As parents of a child with special needs, we know you need support. We know because we've been there. Parent-to-parent support, through statewide family resource centers, is one of the most important components of the California Early Start service system.

Family resource centers and networks are recognized as providing support in a family-friendly atmosphere. Because every center is staffed by parents who have children with special needs, family resource centers and networks understand the emotional needs of families and provide an understanding of the local service system.

Family resource centers and networks provide information and support to assist families in their interactions with different agencies providing services. They promote positive relationships and model communication and problem-solving skills.



In California, family resource centers and networks offer parent-to-parent support and help parents, families, and children locate and use needed services. Family resource centers and networks vary to meet the needs in each area of the state. Family

resource center staff and volunteers offer support services and resources in many languages.

Many family resource centers and networks offer newsletters, resource libraries, websites, parent-to-parent groups, and sibling support groups. Telephone "warmlines" or "babylines" for support. Information and referral for parents and professionals is also offered.
