloweye (commonly called “red snapper”), quillback, and copper rockfish, as well as numerous other species.
Salmon Shark	This is a single species <i>Lamna ditropis</i> . These sharks are large, firm, dark brown or black on top, with white bellies with dark blotches. Do not include spiny dogfish (“sand shark”) or sleeper sharks (“mud sharks”) in this category.

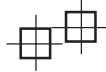

WHEN TO WRITE IN YOUR LOGBOOK

Do not write in a date for those days when guided fishing activity did not occur. Write down only the dates fished.

RETURNING THE LOGBOOK REPORTS

All fishing activity that occurs between January 1, 2005 through September 30, 2005 must be received by ADF&G offices or postmarked by October 15, 2005. Fishing activity that occurs between October 1, 2005 and December 31, 2005 must be received by ADF&G offices or postmarked by January 15, 2006.

Logbook sheets can be returned to ADF&G as they are completed. You do not need to wait until October 15, 2005 to turn in your active sheets.

VESSEL REGISTRATION

Vessels that are used exclusively in sport fishing activities, no longer need to be licensed with CFEC (Commercial Fish Entry Commission). A vessel used in sport fishing activities will be required to register with the Dept. of Fish and Game (ADF&G) when a logbook is issued.

All vessels must have a current AK # issued by the Dept. of Motor Vehicles (DMV) prior to registering with ADF&G.

One set of ADF&G decals will be issued per registered vessel.

Decals must be applied and visible on both sides of the vessel. Decals do not have to be applied directly to the hull of the vessel. Decals can be adhered to wood, fiberglass or Plexiglas which in turn is secured to both sides of the vessel. Decals can be transferred from one vessel to another, as long as the receiving vessel has a current AK # from DMV.

If a vessel is purchased or borrowed in mid-season, secure a current AK # for it. New decals can be acquired from ADF&G, or decals from a current vessel can be transferred. Any vessel participating in sport fishing activities with clients onboard must display the two decals visibly.

RESPONSIBILITY OF OWNER AND GUIDE

It is the responsibility of the guide to assure that daily fishing activity is recorded in a timely manner as previously described.

It is the responsibility of the business owner to assure that all data for fishing activities from January 1, 2005 through December 31, 2005 is submitted to ADF&G in the manner specified above.

TRANSFERRING A LOGBOOK

A logbook is issued to a specific business followed by the intended primary vessel used for the duration of the fishing season. If a new vessel is added to the same business, a new logbook should be issued from a local ADF&G office.

HOW TO FILL OUT THE LOGBOOK

LOGBOOK DATA

Date	The date for each trip taken. If two trips to two different fishing sites were taken in one day, that date would appear on two lines with corresponding data for each trip taken.
Guide License Number	Write down the current guide license number of the guide that led that fishing trip.
Port of Landing	The port (or site) where clients and/or fish are offloaded at the conclusion of the trip.

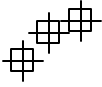

NOTES AND EXAMPLES—RODS, BOAT HOURS

What species group was targeted?	An operator must decide if gear and fishing methods were effectively targeting salmon, bottomfish, or both species groups.
EXAMPLE 1: ONE TARGET SALMON	After completing the first five columns, record the maximum number of rods and number of boat hours in the appropriate columns in the salmon section, even if no salmon were caught or kept. NOTE: If bottomfish are caught when targeting salmon only, record the number of bottomfish in the appropriate columns in the bottomfish section, but leave columns for maximum number of rods and boat hours fished in the bottomfish section blank-DO NOT record information in these columns.

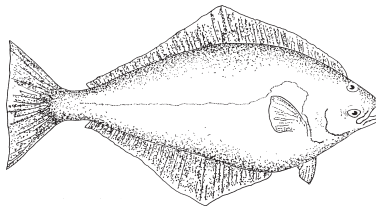

WHEN TO COMPLETE A LOGBOOK

The licensed guide operating this vessel is required to enter trip information into this logbook as follows:

RETURNING TO A DOCK:

- Complete the logbook before offloading any clients or fish.

NO DOCKING FACILITIES (e.g., trailered vessels):

- Complete the logbook before the vessel or operator departs the landing site and before offloading any fish.

A TRIP IS DEFINED as one outing with one group of clients.

MULTIPLE TRIPS PER DAY

Each trip of multiple trips in a day should be logged on a separate logbook sheet. Complete the logbook at the end of each trip as described above.

