PROPOSED RULES AND REQUEST FOR COMMENT

The Commission has proposed for public comment comprehensive revisions and additions to its Rules of Practice, 17 CFR 201.1 - 29, and related procedural rules. This proposal stems from the work of the Commission's Task Force on Administrative Proceedings, chaired by Commissioner Mary L. Schapiro. The proposal, in addition to updating the Commission's existing rules and making them more consistent with actual practices, would establish procedures to implement the authority granted to the Commission by the Securities Enforcement Remedies and Penny Stock Reform Act with respect to temporary cease-and-desist proceedings. The proposal also would delineate procedures to be used when disgorgement is ordered in Commission initiated administrative enforcement proceedings. ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

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INITIAL DECISION SUSPENDS RAY KOBAYASHI

Administrative Law Judge Max O. Regensteiner has issued an initial decision suspending Ray H. Kobayashi, a former securities salesman, from association with a broker-dealer for six months.

The action was based on a court order enjoining Kobayashi from violating the registration provisions of the Securities Act and the court's findings that he violated those provisions in connection with the offer and sale of a block of unregistered American Aircraft Corporation stock. He had been given that stock by an individual who had obtained it from the issuer as a result of a merger. Kobayashi failed to show that an exemption from registration was available. According to the decision, despite his knowledge that there were serious questions regarding the free tradeability of the stock, he simply accepted the representations of his donor that there were no restrictions on its sale.

The initial decision is subject to Commission review on petition of a party or on the Commission's own initiative. (Initial Decision Rel. #39)

On November 8, the Commission entered an Order Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions by Default (Order), which permanently barred Jose Luis Hernandez (Hernandez) of Miami, Florida from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment company or investment adviser. Hernandez was formerly a registered representative for a broker-dealer registered with the Commission.

In the Order, the Commission found, among other things, that on May 16, 1989, a final judgment of permanent injunction by default was entered against Hernandez in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida, which enjoined Hernandez from further violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder and required Hernandez to disgorge \$1,761,767, which represented the net proceeds obtained through the fraudulent scheme alleged in the Commission's complaint. In the complaint, the Commission alleged that Hernandez raised such amount by, among other things, falsely representing to investors that he would use their funds to make on their behalf certain "risk-free" investments, when in fact he intended to and did misappropriate the funds for his own use. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS ORDERED AGAINST WILLIAM HARTL AND ERIC LIPMAN

On November 8, the Commission instituted public administrative proceedings pursuant to Section 8A of the Securities Act of 1933 (Securities Act), Section 21C of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Sections 9(b) and 9(f) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 (Investment Company Act) and made findings and issued a cease and desist order against William P. Hartl (Hartl) and Eric P. Lipman (Lipman), former directors of Corporate Capital Resources, Inc. (CCRS). The Commission simultaneously accepted Offers of Settlement submitted by Hartl and Lipman.

In its Order the Commission found that Hartl and Lipman aided and abetted CCRS' violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Sections 10(b) and 13(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Rules 10b-5, 12b-20, 13a-1 and 13a-13 thereunder and Section 34(b) of the Investment Company Act, by issuing false and misleading financial statements that materially overstated the value of CCRS' holdings in its various investee companies. These aggregate overvaluations of CCRS' net asset value ranged from 7% to 53% and were contained in CCRS' periodic filings with the Commission for each of its accounting periods ended September 30, 1988 through March 31, 1990 and were used to sell securities to the public. Hartl and Lipman consented to the entry of the Order without admitting or denying the findings.

The Commission ordered that Hartl and Lipman be barred from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company and cease and desist from future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act, Sections 10(b) and 13(a) of the Exchange Act, and Rules 10b-5, 12b-20, 13a-1 and 13a-13 thereunder, and Section 34(b) of the Investment Company Act. The Commission announced that on November 12 a civil injunctive action was filed in the United States District Court for the Western District of New York against Federated Alliance Group, Inc. (Federated), Thomas Pantano and Maurice Jordon alleging violations of the antifraud provisions of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Rule 10b-5, and the government securities dealer registration provisions of Section 15C of the Exchange Act. The complaint seeks an immediate freeze of assets, preliminary and permanent injunctions against future violations, an accounting of funds, disgorgement plus interest and civil penalties against all three defendants.

According to the Commission's complaint, the defendants offered to collect money for individuals from other telemarketers that had defrauded them in the past for a fee of between \$2,500 and \$3,700. The complaint alleges, however, that Federated's collection service was de minimis, if it existed at all. The complaint further alleges that as an inducement to pay Federated's fee, Federated told customers they were guaranteed to win an award. Federated said the largest award was \$25,000 and the smallest was a \$5,000 face amount government bond that Federated allegedly represented was currently worth \$5,000. In fact, all customers received the bond as their award, and the bond was worth not \$5,000, but about \$750. In this manner, Federated, Pantano and Jordan allegedly defrauded over one hundred victims out of more than \$300,000. [SEC v. Federated Alliance Group, Inc., Maurice Jordan and Thomas Pantano, 93 Civ. 895E, WDNY] (LR-13868)

OFFICERS OF PENNY STOCK COMPANY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that in U.S. District Court for the Western District of Texas, Final Judgments by consent were ordered against defendants Chaparral Mining Corp. (Chaparral) and James A. Turman (Turman) on October 4, and defendant Wulf A. Gose (Gose) on October 7. Chaparral is permanently enjoined from future violations of the antifraud and reporting provisions of the federal securities laws, and Turman and Gose are permanently enjoined from future violations of the antifraud provisions, and aiding and abetting violations of the reporting provisions of the federal securities laws. Additionally, the Court noted the appropriateness of civil penalties for each defendant, but did not impose the penalties based on the defendants' demonstrated financial inability to pay.

The Commission's complaint alleged that Turman and Gose, as officers of Chaparral, a Section 12(g) reporting company, fraudulently promoted the stock of Chaparral to the public in press releases and in Commission filings. According to the complaint, Chaparral falsely valued an undeveloped mineral lease at \$4.5 million despite the fact that it had never commercially produced any minerals, and failed to disclose that the company had no funds to develop the lease. [SEC v. Chaparral Mining Corp., et al., USDC, WD TX, Civil Action No. A-92-CA-565) (LR-13869)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The <u>Chicago Board Options Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-93-42) to list for trading options based on the Nasdaq 100 Index. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of November 15. (Rel. 34-33166)

The <u>Chicago Board Options Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-93-49) proposing to list for trading options based on the CBOE Gaming Index. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of November 15. (Rel. 34-33173)

The <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-PHLX-93-14) to permit certain types of hedge orders to attain spread priority, <u>i.e.</u> execution as a single transaction with priority over certain existing bids/offers for each leg of the transaction. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of November 15. (Rel. 34-33179)

APPROVAL PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the <u>Pacific Stock Exchange</u> (SR-PSE-92-20) to adopt Rule 2.6(e) relating to the establishment, maintenance and enforcement of procedures designed to prevent the misuse of material, non-public information. (Rel. 34-33171)

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> (SR-NASD-93-13) that amends Section 44(b)(7)(C) of the NASD's Corporate Financing Rule. The rule change clarifies the NASD's exemption for offerings registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission on registration statement Forms S-3, F-3 or F-10 and offered pursuant to Rule 415 under the Securities Act of 1933. IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change filed by the <u>American Stock Exchange</u> (SR-Amex-93-29), which clarifies the manner in which the Amex calculates the Amex Hong Kong 30 Index (Index) and determines the settlement value of warrants based on the Index, has become immediately effective upon filing with the Commission. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of November 15. (Rel. 34-33172; International Series Rel. 610)
