The inspection at the Hope Creek Generating Station evaluated the performance of your emergency response organization (ERO) during the April 11, 2000, full-participation exercise, the post-exercise critique, and the emergency preparedness performance indicators as specified in the reactor oversight program. The inspectors discussed the findings of this inspection with members of your staff on April 13, 2000.

This inspection was an examination of activities conducted under your license as they relate to safety and compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and with the conditions of your license. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of a selected examination of procedures and representative records, observations of activities, and interviews with personnel.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Hope Creek Generating Station April 10 - 13, 2000 Inspection Report Number 05000354/2000-004

The report covers a 1 week onsite period of an announced inspection of the biennial exercise by region based inspectors (two emergency preparedness specialists, a reactor engineer and a security specialist). If applicable, the significance of issues is indicated by their color (green, white, yellow, red) and was determined by the Significance Determination Process in Inspection Manual Chapter 0609.

1. REACTOR SAFETY

Cornerstone: Emergency Preparedness (EP)

1EP1 Drill, Exercise, and Actual Events

a. <u>Inspection Scope</u>

The inspectors reviewed:

- Exercise objectives and scenario to determine if the exercise would test major elements of the licensee's emergency plan.
- Observed and evaluated the licensee's biennial full-participation exercise
 performance by focusing on risk-significant activities in the simulator control
 room, the technical support center, the operations support center, and the
 emergency operations facility.
- Assessed the emergency response organization's (ERO) recognition of abnormal plant conditions, classification of emergency conditions, notification of offsite agencies, development of protective action recommendations, command and control, communications, utilization of repair and field monitoring teams, and the overall implementation of the emergency plan.
- Observed the post-exercise critique to evaluate the licensee's self-assessment of the exercise.

b. Observations and Findings

No significant findings were identified.

4. OTHER ACTIVITIES

4OA1 Performance Indicator Verification

a. Inspection Scope

The inspectors verified the licensee's system for identifying the data for the past two years that is utilized to determine the values for the three EP performance indicators (PI):

- Drill and Exercise Performance (DEP)
- ERO Drill Participation, and
- Alert and Notification System Reliability.

The review also included:

- Current and historical records for each PI.
- Drill/exercise records and siren testing records.

b. Observations and Findings

No significant findings were identified.

4OA2 Identification and Resolution of Problems

a. <u>Inspection Scope</u>

The inspectors reviewed licensee findings (audits and critiques) pertaining to the recent drills (third quarter 1999 and first quarter 2000) and the last licensee biennial exercise critique to determine if performance trends exist and to determine the effectiveness of licensee corrective actions based upon ERO performance during the exercise.

b. Observations and Findings

No significant findings were identified.
