- .3 Weapons Demonstration
- a. Inspection Scope

The inspection team evaluated the firearms proficiency of security force members by observing a range demonstration by six individuals selected jointly by inspectors and the licensee. The demonstration of the licensee's course of fire took place on July 18, 2001. The inspectors evaluated whether each of the six selected individuals were capable of effectively engaging the targets using the hand gun and rifle from each type plant defensive position used as part of the defensive strategy. The firing demonstration consisted of firing from elevated positions, from behind barricades, through smoke and at fixed and moving targets. Requirements for weapons training are found in the Turkey Point Physical Security Plan and 10 CFR 73.55, Appendix H.

b. Findings

There were no findings of significance identified.

4. Security Strategy Evaluation:

a. Inspection Scope

On July 16, 2001, the inspection team met with the licensee's security and operations personnel to discuss reactor target sets. The inspectors reviewed the licensee's current protective strategy including the target set analysis and response force procedures. The inspectors toured the vital areas, the defensive positions, and evaluated the training of the central and secondary alarm station operators. During the tour, inspectors also observed the defensive positions, i.e. steel barriers with weapons ports. These engineered features were relied upon by licensee security forces during drill response evaluations. The inspectors, with the assistance of three NRC contractors, conducted four force-on-force (FOF) and four table top exercises with security personnel responsible for implementing the response strategies. Inspectors also evaluated predrill preparatory activities conducted by the licensee which included adversary and controller operational and safety briefings. Post drill critiques were also observed and evaluated by inspection team members following drill completion. Evaluation for response activities was conducted to ensure licensee compliance with the Turkey Point Contingency Response Plan.

b. Findings

There were no findings of significance identified.