MULTIPLE DAY TRIPS

Complete the logbook after each day fished; note the day number and total number of days for this trip on each sheet in the space provided.

Complete the last day's activity as described above.

Do not complete trip information for those days when guided fishing activity did not occur.

RETURN THE LOGBOOK REPORTS WEEKLY

All charter fishing activity that occurs between April 1, 2006 through October 1, 2006 must be received by ADF&G offices or postmarked by the **WEEKLY** schedule provided on the inside of the front cover of this book.

Fishing activity that occurs prior to April 1, 2006 is due to ADF&G by April 15, 2006, activity after October 1, 2006 must be received by ADF&G offices or postmarked by January 15, 2007.

RESPONSIBILITY OF OWNER & GUIDE

It is the responsibility of the **guide** to ensure that daily trip activity is accurately recorded as previously described.

It is the responsibility of the **business owner** (owner of the sport fish operators license) to ensure that all data for fishing activities from January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006 is submitted to ADF&G in the manner previously described.

TRANSFERRING A LOGBOOK

A logbook is issued to a specific business for a specific vessel. If a **new vessel** is added to the same business, that vessel must be registered and a new logbook will be issued from a local ADF&G office.

If another vessel is substituted for the primary vessel during a temporary period, the **substituted vessel** must have a current AK no. or a U.S.C.G. documentation number and be registered with ADF&G. Vessel decals must be displayed on the substitute vessel. The original logbook can be used on the substitute vessel only during this temporary period.

VESSEL REGISTRATION

A vessel used in sport fishing guide activities is required to register with ADF&G. Sport fishing charter vessels no longer need to be licensed with the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC).

All vessels must have a current AK no. issued by the Div. of Motor Vehicles (DMV) or a U.S.C.G. documentation number prior to registering with ADF&G. **If the vessel has an AK no., the AK no. must be displayed during guided fishing operations.**

If a vessel is purchased, leased, or borrowed in mid-season, secure a current AK no. for it, notify ADF&G at (907) 267-2369 and be prepared to provide vessel information. A voice mail message can also be left. New decals can be acquired from ADF&G, or decals from an unused vessel can be transferred. All vessels used in the sport fishing guide industry with clients onboard, must have two decals visibly displayed. A **new logbook** must be issued to this vessel if this vessel is intended to be used for the remainder of the season.

VESSEL DECALS/RENEWAL TAGS

One set of ADF&G decals will be issued per registered vessel. Decals must be applied and visible on both sides of the vessel. Decals do not have to be applied directly to the hull of the vessel. Decals can be adhered to wood, fiberglass or Plexiglas which in turn is secured to both sides of the vessel. Decals can be transferred from one vessel to another, as long as the receiving vessel has a current AK no. from DMV and has been registered with ADF&G. Decals are designed to withstand several years of use. Annual renewal stickers or tags will be issued as vessels are registered. Annual renewal tags are to be adhered directly to the decal in the designated area.

WHAT A GUIDE MUST HAVE IN POSSESSION WHILE GUIDING

While engaged in providing sport fishing guide services, a sport fishing guide shall have the following readily available for inspection by request of a representative of the department or a peace officer of the state:

- A current sport fishing guide license;
- A copy of the current ADF&G sport fishing operator's (business owner) license of the guide's employer;
- A current Alaska sport fishing license, tags, stamps or permits that are required to engage in the sport fishery for which guide services are being provided;
- An identification card issued to the sport fishing guide by a state or federal agency that bears a photo of the sport fishing guide.
- **Other agencies may have additional requirements (e.g. U.S.C.G.). It is your responsibility to determine what those requirements are.**

PROXY FISHING INSTRUCTIONS

If a paying client is also proxy fishing for a beneficiary, that client **MUST** have the fishing license of the person he/she is fishing for. Write down the license number of the recipient of the fish (beneficiary), followed by a "**P**" to indicate proxy, i.e. **600154 – P**. Indicate **R** for Resident in the adjacent column; beneficiaries must be residents of Alaska.

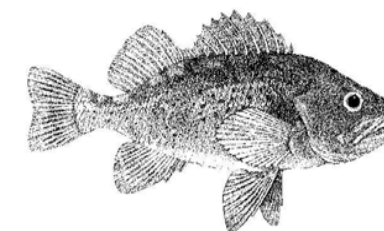

Both salmon and bottomfish were targeted. This was a 7 hour trip, 3 hours were spent targeting salmon, 4 hours were spent targeting bottomfish. 5 rods were fished for both salmon and bottomfish.
