ROLE OF VOLUNTEERS AT PATUXENT

Volunteers are important members of Patuxent's research program and contribute valuable expertise and assistance to accomplish specific tasks and goals. They assist scientists and staff with collecting scientific information, facility maintenance, captive bird propagation, data entry, and other scientific support. Duties may consist entirely of field work, laboratory work, office work or a mix of all three depending on specific project needs and the interests of the volunteers.

EXAMPLES OF OPPORTUNITIES AND ACTIVITIES

- Studying crane migration
- Sampling wetland vegetation
- Rearing whooping crane chicks
- Providing animal veterinary care
- Monitoring amphibian populations
- Studying neo-tropical migratory birds
- Collecting and analyzing soil samples
- Testing toxicity of contaminants in the laboratory and field
- Repairing captive animal pens, ponds and other experimental facilities
