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COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC NAMES CHIEF LITIGATION COUNSEL, ENFORCEMENT

Acting Chairman Schapiro announced the appointment of Barry R. Goldsmith to the position of Chief Litigation Counsel, Division of Enforcement.

Mr. Goldsmith, who replaces Thomas C. Newkirk, will be responsible for the conduct, supervision, coordination and evaluation of all enforcement litigation conducted by the Commission. Mr. Goldsmith joined the Commission's staff in 1986 as an Assistant Chief Litigation Counsel in the Division of Enforcement where, in 1988, he assumed a supervisory position. In 1990, he was appointed the Commission's Senior Deputy Chief Litigation Counsel. Mr. Goldsmith has had substantial responsibilities in the Commission's successful litigations against Drexel Burnham Lambert and Michael Milken, Ivan Boesky, Dennis Levine and Paul Bilzerian. In addition, he successfully tried the Commission's stock parking case against Mark Belzberg and First City Financial Corp. (Press Rel. 93-17)

CHIEF ACCOUNTANT SELECTS TWO PROFESSIONAL ACCOUNTING FELLOWS

The Commission's Office of the Chief Accountant has recently selected Mr. John P. Glynn, Jr., of Coopers & Lybrand and Mr. Stephen M. Swad of KPMG Peat Marwick to serve as Professional Accounting Fellows for two-year terms beginning in June 1993. Currently, Mr. Glynn is a Business Assurance manager in the New York office of Coopers & Lybrand. Mr. Swad is a senior manager in KPMG Peat Marwick's Department of Professional Practice in White Plains, New York. Mr. Glynn and Mr. Swad will be joining the current Professional Accounting Fellows--Mr. Christopher M. Holmes, formerly of Ernst & Young; Mr. Jeffrey A. Swormstedt, formerly of Deloitte & Touche; and Mr. Randall J. Larson, formerly of KPMG Peat Marwick. (Press Rel. 93-18)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

NYSE ACTION AGAINST STUART PATRICK SUSTAINED

The Commission has sustained sanctions imposed by the New York Stock Exchange, Inc. on Stuart K. Patrick of New York, New York, chief executive officer and president of Baird Patrick & Co., Inc., an NYSE member firm. The NYSE censured Patrick and suspended him for one week from employment or association in any supervisory capacity with any member or member organization.

The Commission affirmed NYSE findings that Patrick failed reasonably to supervise the firm's NYSE floor trader with respect to trading in the firm's proprietary account. During the first six months of 1988, the floor trader initiated on the Exchange floor over 1500 trades that violated various restrictions on proprietary trading. In affirming the NYSE's sanctions, the Commission stated that, although Patrick was the floor trader's direct supervisor, he conducted no supervision. As a result, the floor trader received no supervision whatsoever. (Rel. 34-32314)

COMMISSION SUSTAINS NASD ACTION AGAINST MARK FOGLIA

The Commission sustained an NASD disciplinary action against Mark Foglia of Boston, Massachusetts. The Commission sustained the NASD's finding that Foglia engaged in conduct inconsistent with the just and equitable principles of trade. The NASD censured Foglia, fined him \$5,000 and required him to requalify as a general securities principal. Foglia was a branch manager of J.W. Gant & Associates, Inc.'s New York office. The NASD found that Foglia permitted a salesman under his supervision to solicit customers in North Carolina when that salesman was not properly registered in that state. When the salesman successfully induced a North Carolina resident to transfer his account to Gant, Foglia authorized the salesman to use the identification number of a second salesman who was registered in North Carolina to effect trades on behalf of the customer.

Foglia attempted to challenge the credibility of the second salesman, who testified against him. However, the District Business Conduct Committee, which heard both Foglia and the salesman's testimony, found the salesman's testimony to be credible, and the Commission found that conclusion to be supported on the record. CEASE-AND-DESIST PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST MAYFAIR SECURITIES LTD., INC. AND MARCUS FIGUEIRADO

The Commission instituted public cease-and-desist administrative proceedings pursuant to Sections 15(b), 21B and 21C of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) against Mayfair Securities Ltd., Inc. (Mayfair), a registered broker-dealer with offices located in Boca Raton, Florida and Marcus N. Figueirado (Figueirado), Mayfair's president.

The Orders Instituting Proceedings against Mayfair and Figueirado allege that since May 1992 through the present, Mayfair and Figueirado have failed to provide the staff with access to certain books and records and have failed to promptly furnish to the Commission copies of records that are required to be preserved, in violation of Sections 17(a) and 17(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 17a-4(j).

