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

The Oregon Coast National Marine Sanctuary


The Governor's Objectives:

An Ecosystem Approach to Management




- Ending the Threat of Offshore Oil & Gas Drilling
- Increased Funding for Research and Monitoring
- Increased Federal-State Partnerships, particularly outside of State Waters
- Boosting Coastal Tourism

The Proposed Oregon Coast National Marine Sanctuary: Extent



National Marine Sanctuary Program

- Administered by NOAA/NOS
- Marine Protection, Research & Sanctuaries Act of 1972
- Functions of a National Marine Sanctuary
 - Research and Monitoring
 - Education and Outreach
 - Maritime/Cultural Heritage
 - Resource Protection














The Ocean Policy Advisory Council (OPAC)

Multi-stakeholder group of appointees (fishing, conservation, tribal, ports) with *ex officio* heads of relevant state agencies; advises Oregon Governor



Of Particular Interest:

In his initial letter to the Oregon legislative delegation, the Governor stated that he intends fishery management to remain under the jurisdiction of the Pacific Fishery Management Council (PFMC) and the Oregon Fish & Wildlife Commission



The Role of OPAC

The Governor asked OPAC to:

- Advise as to the spatial extent needed for effective ecosystem-based management
- Conduct meetings to assess stakeholder & public opinion of the Governor's proposal

Personal Involvement

Along with two other MRM students, was hired by the Oregon DLCD to produce a scoping report on sanctuaries and the possible impact for the Oregon Coast during Summer 2006:

Socioeconomic / Biophysical / Institutional

Additionally, hired to assist with public meeting process throughout Fall 2006 and provide summary reports





Timeline

OPAC Review Process

- Dec 2005 Governor initiates proposal
- Jan-Mar 2006 OPAC hears presentations from NMS managers and relevant interests
- Jun-Sept 2006 NMS Working Group appointed and begins research; Scoping Report initiated and completed; Outreach process initiated
- Sept 2006 Governor requests status report
- Oct-Nov 2006 Governor's initial expectation of OPAC's completion of findings
- Dec 2006 Status report completed





Issues & Concerns

- There is a Federal moratorium on the establishment of additional National Marine Sanctuaries
- OPAC is already wrestling with their original mandate to establish a network of marine research reserves
- OPAC has actively discussed whether a need exists
- Timing possible political motivations
- Lack of consultation with stakeholders prior to the announcement of the Governor's proposal
- Lack of support from key constituencies; notably, the fishing community and environmental organizations
- Funding for the public meeting process, or lack thereof
- Community concerns over additional layers of bureaucracy in an already heavily regulated arena





Policy Models

Sabatier & Mazmanian (1983)

Conditions for successful implementation of a regulatory program:

- Clear and consistent mandate
- Active support from organized constituency groups, legislators and the courts
- Implementing agency leaders are committed to goal
- Appropriate hierarchical structure
- Sound policy objectives; managers given sufficient jurisdiction

Kingdon (1995)

- Agendas
- Alternatives
- Policy Windows & Focusing Events
- Political Entrepreneurs
- Conditions versus Problems



Current Status of the Governor's Proposal

- No public meetings held (no consensus, no funding)
- In late 2006, OPAC issued a status report, including a negative recommendation to the Governor
- In February 2007, the Governor placed the proposal in "abeyance" and asked OPAC to move forward with marine reserves

Ramifications

- Backlash led to increased support for a limited system of marine research reserves
- OPAC's ability to find consensus
- Fodder for student projects



Outcome and Results

- Characterize Proposal Process
- Identify Aspects that Hinder the Process and Can Be Improved
- Public Policy Models Can be Useful
- Sanctuary Proposal: Failure or Success?







Current Activities

NOAA Fisheries, Office of Policy

- Develop and integrate policy both within the agency and across government

Policy Office Functions

- Identify national requirements for living marine resource and habitat stewardship

 - Policy research and analysis
 - Synthesis of programs, legislation, and budget
- Recommend national level guidance and strategies for policy implementation and integration




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The Ocean Stewardship Area
