ELIMINATION OF REQUIREMENTS FOR BROKER-DEALER FILING AND REPORTING

The Commission is eliminating the requirement imposed on broker-dealers to file Schedules II and III of Form X-17A-5, the Financial and Operational Combined Uniform Single (FOCUS) Report. The two Schedules were designed to capture certain financial data which the Commission will be able to obtain, in less detail, from sources other than the Schedules. Broker-dealers' reporting requirements will therefore be reduced. However, Schedule I which contains operational information needed for regulatory purposes will be retained in its present form. DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY TO DIRECTOR OF DIVISION OF INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT

The Commission has adopted an amendment to Rule 30-5 of its rules relating to general organization. The amendment delegates authority to the Director of the Division of Investment Management to issue notices and orders on applications filed pursuant to Sections 57(c), 57(j), 57(k), 57(n), and 61(a)(3) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, which were enacted as part of the Small Business Investment Incentive Act of 1980, where the applications present no issues not previously settled by the Commission and raise no questions of fact or policy indicating that a hearing need be held.
