#### ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

DECISION BARRING RICHARD DEMAIO AND ORDERING HIM TO CEASE AND DESIST AND DISGORGE \$430,000 FINAL

The decision of an administrative law judge barring Richard DeMaio and ordering him to cease from violating Sections 5 and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and 10(b) and 15(c) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 has become final. The decision also ordered DeMaio to disgorge \$430,000 received as a result of conduct that violated the securities laws and interest from December 31, 1988.

DeMaio, who was the office manager at the Boca Raton, Florida office of Graystone Nash, Incorporated, a broker-dealer, during 1987 and 1988, was found to have willfully violated the securities laws by, among other things, participating in and enforcing certain fraudulent practices of Graystone Nash in connection with public offerings of units of common stock and warrants. The practices concerned the repurchase of the units by Graystone Nash in the immediate aftermarket at a premium, requiring aftermarket common stock sales in certain ratios to sales of units in the offerings and allocation of common stock to be sold in the aftermarkets at increasing, artificial "tick prices" predetermined by Graystone. #### CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

LLOYD SECURITIES, INC., MORTGAGE ASSOCIATES, IBEX INTERNATIONAL, MICHAEL LLOYD AND WARREN NACHMANN ORDERED TO PAY DISGORGEMENT

The Commission announced that on October 13 the Honorable J. Curtis Joyner, U.S. District Judge for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, entered a Final Judgment and Order (Order) against Lloyd Securities, Inc. (Lloyd Securities), Mortgage Associates, IBEX International (IBEX), Michael W. Lloyd (Lloyd) and Warren C. Nachmann (Nachmann). The defendants consented, without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, to the entry of the Order which ordered them to disgorge, jointly and severally, the sum of \$4,964,600, together with prejudgment interest. Payment of disgorgement was waived by the Court based on the defendants' demonstrated inability to pay, and the criminal information against Lloyd, which was based upon

the same course of conduct which formed the basis for the Commission's action, Previously, Lloyd Securities, IBEX, Lloyd and Nachmann consented to the entry of permanent injunctions enjoining them from future violations of the registration, antifraud and net capital provisions of the federal securities laws. On August 4, 1992, Lloyd pled guilty and was sentenced to 63 months in prison and ordered to pay criminal restitution in the amount of \$4.6 million. On October 6, 1993, Nachmann pled guilty to 11 counts of conspiracy, wire and bank fraud. Nachmann's sentencing is scheduled for January 18, 1993. [SEC v. Lloyd Securities, Inc., et al., E.D. Pa., Civil Action No. 90-3841] (LR-13841)

#### CIVIL ACTION AGAINST v. U.S. DAIRY CORP.

On September 24, 1993, the Commission filed a complaint in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida against U.S. Dairy Corp. (U.S. Diary), Cecil L. Minges (Minges), Mathew H. Sage (Sage) and Robert E. King (King) alleging violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws and seeking civil penalties. U.S. Dairy has its office in Vero Beach, Florida. Minges, president, chairman of the board, director and principal shareholder of U.S. Dairy resides in Vero Beach as does King a former officer. Sage, a director and vice-president of U.S. Dairy resides in Indian Shores, Florida.

The complaint alleges that misrepresentations and omissions were made in the offers and sales of U.S. Dairy stock concerning the approval of labels for its product by numerous states, a \$1,000,000 line of credit, projections of sales of its product and the minimum numbers of shares which had to be purchased.

U.S. Dairy, Minges and Sage pursuant to their consent, without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, were enjoined from further violations of the federal securities laws described above on September 27, 1993. The Court will determine later what penalties are appropriate. [SEC v. U.S. Dairy Corp., 93-CIV-14181-MOORE, S.D. Fl.] (LR-13842)

#### FINAL JUDGMENT ENTERED AGAINST MERRITT BRADT

The Commission announced that on October 13 a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction, Disgorgement and Civil Penalties was entered, by consent, against Merritt L. Bradt (Bradt) of Port St. Lucie, Florida.

The Final Judgment enjoins Bradt from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws, and from aiding and abetting violations of the broker-dealer registration and broker-dealer antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The Final Judgment also orders Bradt to pay disgorgement in the amount of \$529,169.31, together with prejudgment interest, and civil penalties in an amount to be determined by the Court at a later date.

