U.S. SECURITIES EXCHANGE COMMISSION

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

INITIAL DECISION BARS RICHARD DEMAIO, ORDERS HIM TO CEASE AND DESIST AND DISGORGE \$430,000 AND INTEREST

Administrative Law Judge Edward J. Kuhlmann has issued an initial decision, pursuant to Section 15(b)(6) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act), barring Richard D. DeMaio from association with any broker or dealer, ordering him to cease from violating Sections 5 and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and 10(b) and 15(c) of the Exchange Act and Rules 10b-5 and 15cl-2 thereunder. Also, pursuant to Section 21C(e) of Exchange Act, Demaio has been ordered to disgorge \$430,000 received as result of conduct which violated the securities laws and interest from December 31, 1988.

According to the decision, DeMaio, office manager at the Boca Raton, Florida office of the broker-dealer Graystone Nash, Incorporated (Graystone) during 1987 and 1988, was found to have willfully violated the Securities and Exchange Acts by, among other things, participating in and enforcing certain fraudulent practices of Graystone in connection with public offerings of units of common stock and warrants. The practices concerned the repurchase of the units by Graystone in the immediate aftermarket at a premium, requiring aftermarket common stock sales in certain ratios to sale of units in the offerings and the allocation of common stock to be sold in the aftermarkets at increasing, artificial "tick prices" predetermined by Graystone. DERMOT ROWLAND ORDERED TO CEASE AND DESIST

On August 9, the Commission issued an Order Instituting Cease and Desist Proceedings under Section 21C of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Findings and Order against Dermot F. Rowland (Rowland) of Minneapolis, Minnesota. The Order requires Rowland to permanently cease and desist from committing or causing any violation of or any future violation of Section 16(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 16a-2 and 16a-3 promulgated thereunder. Simultaneously, the Commission accepted Rowland's Offer of Settlement in which, without admitting or denying the matters set forth in the Order, he consented to the issuance of the Order. The Order finds that during the period from June 10, 1988 through February 15, 1991 Rowland failed to file timely a Form 3 and six Forms 4, required to be filed by Section 16(a) of the Exchange Act and the rules thereunder, reporting his holdings and transactions with respect to the registered equity securities of Homestyle Buffet, Inc., which transactions had a total value of over \$3.2 million. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CIVIL ACTION AGAINST MICHAEL MATONIS AND JOHN TOSCANI, JR.

On August 9, the Commission announced the filing of a civil action in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York against Michael M. Matonis (Matonis) and John L. Toscani, Jr. (Toscani) seeking permanent injunctive relief and disgorgement.

The Commission's complaint alleges that Matonis and Toscani violated Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder by creating the false and misleading appearance of a market for the securities of Firestone Development Corp. (Firestone) and Beta Tech Robotics, Inc. (Beta Tech), publishing false price quotes for Firestone and Beta Tech securities in the National Daily Quotation Service "Pink Sheets", and making material misrepresentations and omissions to the public.

Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint, and without admitting or denying any of the allegations in the complaint, Matonis consented to the entry of a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction And Other Equitable Relief On Consent (Final Judgment) granting the relief sought in the Commission's complaint.

Subject to entry of the Final Judgment by the Court, Matonis has also consented to an order in a Commission administrative proceeding making findings that Matonis has been enjoined and permanently barring Matonis from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company or municipal securities dealer. [SEC v. Michael M. Matonis and John L. Toscani, Jr., 93 Civ. 5531, MBM, SDNY] (LR-13748)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE BURNHAM FUND INC., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 31 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Burnham Fund Inc., et al. for a conditional order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act that would exempt applicants from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 18(f), 18(g), 18(i), 22(c), and 22(d) and Rule 22c-1 thereunder. The conditional order would permit applicants to issue multiple classes of shares representing interests in the same portfolio of securities, and to assess and, under certain circumstances, waive a contingent deferred sales load on certain redemptions of shares. TECHNOLOGY FUNDING MEDICAL PARTNERS I, L.P., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 31 to request a hearing on an application filed by Technology Funding Medical Partners I, L.P., et al. Applicants seek a conditional order under Section 17(d) and Rule 17d-1 permitting

Technology Funding Medical Partners I, L.P. to participate in joint transactions with certain affiliated business development companies pursuant to an existing order. (Rel. IC-19615 - August 6)

MAXIM SERIES FUND, INC., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 31 to request a hearing on an application filed by Maxim Series Fund, Inc. (Fund), Great-West Life Assurance Company, and certain life insurance companies and their separate accounts investing now or in the future in the Fund (collectively, Applicants). Applicants seek an order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act granting exemptions from the provisions of Sections 9(a), 13(a), 15(a) and 15(b) of the Act and Rules 6e-2(b)(15) and 6e-3(T)(b)(15) thereunder to the extent necessary to permit shares of the Fund to be sold to separate accounts funding variable annuity and variable life insurance contracts issued by both affiliated and unaffiliated life insurance companies. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALABAMA POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Alabama Power Company, an electric public-utility subsidiary company of The Southern Company, a registered holding company, to refinance \$36.1 million of the costs of certain pollution control and sewage and solid waste disposal facilities located in Mobile, Alabama. The Commission has reserved jurisdiction over all transactions associated with refinancing additional costs for such facilities in amounts of up to \$307.11 million. (Rel. 35-25864)

CENTRAL POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY

A supplemental notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 30 to request a hearing on a proposal by Central Power and Light Company (CPL), an electric public-utility subsidiary company of Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company. CPL proposes to issue and sell, through December 31, 1995, up to \$360 million of first mortgage bonds (Bonds). The proceeds of the Bonds will be used principally to redeem all or a portion of one or more series of CPL's outstanding first mortgage bonds and to repurchase all or a portion of CPL's outstanding 8.72% preferred stock. (Rel. 35-25865; International Series Rel. 572)

NORTHEAST UTILITIES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 30 to request a hearing on a proposal by Northeast Utilities (Northeast), a registered holding company, and Charter Oak Energy, Inc. (Charter Oak) and COE Development Corporation, nonutility subsidiaries of Northeast. Northeast proposes to invest up to \$7 million in Charter Oak for the acquisition by Charter Oak of interests in two nonutility subsidiaries that will own an interest in a foreign utility company. (Rel. 35-25865; International Series Rel. 572)

ALLEGHENY GENERATING COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 30 to request a hearing on a proposal by Allegheny Generating Company (Allegheny Generating), an indirect wholly owned subsidiary company of Allegheny Power System, a registered holding company, to issue and sell through December 31, 1994, one or more series of debentures (Debentures) in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$150 million. The Debentures of any such series will mature no later than thirty years from the date of their issuance. The proceeds from the Debentures' sale will be used to refund outstanding higher coupon debentures of Allegheny Generating. Allegheny Generating proposes to sell the Debentures either through the alternative competitive bidding procedures authorized by the Commission's Statement of Policy Concerning Application of Rule 50 under the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935 (HCAR No. 22623, Sept. 2, 1982), or through an exception from competitive bidding requirements of Rule 50. Allegheny Generating has received authorization to commence negotiations with underwriters. (Rel. 35-25865; International Series Rel. 572)

CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORP. ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company, and its nonutility subsidiary company, CSW Energy, Inc., to provide through December 31, 1995 guarantees and to arrange for letters of credit or similar provisions and arrangements in connection with the development of qualifying cogeneration facilities, qualifying small power production facilities and independent power facilities, including exempt wholesale generators as defined in Section 32(e) of the Act. The amount of any such guarantees, letters of credit or other support arrangements actually issued and outstanding at any one time will not exceed \$50 million in the aggregate. (Rel. 35-25866)
