

## **KENTUCKY FACTS**

Total Land Area: 25,388,000 Acres 39,732.3 Square Miles

#### Population (2000): Total - 4,041,769

Farms: 84.000 Ranks 4th in Number of Farms behind Texas, Missouri and Iowa.

Land in Farms: 13,700,000 Acres Farmland accounts for 54 percent of the total acreage in Kentucky.

Average Size Farm: 163 Acres

Number of Farms with Gross Value of Sales greater than \$10,000: 31,000 or 37%

Average Value of Land & Buildings (2006): \$2,750 per Acre

Off-Farm Storage Facilities (2006): 190. Storage Capacity: 65,000,000 Bu.

Rated On-Farm Storage Capacity (2006): 175,000,000 Bu.

Sales of horses, including stud fees, was the cash receipt leader for Kentucky with \$1.01 billion.

All Poultry (broilers, eggs and other) ranked second in value of sales with \$813.8 million, down less than 1 percent from 2004.
