# THOMAS F. KOLTER ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on August 10 a Final Judgement of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief was entered by consent against Thomas F. Kolter, former general counsel of Stotler and Company and president of Stotler Funds, Inc. (SFI).

The Commission's Complaint alleged two separate fraudulent schemes. In one scheme, Kolter was charged as a liability defendant who violated and/or aided and abetted violations of the antifraud, books and records and reporting provisions of the federal securities laws. Kolter was not charged with any wrongdoing in the second scheme, wherein Stotler Group, Inc. (SGI) investors were defrauded and the Commission and other regulatory agencies were deceived. Rather, Kolter was named as a Relief Defendant, who unjustly profited from that scheme. Without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, except as to personal jurisdiction and subject matter jurisdiction, Kolter consented to the entry of an order permanently enjoining him from violating all the provisions charged therein and ordering disgorgement, plus prejudgment interest, payment of which was waived based on his demonstrated inability to pay. ### COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST SAM M. ANTAR, ALLEN ANTAR AND BENJAMIN KUSZER

The Commission announced than on September 8 it filed a complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of New Jersey naming as defendants Sam M. Antar, a co-founder and former Executive Vice President and director of Crazy Eddie, Inc., Allen Antar, the former Director of Corporate Sales at Crazy Eddie, and Benjamin Kuszer, an owner of Benel Distributors, which sold records and tapes in Crazy Eddie stores, for illegal insider trading involving the stock of Crazy Eddie. The complaint also names as relief defendants eight minor nieces and nephews of Eddie Antar, the former President and Chief Executive Officer of Crazy Eddie.

The Commission's complaint alleges that Eddie Antar, Sam M. Antar, Allen Antar, and Benjamin Kuszer violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder in sales of Crazy Eddie securities while in possession of material non-public information. The complaint also alleges that the relief defendants obtained illegal profits as a result of sales of Crazy Eddie stock by Eddie Antar, acting as custodian for the relief defendants, while in possession of material non-public information. #### CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

### CHARLES HOWARD SENTENCED TO FIVE YEARS IN PRISON ON CONSPIRACY FRAUD CHARGES

On September 3 Charles H. Howard, III (Howard) was sentenced by Judge Shane Devine of the United States District Court for the District of New Hampshire as a result of a two-count criminal Information arising from Howard's trading in securities issued by financial institutions in New England. Howard was sentenced to five years in prison on one count of bank fraud and was further sentenced to two years suspended and five years probation on a second count of conspiracy to commit insider trading, bank bribery and bank fraud. Howard, 48, is a former Director and First Vice President of Thomson McKinnon Securities, Inc. The Information alleged that Howard, along with other unnamed known individuals, solicited and received material nonpublic information from unamed bank insiders, communicated such information to clients, and purchased and sold securities for them. As a part of the alleged conspiracy to commit bank fraud, the Information alleged that Howard and certain unnamed known bank insiders and bank stock investors engaged in a fraudulent securities trading practive known as "frontrunning." Howard was previously enjoined by the Commission and consented to be barred from the securities industry. This matter is one of a number of related actions stemming from trading abuses in regional bank stocks. [U.S. v. Charles H. Howard, III, CR. No 92-74-01-D] (LR-13774)

## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

# HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ENERGY INITIATIVES, INC.

An order has been issued concerning Energy Initiatives, Inc. (EII), a wholly owned subsidiary of General Portfolios Corporation, a wholly owned subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, a registered holding company. The order authorizes EII to acquire an ownership interest of not more than 26%, 9.9% of which will be voting, in a nonaffiliate corporation (Cogen Corp) engaged in the business of developing, owning and operating cogeneration and other independent power projects in the United Projects may be exempt wholesale generators of States and in foreign countries. foreign utility companies, as defined in Sections 32 and 33 of the Act, as amended by the Energy Policy Act of 1992, or qualifying facilities, as defined in the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 and regulations thereunder. The purchase price would not exceed approximately \$7.5 million and EII would acquire the stock over a period of up to three years. EII also proposes to organize and acquire for \$1,000 all of the capital stock of a new Delaware subsidiary company to carry out its obligations with regards to Cogen Corp. (Rel. 35-25876)
