DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

INVESTMENT SECURITIES CORPORATION REVOKED

The Commission has revoked the broker-dealer registration of Investment Securities Corporation (ISC) of St. Louis, Missouri, and has barred Stephen J. Burns, former president of ISC, and Richard D. Hayes, former cashier of that firm, from being associated with any broker or dealer.

The sanctions imposed were based on findings that ISC, wilfully aided and abetted by Burns and Hayes, violated provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and rules and regulations adopted thereunder relating to financial responsibility, special reserve bank account requirements, hypothecation of customers' securities, maintenance of books and records and periodic reporting requirements. The Commission further found that the Federal District Court in St. Louis, Missouri had, by consent, enjoined ISC from violating the net capital rule and that Burns was an officer, director and owner of 10 per centum or more of the voting securities of ISC when a trustee was appointed to liquidate that firm under the provisions of the Securities Investor Protection Act of 1970.

ISC, Burns and Hayes failed to answer the April 28, 1976 order initiating these administrative proceedings and therefore were deemed in default. (Rel. 34-12706)

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

ROBERT BERKSON AND OTHERS SENTENCED

The New York Regional Office announced that the Honorable John M. Cannella, U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of New York, has sentenced Robert Berkson (Berkson), Maurice Rind (Rind) and James Gallentine (Gallentine) as follows: Berkson was sentenced, on July 21, 1976, to a term of imprisonment of five years, imposition of

which was suspended, five years probation, and was fined \$25,000; Rind was sentenced, on July 22, 1976, to a term of imprisonment of 18 months and was fined \$10,000; Gallentine was sentenced on August 3, 1976, to a term of imprisonment of 15 months, imposition of 12 months of such sentence being suspended, and was fined \$1,500.

Berkson and Rind were convicted by a jury, on June 9, 1976, of eight counts of an indictment charging them with (1) conspiracy to violate the securities laws, (2) substantive violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws, (3) mail fraud, and (4) interstate transportation of forged securities.

Gallentine had pled guilty to one count of the indictment on April 26, 1976, prior to the start of the trial. (U.S. v. Berkson, et al., 75 Crim. 608, S.D.N.Y.). (LR-7530)
