## Lespedeza capitata

## Round-headed Bush Clover



An upright, stiffish plant with creamy-white or pinkish-white clusters of flowers. Dried seedheads are attractive in the winter. Good for dry sites. An important food plant for bobwhite quail.

Suggested companions: switch grass (Panicum virgatum), other grasses, smooth aster (Aster laevis), old-field goldenrod (Solidago nemoralis), other goldenrods.
