ORDER APPOINTING RECEIVER FOR UNIVERSAL FINANCIAL, OTHERS AND STAYING LEGAL ACTIONS $\{0,0\},\dots,0\}$

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on March 24 the Honorable Mariana Pfaelzer entered an order appointing Walter M. Sharp as the Receiver for Universal Financial, Western Sierra Financial Corporation and California Equities Home Loan.

The Order directs the Receiver to take immediate custody, control and possession of all assets of these companies, as well as the authority to eventually take control of the assets of Wayne Burton to the extent they were derived from the sale of promissory notes and interests in trust deeds. The Order also grants the Receiver authority to dispose of certain assets of Burton and requires that Burton give the Receiver a schedule of his personal assets. The Court stayed all legal actions and foreclosure proceedings against the defendants, except by leave of the Court. (SEC v. Universal Financial, et al., U.S.D.C., C.D. Cal., Civil Action No. 81-0270-MRP). (LR-9337)
