U.S. SECURITIES EXCHANGE COMMISSION

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC FILES AND SETTLES SALOMON BROTHERS CASE

The SEC, in collaboration with the Department of the Treasury, the Federal Reserve and the Department of Justice, announced on May 20 that the SEC filed a complaint against Salomon Inc and Salomon Brothers Inc (collectively, Salomon) in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York. The complaint alleges that Salomon committed multiple violations of the antifraud and recordkeeping provisions of the federal securities laws through false bids in Treasury auctions and other activities. SEC PUBLISHES REPORT ON REFORM OF INVESTMENT COMPANY REGULATION

Chairman Breeden announced today the publication of a report by the Commission's Division of Investment Management. The report, titled <u>Protecting Investors: A Half Century of Investment Company Regulation</u>, culminates a comprehensive study that the Division undertook two years ago at the direction of Chairman Breeden. SEC TO CONSIDER AN ITEM AT AN OPEN MEETING

The Commission will consider an item at an open meeting under the Government in the Sunshine Act today at 2:30 p.m. The meeting will be held in the Commission Meeting Room, Room 6143, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. The item for discussion is whether to issue a release soliciting public comment on the appropriateness of certain amendments to Rules 10a-1 and 3b-3 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS AGAINST SALOMON BROTHERS

The Commission instituted and settled, pursuant to an Offer of Settlement submitted by Salomon Brothers Inc, administrative proceedings pursuant to Section 15(b) of the Exchange Act. The Commission censured Salomon Brothers and ordered the firm to maintain policies and procedures reasonably designed to prevent recurrence of the matters alleged in the Commission's complaint (LR-13246). CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CIVIL ACTION AGAINST SALOMON BROTHERS

On May 20, the Commission announced the filing of a complaint in the U.S. District Court of the Southern District of New York against Salomon Inc and Salomon Brothers Inc (collectively, Salomon). The complaint alleged violations of the antifraud and books and records provisions of the federal securities laws in connection with auctions for, and transactions in, U.S. government securities. Without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, both defendants consented to the entry of a final judgment of permanent injunction. The judgment requires Salomon to pay the amount of \$290 million, representing a payment of \$190 million to the U.S. Treasury and a payment of \$100 million to establish a fund for civil claims against Salomon. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Options Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change (SR-OCC-92-08) relating to the Clearing Management and Control System (C/MACS), OCC's on-line system through which OCC and its clearing members communicate data concerning option contracts and related obligations. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of May 25. (Rel. 34-30709)

<u>Delta Government Options Corp.</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-DGOC-92-01) relating to DGOC's credit enhancement facility and margin and trading limits. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of May 25. (Rel. 34-30710)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by <u>The Options Clearing Corporation</u> (SR-OCC-91-08) to adopt procedures to provide for OCC's continued operation during an emergency. Publication of the order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of May 25. (Rel. 34-30714)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>Participants Trust Company</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-PTC-92-06) to advise PTC participants of a registration fee of \$10 per pool for securities issued by Government National Mortgage Association. The proposed rule change became effective immediately upon filing with the Commission. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of May 25. (Rel. 34-30720)

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
