ADVANCE REPORT ON RETAIL SALES, JUNE 1962

Total sales of retail stores in June were \$20.1 billion, the U. S. Department of Commerce announced today. After adjustment for seasonal variations and trading day differences, but not for price changes, total retail sales amounted to \$19.1 billion, about 2 percent below May and 5 percent above June 1961.

The June sales figures are based on the Advance Report on Retail Trade a monthly survey of the Bureau of the Census conducted in cooperation with a representative cross-section of about 2,000 retail firms which, in total, operate some 39,000 stores in the United States. The firms which are cooperating in the early reporting of sales are part of a larger sample group which furnishes figures at a later date. The advance estimates are subject to revision in the estimates subsequently derived from the full sample, but the revision of the total seldom exceeds $1\frac{1}{2}$ percent.

The advance Census figures for June are shown in table 1 of this release. The Office of Business Economics indicated that, after adjustment for seasonal variations and trading day differences, June sales for both durable and nondurable goods stores were down compared with May. The largest decline was reported in the automotive group, but most other lines of trade also were off. Estimates for May for the full sample indicate that seasonally adjusted retail sales were about 1 percent below April.
