COMMISSION ADOPTS RULE 31-1 EXEMPTING CERTAIN TRANSACTIONS FROM TRANSACTION FEES AND DISCUSSES PAYMENT OF TRANSACTION FEES

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

On July 13, the Commission issued Rule 31-1 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 exempting registered brokers and dealers from the payment of transaction fees upon (1) certain offerings and other over-the-counter transactions in securities registered on national securities exchanges, and (2) foreign sales of such securities which are not reported on the Consolidated Tapes. In addition, the Release discusses the payment and collection of transaction fees under Section 31 of the Act. Publication of the Release is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of July 19. (Rel. 34-12624)

TEMPORARY RULE 15c2-11(f)(4)(T) ADOPTED

The Commission announced the adoption of temporary Rule 15c2-11(f)(4)(T), which temporarily exempts from the provisions of Rule 15c2-11 certain publications and submissions of quotations respecting securities traded over-the-counter if such securities have been the subject, at least once each fifth business day, of both bid and ask quotations at specified prices reported to, and published by, an inter-dealer quotation system. Public comment is invited on Rule 15c2-11(f)(4)(T) as adopted and on the advisability of adopting the Rule on a permanent basis. Comments should be submitted to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 500 North Capitol Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20549 by September 12, 1976. The temporary rule expires on November 12, 1976. COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

COMPLAINT NAMES SOUTHWEST COAL & ENERGY CO., OTHERS

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on July 12 a civil injunctive complaint was filed in Federal District Court at Shreveport, Louisiana, against Southwest Coal & Energy Company, Philip H. Parsons, both of Shreveport, Paul E. Cash, Dallas, Texas, and Jerry W. Heflin, Rockwall, Texas. The suit seeks to enjoin Southwest Coal & Energy Company, Cash, Heflin and Parsons from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Southwest Coal & Energy Co., et al., W.D. La.). (LR-7490)

SEVEN INDIVIDUALS INDICTED FOR SECURITIES FRAUD, MAIL FRAUD AND CONSPIRACY

The New York Regional Office announced that on June 30 a federal grand jury sitting in New York City returned an eleven count indictment charging seven defendants, including two persons associated with Seed Capital Corporation (Seed Capital), a broker-dealer firm now in liquidation, with securities fraud, mail fraud and conspiracy. The seven defendants charged are Guido Benigno, of Yonkers, N.Y., a consultant of Seed Capital; James Leonard Brown, of Richmond Hill, N.Y.; Arthur Caponegro, of Cliffside Park, N.J., a former officer of Seed Capital; Harvey Axelrod, of New York, N.Y.; John Krappman, of Richey, Montana; Robert Smith, of Long Island City, N.Y.; and Arthur Daly, of Brooklyn, N.Y. Chester Grey, Frederick Horwitz and James Phillips were named in the indictment as co-conspiractors, but not as defendants. The defendants were charged with the sale of counterfeit securities. The indictment alleges that the sales were effected through the use of a securities account opened under an assumed name at Seed Capital, into which the counterfeit securities were delivered. These counterfeit securities were subsequently forwarded to the transfer agent ostensibly for the purpose of being transferred into certificates of smaller denominations. Thereafter, the new certificates were returned to Seed Capital and delivered to the contra brokers in the aforementioned sales. (U.S. v. Benigno, S.D.N.Y.). (LR-7491)
