ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

NASD'S REFUSAL TO PERMIT EMPLOYMENT OF PAUL E. VAN DUSEN AS A SUPERVISOR SET ASIDE

The Commission has set aside the NASD's refusal to permit one of its member firms to employ Paul Edward Van Dusen of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, as a registered principal acting as sales manager, and ordered the NASD to permit Van Dusen's association with the firm in that capacity. The member's request was necessary because, in 1978, without admitting or denying the allegations in a complaint filed by the Commission, Van Dusen consented to an injunction against violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities acts. He also consented to a bar from association with any broker-dealer, investment adviser or investment company in a supervisory capacity with the proviso that, after 18 months, he could apply to the Commission for reassociation in that capacity.

The Commission noted that, prior to accepting Van Dusen's offer of settlement, it had carefully weighed the requirements of the public interest in the light of his alleged misconduct and concluded that, after 18 months, Van Dusen could apply for permission to become reassociated as a supervisor. The Commission further noted that in 1975, it had announced its policy with respect to applications for re-entry after the time specified in an offer of settlement had expired, stating that such applications would generally be granted if a proper showing were made.

The Commission then stated: "This did not and does not mean that re-entry is to be granted automatically when an application is made after the period specified in an offer of settlement has expired. Such factors as other misconduct in which the applicant may have engaged, the nature and disciplinary history of a prospective employer, and the supervision to be accorded the applicant, are only some of the matters that must be carefully weighed and considered. Here, however, the NASD's exclusionary action was not based on any new circumstance or any defect in the showing that Van Dusen made, but merely on the 1978 injunction and bar.

"We conclude that, in the absence of new information reflecting adversely on Van Dusen's ability to function in his proposed employment in a manner consonant with the public interest, it is inconsistent with the remedial purposes of the Exchange Act and unfair to exclude him any longer from the position he seeks." NASD ACTION AGAINST G. L. BARTLETT & CO., INC., OFFICERS AFFIRMED

The Commission has affirmed sanctions imposed by the NASD on G. L. Bartlett & Co., Inc., a former Phoenix, Arizona brokerage firm, Gary L. Bartlett, the firm's president, and James L. Meek, its secretary-treasurer. The NASD censured applicants and fined them \$1,000, jointly and severally.

The Commission found, as had the NASD, that applicants failed to comply with net capital, customer protection, and reporting requirements of the securities acts. (Rel. 34-18285)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

ROBERT S. CHAPPELL FOUND GUILTY

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on November 19 Robert S. Chappell was found guilty of two counts of mail fraud in connection with the offer and sale of interests in an oil and gas lease. The conviction resulted from a jury trial before the Honorable William Steckler, U.S. District Court, Indianapolis, Indiana, and related to Chappell's activities during 1975, 1976 and 1977 while he was operating General Oil, Inc. A sentencing date is awaiting completion of a pre-sentencing report. (U.S. v. Robert S. Chappell, U.S.D.C., S.D. Indiana, IP 79-50 CR). (LR-9521)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PW EMPLOYEE INVESTMENTS

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 30 to request a hearing on a proposal whereby National Fuel Gas Company (National), a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries, National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation (Supply), National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation (Distribution), and Penn-York Energy Corporation (Penn-York), would enter into intra-system borrowing arrangements through a system money pool. Supply, Distribution and Penn-York propose to borrow from the money pool up to \$40 million, \$90 million and \$50 million, respectively. As a back-up source of funds for the money pool, National seeks authorization to issue and sell through December 31, 1982 up to \$80 million aggregate principal amount outstanding at any one time of its commercial paper and to issue and sell notes to banks through the same period up to an aggregate principal amount outstanding at any one time of \$155 million. COLUMBUS AND SOUTHERN OHIO ELECTRIC COMPANY
