U.S. SECURITIES

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CARL MARTIN ENJOINED

The Commission announced that the U.S. District Court for the District of Utah, Central Division, issued a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction as to Carl W. Martin. Martin of Sandy, Utah consented to the entry of the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the allegations against him. The Final Judgment enjoins Martin from future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Sections 10(b), 13(a), 13(d) and 16(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 10b-5, 12b-20, 13a-1, 13a-11, 13d-1 and 16a-1 thereunder. The Commission's complaint filed in September 1990 alleged numerous violations of the antifraud, reporting and beneficial ownership disclosure provisions of the federal securities laws in connection with S. Taylor Companies, Inc. (S. Taylor). Martin was the last remaining defendant in several actions brought by the Commission in connection with S. Taylor (See Lit. Rel. Nos. 12651, 12652 & 12653, October 1, 1990; Securities Exchange Act Rel. No. 28625, November 19, 1990). All of the other defendants previously settled with the Commission by consenting, without admitting or denying the allegations against them, to the relief sought by the Commission. [SEC v. Carl W. ### SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

### IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

<u>The Intermarket Clearing Corporation</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-ICC-92-2) to reorganize the Definition section of ICC's Rules. ### ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>Participants Trust Company</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-PTC-92-02) to divide the members of PTC's Board of Direction into three equal classes whose members would be elected to staggered three-year terms. The Commission is approving the proposal on an accelerated basis. Publication of the order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of May 4. (Rel. 34-30651)

### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE ON A TEMPORARY BASIS

The Commission approved on a temporary basis until July 31, 1992 a proposed rule change filed by the <u>Government Securities Clearing Corporation</u> (SR-GSCC-92-01) that would extend procedures relating to the netting of zero coupon government securities, the netting of forward-settling trades in Government securities and the clearing fund formula. ### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE
