CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

WARREN SANDS SENTENCED TO HOME CONFINEMENT AND PROBATION

The Commission, the United States Attorney for the Northern District of Georgia and the Georgia Secretary of State announced that on April 19 G. Ernest Tidwell, United States District Judge for the Northern District of Georgia, sentenced Warren Matthew Sands (Sands), formerly an unregistered stockbroker with First Alliance Securities, Inc. (First Alliance). Sands was sentenced to five years probation, six months home confinement, 300 hours community service, a \$3,000 fine and joint and several restitution of \$4.5 million in connection with his January 26, 1993 guilty plea to one count of aiding and abetting securities fraud.

The criminal information to which Sands pled guilty charged that from about May 1989 until about August 1989, while employed with First Alliance, a registered broker-dealer, as part of a scheme to defraud investors, Sands assisted another unregistered stockbroker and First Alliance principals in unauthorized trading in customer accounts by preparing false account opening documentation and preparing order tickets necessary to effect unauthorized transactions. The information further charged Sands with making material misrepresentations and omitting to state material facts concerning First Alliance's fraudulent practices and policies to defraud and deceive investors and to lull investors into a false sense of security as to their investments. FORMER FIRST ALLIANCE OPERATIONS HEAD PLEADS GUILTY

The Commission, the United States Attorney for the Northern District of Georgia and the Georgia Secretary of State announced that on April 19 G. Ernest Tidwell, United States District Judge for the Northern District of Georgia, accepted the guilty plea of Robert A. Hartnagel (Hartnagel), to a one-count criminal information charging him with conspiracy to commit securities fraud. At the time of the crimes to which Hartnagel pled guilty, he was associated with First Alliance Securities, Inc. (First Alliance), formerly a registered broker-dealer headquartered in Atlanta, Georgia.

Specifically, the information charged that from about March 1989 until about December 1989, while serving as the unregistered financial and operations principal, Hartnagel conspired with others to defraud First Alliance investors by the use of high-pressure telephone sales techniques, the promotion of certain stocks to create the appearance of demand and the promotion of stocks at prices which included excessive markups. The information further charged that as part of the conspiracy Hartnagel made material misrepresentations and omissions concerning, among other things, the suitability, liquidity and profitability of First Alliance stocks, the arbitrary setting of prices of those stocks, and the fact that First Alliance principals including Hartnagel had undisclosed interests in such stocks. Sentencing is set for June 28, 1993. [U.S. v. Robert Allen Hartnagel, Criminal Information 1:93-CR-171, ND Ga.] (LR-13621)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

STAGECOACH FUNDS, INC., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 17, 1993 to request a hearing on an application filed by Stagecoach Funds, Inc., et al. for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting applicants from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 18(f), 18(g), 18(i), 22(c), and 22(d) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder. The order would permit applicants to issue multiple classes of shares representing interests in the same portfolio of securities, assess a contingent deferred sales charge (CDSC) on certain redemptions of shares and waive the CDSC in certain instances. THOMSON FUND GROUP, ET AL.

A conditional order has been issued under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act amending prior orders exempting the Thomson Fund Group, et al. from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c) and 22(d) of the Act and Rules 22c-1 and 22d-1 thereunder. The order amends prior orders to permit the waiver of a CDSC in connection with certain redemptions by certain tax qualified plans, and in connection with certain periodic redemptions under an automatic withdrawal plan. The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change (SR-PHLX-92. 22) filed by the <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> that provides for an extension of the PHLX's pilot program for position limit exemptions for hedged equity option positions until November 17, 1993. The proposal also permits securities convertible into the underlying stocks to be a basis for the equity hedge exemption.
