New Directive 6420.2

- Verification of Procedures for Controlling Fecal Material, Ingesta, and Milk in Slaughter Operations
 - □ Effective May 17, 2004

New Directive Cancels

- FSIS Directive 6420.1 (Livestock)
- FSIS Directive 6150.1, Revision 1 (Poultry)

Directive 6420.2

- Combines livestock and poultry directives into one
- Combines FSIS verification procedures for meat and poultry into one directive
- Removes instructions for activities conducted prior to HACCP Directive 6420.2
- Provides instructions to verify that head, cheek and weasand meat are free of fecal material, ingesta and milk
- Provides additional instructions for enforcement methods and verification activities
 New Directive Does Not
- Change FSIS policy regarding zero tolerance
- Change FSIS policy regarding frequency of zero tolerance contamination checks
- Change identification of contamination guidance

New Directive Does Not

- Affect disposition of livestock carcasses and parts
- Affect disposition of poultry carcasses Livestock
- Inspection for fecal material, ingesta and milk
 - □ Inspection Program Personnel (IPP) verify meat from heads, cheeks and weasands are not contaminated
 - Verification may not occur at final rail
 - Verification at completion of the harvesting process after all controls and interventions

Livestock

- Regulatory requirements
 - □ 9 CFR 310.18(a) Contamination of carcasses, organs and other parts
 - □ 9 CFR 417.2 (c) (2) Critical Control Points

Poultry

- Regulatory requirements
 - □ 9 CFR 381.65(e) Operations and procedures, generally
 - □ 9 CFR 417.2 (c) (2) Critical Control Points

Documentation

- Use 03J01 to verify
 - □ Fecal material on poultry
 - □ Fecal material, ingesta or milk on livestock carcasses, head, cheek or weasand meat
 - If noncompliance Monitoring trend indicator to be marked

Enforcement

- Repeated fecal material noncompliance
 - □ Noncompliance Records (NRs) should be linked
 - □ Directive 5000.1 Revision 1, Chapter IV
- Findings not from same cause
 - □ NRs should not be linked
- IIC reviews relevant records when fecal findings indicate systemic problem
 - □ NRs would be linked
 - □ Determine if food safety system is inadequate
