Baby Bottle Pop Sour Candy by Topps Candy Company Catherine Leitao (203-966-5273) called to tell us her 11-year-old peanut-allergic son had a reaction after eating about half of one of these candies. He said right away that his lips felt funny. Within a few minutes his top lip started swelling and his face got puffy. She gave him 4 teaspoons of Benadryl and drove him to the hospital, where he was given epinephrine in the emergency room and was released after observation. She still has the uneaten portion of the candy.
