ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

SETTLEMENT OFFER OF MARTIN FRANKEL ACCEPTED

The Commission announced the entry of an Order Instituting Public Administrative Proceedings, Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions against Martin R. Frankel (Frankel) and accepted Frankel's Offer of Settlement. Frankel consented to the issuance of the Order which was based upon the July 2, 1992 permanent injunction which the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois entered by consent against Frankel enjoining him from future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Sections 10(b) and 15(c)(1) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 10b-5 and 15cl-2 thereunder.

AMERITAS VARIABLE LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 29 to request a hearing on an application by Ameritas Variable Life Insurance Company (Ameritas), AVLIC Separate Account V (Ameritas Account), Fidelity Investments Life Insurance Company (Fidelity Life), The Fidelity Investments Variable Life Account I (Fidelity Account), Midland National Life Insurance Company (Midland), Midland National Life Separate Account A (Midland Account), Monarch Life Insurance Company (Monarch), The Fidelity Variable Account (Monarch Account), Vermont Life Insurance Company (Vermont) and Vermont Variable Life Insurance Account (Vermont Account). HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MAINE YANKEE ATOMIC POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 28 to request a hearing on a proposal by Maine Yankee Atomic Power Company, a subsidiary of New England Electric System and Northeast Utilities, both registered holding companies, to extend its authorization to borrow up to \$35 million under an amended Eurodollar revolving credit agreement with a syndicate of international banks through December 31, 1995. CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 28 to request a hearing on a proposal by Central and South West Corporation (CSW), a registered holding company, its wholly owned nonutility subsidiary companies, CSW Energy, Inc. (CSW Energy), CSW Development-I, Inc. (Energy Sub) and ARK/CSW Development Partnership (ARK Joint Venture), a general partnership, subsidiary of Energy Sub and a joint venture with ARK Energy, Inc., a nonassociate corporation. CSW, CSW Energy, Energy Sub and the ARK Joint Venture now propose through December 31, 1995 that the financing authority originally granted by order dated September 28, 1990 (HCAR No. 25162) (1990 Order) and generally authorizing CSW and CSW Energy's activities with respect to qualifying cogeneration facilities, qualifying small power production facilities and independent power projects be increased from \$75 million to \$150 million. CSW, CSW Energy, Energy, Energy Sub and the ARK Joint Venture also propose through December 31, 1995 that the financing authority for the ARK Joint Venture granted by the 1990 Order be increased from \$25 million to \$50 million. CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORPORATION, ET AL.

A supplemental notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 28 to request a hearing on a proposal by Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company, Central Power and Light Company, a wholly-owned electric utility subsidiary company of CSW, and CSW Credit, Inc. NORTHEAST UTILITIES, ET AL.