The complaint alleges that Bradt offered and sold interests in limited partnerships through unregistered, non-exempt transactions and made misrepresentations and omissions to offerees concerning, among other things, the return on investment and the risks associated with an investment. [SEC v. Merritt L. Bradt, et al., Civil Action No. 93-8521-CIV-GONZALEZ, S.D. Fla.] (LR-13843)

#### PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST JOHN MOHALLEY

The Commission announced that on September 29, 1993, the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against defendant John J. Mohalley (Mohalley), the former chief financial officer of Vintage Group, Inc. (Vintage). Mohalley, without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, consented to the issuance of a Final Judgment that permanently restrains and enjoins him from future violations of Section 5(a) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Sections 10(b) and 13(a) of the Securities Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Rules 10b-5, 12b-20, 13a-1 and 13a-13 promulgated thereunder and bars him from acting as an officer or director of any issuer having a class of securities registered pursuant to Section 12 of the Exchange Act or required to file reports pursuant to Section 15(d) of the Exchange Act.

The Commission's complaint alleged that Mohalley assisted Vintage implement a fraudulent scheme to materially overstate the value of its assets, revenues and income in its press releases and quarterly and annual filings with the Commission. [SEC v. John J. Mohalley, USDC, ND Ca., Civil Action No. 93-3540, VRW] (LR-13844)

## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

# MASSACHUSETTS INVESTORS TRUST, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 15, 1993 to request a hearing on an application filed by Massachusetts Investors Trust, et al. to amend a previous order granting relief from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 18(f), 18(g), 18(i), 22(c) and 22(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder. The order permits the issuance of multiple classes of shares and the imposition, and under certain circumstances the waiver, of a contingent deferred sales charge (CDSC). The amended order would permit applicants to waive the CDSC for two additional types of redemptions where the redemption proceeds are reinvested in a bank collective investment fund (CIF) and where the amount invested represents redemption proceeds from a CIF. # THE LATIN AMERICA INVESTMENT FUND, INC., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 15, 1993 to request a hearing on an application filed by the Latin America Investment Fund, Inc., et al. for an amended order under Sections 6(c) and 17(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 17d-1 thereunder. The order would permit the applicant registered investment companies to co-invest with one another and certain unregistered investment vehicles advised by the same investment adviser in securities acquired through privately negotiated transactions. #### THE AMERICAN LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY OF NEW YORK, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 15, 1993 to request a hearing on an application filed by The American Life Insurance Company of New York,

Separate Account No. 2 of the American Life Insurance Company of New York (Separate Account) and the Mutual of America Life Insurance Company for an order pursuant  $t_0$  Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act granting exemptions from the provisions of Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Act. The exemptions apply to the extent necessary to permit the deduction of distribution and mortality and expense risk charges from the assets of the Separate Account. (Rel. IC-19809 - October 21)

#### HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

### CONNECTICUT LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 15, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by The Connecticut Light and Power Company and Western Massachusetts Electric Company (WMECO) (collectively, Companies), electric publicutility subsidiary companies of Northeast Utilities, a registered holding company, to amend the Companies' respective Certificate of Incorporation, By-Laws and Articles of Organization (collectively, Charters). The Companies propose to amend those portions of the Charters which prohibit the issuance or assumption of additional unsecured debt without first obtaining an affirmative vote of the majority of common stock and senior stock outstanding (Proposal 1). Should Proposal 1 fail to receive the requisite number of votes, the Companies propose to waive the Charter provisions in order to issue or assume securities representing unsecured debt having maturities of less than ten years in excess of 10% of capitalization limitation, but not in excess of 20% of capitalization (Proposal 2). In addition, WMECO proposes to amend its Charter to provide that meetings of its stockholders may be held either anywhere within the United States or in such other location as permitted by law (Proposal 3). The Commission has authorized the Companies to solicit proxies from the holders of their senior stock and/or common stock to vote on Proposals 1, 2 and 3. (Rel. 35-25910)

#### ALLEGHENY POWER SYSTEM, INC.

An order has been issued on a proposal by Allegheny Power System, Inc. (Allegheny), a registered holding company. Allegheny proposes to amend (Amendment) its corporate charter in order to reclassify each share of its common stock, \$2.50 par value per share, into two shares of common stock, \$1.25 par value per share. In order to effect, through December 31, 1994, a proposed two-for-one stock split, Allegheny also requests authority to increase the number of shares it has authority to issue from 130 million shares (\$2.50 par value per share) to 260 million shares (\$1.25 par value per share). Allegheny proposes to submit the Amendment for consideration and action by its stockholders at a special meeting to be held on or about November 3, 1993. (Rel. 35-25911)

#### PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Association of Securities Dealers filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-93-36) to amend Section 41 of the Code of Arbitration Procedure to permit parties in arbitration proceedings involving at least \$250,000 to make pre-hearing settlement offers before an arbitration hearing is set to begin. The proposed rule change would require parties who reject such settlement offers to pay the offering party's reasonable costs and attorneys fees if the award granted in the arbitration was not more favorable to the rejecting party than the settlement offer. The proposed rule change would expire after two years. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of October 25. (Rel. 34-33081)
