#### RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY AGENDA AND RULES SCHEDULED FOR REVIEW

The Commission published under the Regulatory Flexibility Act an agenda of open and anticipated rulemaking actions, a listing of rules scheduled for review in the next 12 months and a listing of completed rulemaking actions and reviews since the publication of the October 1986 agenda. The agenda, including the text of individual entries, will be published in the <u>Federal Register</u> by April 30, 1987 as part of a government-wide Unified Agenda of Federal Regulations.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

#### DAVID LUBART CENSURED

The Commission ordered public administrative proceedings under the Investment Company Act against David Lubart, former secretary and counsel of Baldwin Securities Corporation, a registered closed-end investment company located in New York City. The Order Instituting Proceedings alleges that Lubart violated or aided and abetted violations of Sections 17(j) and 20(a) of the Investment Company Act and its rules.

The Order alleges that (1) between February 1980 and November 1984, Lubart received from Baldwin stereo equipment, a television, payments for the purchase of two auto-mobiles and \$10,000; (2) these payments were never disclosed in Baldwin's proxy statements; and (3) Lubart failed to report all his personal securities transactions to Baldwin.

Simultaneous with the institution of proceedings, the Commission accepted Lubart's Offer of Settlement in which he consents, without admitting or denying the allegations, to a censure, to reimburse Baldwin \$40,000 and to not associate with any investment company for five years. (Rel. IC-15577)

#### CONTINENTAL ILLINOIS CORPORATION CITED

The Commission ordered administrative proceedings against Continental Illinois Corporation, the bank holding company for Continental Illinois National Bank and Trust Company of Chicago. The proceedings were instituted to determine whether Continental failed to comply in any material respect with Sections 13(a) and 14(a) of the Securities Exchange Act and rules thereunder in connection with its second quarter report of 1984 and proxy statement dated August 24, 1984 for a special stockholders meeting of September 26, 1984. Without admitting or denying any matter set forth therein, Continental consented to the issuance of an opinion and order.

The proceedings concern Continental's characterization in the report and proxy statement of a provision for loan losses. The Commission concluded that it was materially misleading for Continental to characterize \$425 million, of the nearly \$1 billion reported, as loss on sale of loans to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, pursuant to a plan approved at the stockholders meeting. The \$425 million should have been treated as a provision for credit loss in the Bank's portfolio before the loan sale. The Commission has ordered Continental to (1) file a copy of the order with the Commission in a Form 8-K; (2) include a summary of the proceeding in its next annual report; (3) present in such annual report and any future filings with the Commission, requiring a consolidated statement of income for 1984, a restated consolidated statement of income for 1984 which accurately characterizes the \$425 million and (4) comply in all material respects with applicable Exchange Act sections and rules. DEAN WITTER REYNOLDS, INC.

The Commission ordered public administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Dean Witter Reynolds Inc. (Registrant), a registered broker-dealer with headquarters in New York City. The Commission also simultaneously accepted Registrant's Offer of Settlement (Offer).

By its Offer, Registrant, without admitting or denying the allegations, allowed the Commission to find that Registrant wilfully violated the currency transaction reporting provisions of the Exchange Act (Rule 17a-8), in that Registrant failed to file approximately 38 currency transaction reports totaling approximately \$1,062,234.

Registrant also consented to a centure and agreed to comply with certain undertakings designed to prevent the recurrence of similar violations. (Rel. 34-24143)

## **INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

CAPITOL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 23 to request a hearing on an application of Capitol Life Insurance Company, Capitol Variable Annuity Account One and Integrated Capital Services, Inc. (Applicants) exempting them from certain provisions of the Investment Company Act to permit the issuance of variable annuity contracts that provide for the deduction of mortality and expense risk charges from net asset value. LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY OF VIRGINIA

A notice has been issued giving interest persons until March 23 to request a hearing on an application of The Life Insurance Company of Virginia, Life of Virginia Separate Account II and Life of Virginia Security Sales, Ltd. (Applicants) for an order exempting Applicants from various provisions of the Investment Company Act and its rules. Applicants seek relief so as to permit a contingent deferred administration charge for expenses incurred in issuing flexible premium variable life insurance contracts that would be deducted from the amount otherwise payable upon surrender or lapse of the contract prior to the tenth contract year. #### HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 23 to request a hearing on a proposal by Eastern Utilities Associates (EUA) to amend its declaration of trust to increase its authorized number of common shares from 16,000,000 to 36,000,000, to allow its trustees to distribute dividends in common shares and take certain other action subject to Commission approval and to limit the liability of its trustees and broaden the indemnification of its trustees, officers and agents, as permitted by Massachusetts law. An order has been issued authorizing EUA to solicit proxies for approval of these measures at its April 21, 1987 annual meeting of shareholders. (Rel. 35-24325 - Feb. 26)

#### CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Consolidated Natural Gas Company, a registered holding company, to issue and sell within two years of the effective date of the authorization up to \$250 million of debentures (Debentures), in one or more series, at competitive bidding pursuant to Rule 50(b) or in accordance with the alternative procedures authorized by the Statement of Policy dated September 2, 1982 (Rel. 35-22623) or, alternatively, pursuant to an exception under Rule 50(a)(5) from the competitive bidding requirements of Rule 50.
