### **COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS**

ANNOUNCEMENT OF A PUBLIC HEARING CONCERNING THE GOVERNMENT SECURITIES MARKET

> On February 4 at 10:00 a.m., the General Accounting Office (GAO), with the assistance and participation of the Commission, the Treasury Department, and the Federal Reserve Board, will conduct a public hearing on the current trading system in the secondary market for government securities. This joint hearing will be held in Room 1C30 of the Commission in Washington, DC.

> The hearing, mandated by the Government Securities Act of 1986, Public Law 99-571, is intended to provide the GAO with evidence from which to craft a study of the government securities market to be submitted to Congress by April 28, 1987. That study, also mandated by the 1986 Act, is to assess whether quotations for government securities and the services of government securities brokers are available on terms consistent with the public interest, the protection of investors, and the purposes of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

> In a release published in the Federal Register, 52 FR 220 (January 2, 1987), GAO gave notice of the opportunity for representatives of the government securities market to present their views at the public hearing, and/or to submit written comments to the GAO. GAO has received 27 comments and has scheduled 12 representatives of the financial community to testify at the hearing.

#### **Administrative proceedings**

#### JAMES LAIACONA BÁRRED

The Commission barred James Laiacona, of Boca Raton, Florida, from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities broker, municipal securities dealer, or investment adviser, provided that three years after the Commission's Order, he may reapply to become associated in a non-supervisory capacity in which he does not have access to or control of funds and securities of clients. The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings, naming Laiacona as respondent, on March 20, 1986, and subsequently accepted an Offer of Settlement in which Laiacona consented to an order containing the sanctions without admitting or denying certain allegations in the Order Instituting Proceedings.

Based on the Order Instituting Proceedings and the Offer of Settlement, the Commission found that on October 21, 1985 Laiacona was permanently enjoined by the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud, customer protection, and recordkeeping provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Commission also found that Laiacona wilfully violated those provisions and that on September 30, 1985 a trustee was appointed under the provisions of the Securities Investor Protection Act of 1970 to liquidate the business of a broker-dealer of which Laiacona was president. # **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

JOSEPH G. CREMONESE ENJOINED AND DISGORGEMENT ORDERED

The Commission announced that on January 20 Judge Thomas P. Griesa entered a final judgment against Joseph G. Cremonese. Cremonese, without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, consented to the final judgment. The judgment enjoins Cremonese from violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and additionally orders disgorgement of \$11,861.

The Commission, on January 17, 1986, filed a civil action in the Southern District of New York against Cremonese. In its complaint, the Commission alleged that Cremonese was a vice-president for corporate planning of Fisher Scientific Company in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, that Fisher in 1983 was a subsidiary of Allied Corporation, and that Cremonese participated in an Allied task force which studied Instrumentation Laboratory, Inc. (IL) as a possible candidate for acquisition by Allied. The complaint also alleged that prior to any public announcement that Allied would acquire IL, Cremonese purchased IL shares while in possession of material, non-public information which he acquired from his employer about Allied's possible acquisition of IL. The complaint further alleged that after the public announcement of Allied's acquisition of IL on January 9, 1983, Cremonese sold the IL stock which he had purchased for a profit, which the Commission sought to have disgorged.
