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ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES EXCHANGE COMMISSION

CEASE AND DESIST ORDER ENTERED AGAINST STAR TECHNOLOGIES, INC.

The Commission instituted public proceedings pursuant to Section 21C(a) of the Exchange Act and issued an Opinion and Order making findings and imposing a Cease and Desist Order against Star Technologies, Inc. The Commission's Opinion and Order finds that Star violated Section 13(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 13a-1, 13a-13 and 12b-20 thereunder with respect to Star's Annual Report on Form 10-K for fiscal 1990 and its Quarterly Report on Form 10-Q for the first quarter of fiscal 1990. Star failed to follow Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in the preparation of its financial statements included in the 10-K and 10-Q. (Rel. 34-33198; AAE Rel. 505)

CIVIL ACTION AGAINST INTERLINK DATA NETWORK OF LOS ANGELES, INC., ET AL.

On November 15, the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California entered final judgment against InterLink Data Network of Los Angeles, Inc. (InterLink), InterLink Fiber Optic Partners L.P. (InterLink Fiber), InterLink Video Phone Partners L.P. (InterLink Video) and Michael Gartner. The final judgments against Gartner, InterLink, InterLink Fiber, and InterLink Video permanently enjoin them from violating the antifraud, securities registration, and broker-dealer registration provisions of the federal securities laws, and order them to disgorge, jointly and severally, the sum of \$12,285,035, plus prejudgment interest. In addition, the Court ordered the three defendant InterLink entities to pay civil penalties totalling \$12,285,035.

On November 10, the Court issued a bench warrant for Gartner's arrest. On November 1, 1993, the Court had held Gartner in civil contempt for violating an asset freeze ordered by the Court and ordered Gartner to restore the money to the registry of the Court by November 9 or make an adequate showing to the Court by that date of his inability to make payment.

The complaint, filed May 27, 1993, alleged the defendants defrauded over 450 investors by selling securities in a nonexistent fiber optic telecommunications network. [SEC v. Interlink Data Network of Los Angeles, Inc., Interlink Fiber Optic Partners L.P., Interlink Video Phone Partners L.P. and Michael Gartner, Civ. No. 93-3073, R, USDC/CD/CA] (LR-13875)

MEDIZONE INTERNATIONAL, INC., CONSENTS TO INJUNCTION

The Commission announced that it filed a complaint on November 16 in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia against Medizone International, Inc. (Medizone) of New York, New York. The Commission in its complaint seeks to compel Medizone to file its delinquent periodic reports and to enjoin Medizone from further violations of Sections 13(a) and 15(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 12b-25, 13a-1, 13a-11, 13a-13, 15d-1, 15d-11, and 15d-13 thereunder. Simultaneously with the filing of the Commission's complaint, Medizone consented to the entry of a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction. In its Consent, Medizone admitted that it had failed to file its most recent annual report and two quarterly reports, filed late eighteen periodic reports and two current reports and failed to file fifteen notifications of late filing.

According to its most recent annual report, Medizone is a development stage company whose objective is to gain regulatory approval for and to promote and distribute a new drug. [SEC v. Medizone International, Inc., Civil Action No. 93-2361, JHG, D.D.C.] (LR-13876)

CIVIL ACTION AGAINST LOUIS FERRERO, MICHAEL MAIO, PATRICIA LADAVAC AND DARRIN DUNCAN

On November 16, Judge Larry McKinney released an opinion finding that Michael Maio, Patricia Ladavac (now known as Patricia Barclay Chandler) and Darrin Duncan engaged in insider trading in violation of federal securities laws. Maio was ordered to pay \$1,640,821 representing a three-time penalty (the maximum allowed by law), disgorgement and pre-judgment interest. Ladavac (a/k/a Chandler) and Duncan were ordered to pay \$229,410 and \$40,207, respectively, representing disgorgement, a one-time penalty and pre-judgment interest.

The Court also enjoined each defendant from future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Sections 10(b) and 14(e) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Commission Rules 10b-5 and 14e-3.

The Court found that the defendants traded stock in Anacomp, Inc. and Xidex Corporation during June and July of 1988 while in possession of material nonpublic information concerning Anacomp's planned tender offer for Xidex. The Court found that Anacomp's chief executive officer, Louis P. Ferrero, improperly tipped Maio, who in turn tipped Duncan, Ladavac (a/k/k Chandler), and Maio's in-laws (who were not defendants). Without admitting or denying guilt, Ferrero previously agreed to pay a penalty of \$277,750 and consented to the entry of an injunction prohibiting him from future violations of the federal securities laws. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY, ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by National Fuel Gas Company (NFG), a registered holding company, National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation (Distribution), a gas utility subsidiary company of NFG, and National Fuel Gas Supply

