I am writing regarding two programs of great importance to the American wire and wire products industry – the OECD steel subsidy negotiations and the Steel Import Monitoring and Analysis (SIMA) System. Tennessee is home to a number of steel producing and consuming businesses, and there negotiations are important to their day-to-day operations.

Wire and wire products are an important component of the steel industry. I am asking that as you proceed with negotiations on these issues, you include carbon, stainless, and other alloy steel wire, as well as wire products, in the discussion.