A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations set forth in the Order are true and, if so, what remedial sanctions should be imposed against Figueirado and Mayfair. (Rels. 34-32317 - Mayfair Securities Ltd., Inc.; 34-32318 - Marcus N. Figueirado)

PROCEEDINGS AGAINST BERNARD DEUTSCH

Bernard Deutsch consented to the institution of public administrative proceedings, based on the entry a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction in SEC v. Bernard Deutsch et al., Civil Action No. 91 Civ. 6462, SDNY. Simultaneous with the institution of these proceedings, the Commission accepted Deutsch's Offer of Settlement in which he consented to the entry of an Order by the Commission permanently barring him from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company. INITIAL DECISION CENSURES KEVIN UPTON

Administrative Law Judge Max O. Regensteiner has issued an initial decision censuring Kevin Upton, who was Chief Financial Officer of Financial Clearing and Services Corporation, a clearing broker-dealer.

According to the decision, Upton failed reasonably to supervise the manager of the firm's Money Management Department. The manager engaged in a practice of substituting proprietary or unsecured bank loans for customer bank loans prior to making the weekly reserve formula computation and reinstituting the customer loans shortly thereafter. This practice, which resulted in deposit deficiencies in the special reserve bank account, was found to have violated the Commission's customer protection rule (Rule 15c3-3 under the Securities Exchange Act).

The initial decision is subject to Commission review on petition of a party or on the Commission's own initiative. (Initial Decision No. 34)

TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN THE SECURITIES OF DIGITRAN SYSTEMS, INC.

The Commission announced pursuant to Section 12(k) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) the temporary suspension of trading of the securities of Digitran Systems, Inc. on the American Stock Exchange or otherwise, for a ten day period commencing at 10:30 a.m., EDT, May 21, 1993 and terminating at 11:59 p.m., EDT, on June 4, 1993.

The Commission temporarily suspended trading in the securities of Digitran Systems, Inc., in view of questions that have been raised about the adequacy and accuracy of the publicly disseminated information concerning, among other things, revenue the company recognized for the fiscal year ended April 30, 1992, and the company's interim financial statements during fiscal year 1993. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

BERNARD DEUTSCH PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

On April 29, 1993, the Honorable Robert W. Sweet of the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against

Bernard Deutsch (Deutsch). The Final Judgment enjoins Deutsch from future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Rule 10b-5 thereunder and aiding and abetting violations of Section 15(c)(1) of the Exchange Act. Deutsch consented to the entry of the Final Judgment, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint previously filed in September 1991, that Deutsch and others engaged in a fraudulent scheme to manipulate the market for the common stock of Balchem Corporation in the fall of 1986. [SEC v. Bernard Deutsch et al., Civil Action No. 91 Civ. 6462, SDNY] (LR-13637)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MONONGAHELA POWER COMPANY, ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Monongahela Power Company, The Potomac Edison Company and West Penn Power Company (APS Companies), public-utility subsidiary companies of Allegheny Power System, Inc., a registered holding company, to issue secured solid waste disposal notes (Notes), at any time or from time to time on or before December 31, 1994, in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$42,708,000 to support the issuance of solid waste disposal revenue bonds by the County Commission of Harrison County, West Virginia. In order to secure its obligations under the Notes, each of the APS Companies proposes to issue a second lien on its interest in the pollution control facilities. The Commission has reserved jurisdiction over \$117,292,000 of the remaining notes. (Rel. 35-25813)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change (SR-NYSE-93-03) filed by the New York Stock Exchange which amends the NYSE's rules to allow the NYSE to open series of European-style index options with exercise prices that are "reasonably close" to the numerical value of the index stock group underlying the option. The proposal also allows the NYSE to list additional series of European-style index options in response to demonstrated customer interest provided that the new strike prices are no more than the lesser of approximately 100 points away from the current index value or 30% away from the current index value. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of May 24. (Rel. 34-32330)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF AMENDED PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved an amended American Stock Exchange rule proposal (SR-Amex-92-42) on an accelerated basis permitting the Exchange to list and trade Equity Linked Term Notes (ELNs), which are hybrid instruments whose values are linked to the performance of highly capitalized, actively-traded common stock. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of May 24. (Rel. 34-32343)

1MMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-93-33) that became effective immediately upon filing. The proposed rule change is to amend Schedule A, Section 2(b) to the NASD By-Laws to provide for a discount for mass transfers of associated persons' registrations in the event of a merger or acquisition. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of May 24. (Rel. 34-32342)