Corporation (Supply), National Fuel Resources, Inc. (Resources), Seneca Resources Corporation (Seneca), and Empire Exploration, Inc. (Empire), each a wholly-owned non-utility subsidiary company of NFG (the subsidiary companies collectively, Covered Subsidiaries). NFG proposes to provide guarantees, through December 31, 1998, for a total of up to \$500 million of certain obligations of the Covered Subsidiaries, not to exceed the following amounts outstanding at any given time for each Covered Subsidiary: Distribution--\$350 million; Supply--\$50 million; Resources--\$50 million; Seneca--\$50 million; and Empire--\$10 million. PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Public Service Company of New Hampshire (PSNH), an electric utility subsidiary company of Northeast Utilities, a registered public-utility holding company. PSNH proposes to obtain extensions and modifications of and replacements for certain letters of credit and associated reimbursement agreements that have been used to improve the credit ratings and stabilize the remarketing of certain outstanding taxable pollution control revenue bonds. PSNH states that the terms and conditions relating to such extensions, modifications and replacements shall fall within certain specified parameters. (Rel. 35-25923)

THE SOUTHERN COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing The Southern Company, a registered holding company, to guarantee the obligations of its nonutility subsidiary company, Southern Electric International, Inc., under a lease agreement with the Mutual Life Insurance Company of New York, a nonassociate company, for the lease of two floors in an office building in Atlanta, Georgia. The aggregate amount of the guarantee will be \$5.5 million. (Rel. 35-25924)

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 6, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by National Fuel Gas Company and its subsidiary companies, National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation, National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation, Empire Exploration, Inc., Penn-York Energy Corporation, Seneca Resources Corporation, Utility Constructors, Inc., Highland Land & Minerals, Inc., Enerop Corporation, Data-Track Account Services, Inc., and National Fuel Resources, Inc. to issue and sell commercial paper and other short-term notes, borrow short-term under credit facilities with banks or other financial institutions, and to enter into interest rate and currency exchange agreements. JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 6, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by Jersey Central Power & Light Company, Metropolitan Edison Company and Pennsylvania Electric Company to enter into operation and maintenance agreements to provide, for a fee, services to non-utility generation facilities with which they have a power purchase agreement or with other such facilities within their service territories or adjacent electric utility service territories. ARKANSAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A supplemental notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 6, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by Arkansas Power & Light Company (AP&L), an electric public-utility subsidiary company of Entergy Corporation, a registered holding company. AP&L proposes to issue \$270 million of preferred stock, through December 31, 1995, under the exemptive provisions of Rule 52 (Additional Stock). For the period during which any shares of the Additional Stock are outstanding, AP&L proposes to redeem shares of its Additional Stock, in accordance with any mandatory or optional redemption provisions established at the time of the Additional Stock's initial issuance; and redeem (or purchase in lieu of redemption) outstanding Additional Stock, in accordance with the sinking fund provisions established at the time of the Additional Stock's initial issuance. In addition, AP&L proposes to extend its period of authorization through December 31, 1995 to acquire from time to time approximately \$198.82 million aggregate principal amount of one or more series of AP&L's outstanding first mortgage bonds; \$175 million aggregate principal amount of one or more series of the outstanding pollution control revenue bonds and/or solid waste disposal bonds issued for AP&L's benefit; and \$150 million aggregate par value of one or more series of AP&L's outstanding preferred stock. UNITIL CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 6, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by UNITIL Corporation (UNITIL), a registered holding company. UNITIL seeks authorization for its management performance compensation program (Program) through December 31, 1998. Under the Program, key employees will be eligible to receive awards of common stock and cash. To implement the Plan, UNITIL proposes to distribute up to 83,400 shares of its common stock, no par value, to be acquired on the open market or alternatively to distribute up to 83,400 authorized but unissued shares of UNITIL's common stock. AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, INC., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 6, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by American Electric Power Company, Inc. (AEP), a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries, AEP Generating Company (Generating), Appalachian Power Company (Appalachian), Columbus Southern Power Company (Columbus), Indiana Michigan Power Company (Indiana Michigan), Kanawha Valley Power Company (Kanawha), Kentucky Power Company (Kentucky Power), Kingsport Power Company (Kingsport), Ohio Power Company (Ohio Power) and Wheeling Power Company (Wheeling). During the period beginning January 1, 1994 and ending December 31, 1995 AEP, Appalachian, Columbus, Indiana Michigan, Kentucky Power and Ohio Power propose to issue, sell and renew short-term notes to banks and commercial paper to dealers (under an exception from competitive bidding) in aggregate principal amounts not to exceed \$150 million, \$250 million, \$200 million, \$200 million, \$100 million and \$250 million, respectively, outstanding at any one time; Generating, Kanawha, Kingsport and Wheeling propose to issue, sell and renew short-term notes to banks in aggregate principal amounts not to exceed \$50 million, \$10 million, \$20 million and \$20 million, respectively, outstanding at any one time; and AEP proposes to make certain capital contributions to its subsidiaries. ENTERGY CORPORATION, ET AL.

A supplemental notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 6, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by Entergy Corporation (Entergy), a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries, System Energy Resources, Inc. (SERI), Arkansas Power & Light Company (AP&L), Louisiana Power & Light Company (LP&L), Mississippi Power & Light Company (MP&L) and New Orleans Public Service Inc. (NOPSI). SERI proposes to extend, amend, and increase the amount of a current letter of credit agreement (LOC) and a related reimbursement agreement (Reimbursement Agreement), which support the equity portion of a sale and leaseback financing arrangement for its Grand Gulf Nuclear Generating Station, Unit I. ACQUISITIONS OF SECURITIES

Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
