

Safety and Health Article - Alternative II
Environment, Safety, and Health Compliance
(11-00)

NOTE: The safety and health regulations and requirements of BWXT Y-12, L.L.C. (hereafter “the Company”) and DOE shall include, without limitation, the Secretary of Labor’s standards contained in 29 CFR Part 1910 and 1926 and such other provisions as may be contained in this subcontract relating to safety and health.

A. The Seller shall take all reasonable precautions in the performance of the work under this subcontract to protect the environment, safety and health of employees, and members of the public. The Company shall notify the Seller in writing of any noncompliance with the provisions of this Article. After receipt of such notice, the Seller shall immediately take corrective action. In the event that the Seller fails to comply with said regulations and requirements, the Company may, without prejudice to any other legal or contractual rights of the Company, issue an order stopping all or any part of the work; thereafter, a start order for resumption of the work may be issued at the discretion of the Company. The Seller shall make no claim for an extension of time or for compensation or damages by reason of, or in connection with, such work stoppage.

B. Internal Worker Protection Plan

The Seller shall possess and maintain an internal corporate Worker Protection Plan (WPP) which implements the OSHA requirements applicable to the normal course of the Seller’s business. Prior to the start of the work under this contract, the Seller shall provide to the Company’s Procurement Representative a copy of the WPP for review and approval. The Seller’s employees will comply with the WPP in the performance of the work under this subcontract. The WPP shall contain the following minimum requirements:

- (1) Management policies that provide for clear goals, responsibilities, authority, and accountability for meeting loss control objectives;
- (2) Implementation of applicable local, state, federal, environment, safety and health requirements that are relevant to the statement of work;
- (3) Employee guidance on internal engineering controls, precautions, and requirements on personal protective equipment (PPE) to minimize, control and/or prevent employee exposure to include equipment/property loss;
- (4) Task-level hazard identification and control measures that provide for safe work practices and employee training;
- (5) Hazard Communication Program. [Copies of Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) shall be provided to the ES&H Engineering and Contractor Support Group prior to bringing any chemicals on-site. In addition, the Seller shall provide to the ES&H Engineering and Contractor Support Group a current inventory on a monthly basis for chemicals stored on-site for thirty (30) or more days per EPCRA/CERCLA. All chemicals stored on-site shall follow NFPA storage guidelines.]

C. Environmental Compliance

The Seller shall comply with all applicable environmental protection laws, Executive Orders, ordinances, regulations, directives, and codes. Upon request, the Seller shall submit an Environmental Compliance Plan (ECP) outlining the methods proposed to address the environmental requirements specified in the statement of work. The ECP shall specify the person responsible for ensuring the requirements are met.

D. Site Reporting Requirements

The Seller shall report to the ES&H Engineering and Contractor Support Group all site incidents (i.e., injuries, illnesses, fires, spills, near misses, property, or equipment loss, etc.) for proper investigation and disposition.
