

# Washington Quick Facts from the Census of Agriculture


The 2002 Census of Agriculture is the most comprehensive source of statistics portraying Washington State agriculture.

A farm or ranch is defined as any place from which \$1,000 or more of agricultural products were produced and sold, or normally would have been sold, during the reference year.








### Primary Occupation of Principal Operator - Farming or Other: 2002


