COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SHAD ANNOUNCES SES AWARDS

Chairman John Shad recently announced that, pursuant to the Civil Service Reform Act of 1978, he has selected 14 members of the Commission's Senior Executive Service to receive cash performance awards for their work during the 1986 fiscal year. (Press Release 87-14)

ADDITION TO WEEKLY CALENDAR

Commissioner Fleischman will testify on securitization of government loans before the Committee on Small Business of the House of Representatives on Tuesday, March 10, beginning at 9:00 a.m. The hearing will be in Room 2359A, Rayburn House Office Building.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST THE OPPORTUNITY PROSPECTOR, INC. AND TOP FUND MANAGEMENT, INC.

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against two affiliated registered investment advisers, The Opportunity Prospector, Inc. (TOP) and Top Fund Management, Inc. (TFM). The Order for Proceedings alleges that TOP and TFM violated recordkeeping provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. Specifically, the Order alleges that each adviser failed to maintain certain accounting records and records concerning the personal securities transactions of their advisory personnel required by Rule 204-2(a) of the Advisers Act. In addition, the Order alleges that several TOP advisory contracts failed to contain a non-assignability clause as required by Section 205 of the Advisers Act. A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations of the Order and true and what remedial action is necessary in the public interest. (Rel. IA-1059)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

THOMAS F. STAFFORD ENJOINED AND DISGORGEMENT ORDERED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on February 24 U.S. District Judge Howard D. McKibben, District of Nevada, entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Thomas F. Stafford, permanently enjoining him from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Order also requires Stafford to disgorge \$26,700 fraudulently received from investors and converted to Stafford's own personal uses. Simultaneously Stafford, without admitting or denying the facts alleged, consented to the Order.

The Commission's November 14, 1986 complaint alleged that from July 1983 to about October 1983, Stafford raised \$116,000 from 13 investors through the sale of common stock in Heat Factory, Inc. The complaint further alleged that in connection with these sales, Stafford made, and caused to be made to investors, material misrepresentations and omissions concerning, among other things, the use of proceeds; the true status of the issuer's merger negotiations with other companies; the return on the investment; the existence or likelihood of a future public trading market in the issuer's securities; and the risks associated with the investment. (SEC v. Dennis A. Thomas, et al., NV, Civil Action No. S-86-1093 HDM, filed November 14, 1986). (LR-11364)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ML VENTURE PARTNERS II, L. P., et al.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 27 to request a hearing on an application filed by ML Venture Partners II, L.P. (Partnership), a business development company organized as a Delaware limited partnership; MLVP II Co., L.P. (Managing General Partner), a New York limited partnership which is the Partnership's managing general partner; and Merrill Lynch Venture Capital, Inc. (Management Company), a Delaware corporation which is the general partner of the Managing General Partner (together, Applicants). The application requests an order (1) declaring that the Independent General Partners of the Partnership are not interested persons, within the meaning of Section 2(a)(19) of the Investment Company Act, of the Partnership, the Managing General Partner, the Management Company, and/or Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Inc., the principal underwriter, solely by reason of their being general partners of the Partnership; ML Venture Partners I, L.P. (MLVP I) (a business development company organized in 1982), and that service as an Independent General Partner of the Partnership shall not cause an Independent General Partner of MLVP I to be an interested person of MLVP I; and (2) exempting from Section 57(a) of the Investment Company Act the proposed acquisition by the Partnership from the Management Company of certain initial venture capital investments. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 30 to request a hearing on a proposal by Consolidated Natural Gas Company, a registered holding company, to amend its certificate of incorporation to limit the liability of its directors for money damages. An order has been issued authorizing the solicitation of proxies at the annual meeting to be held May 19, 1987. (Rel. 35-24331 - March 5)

ARKANSAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Arkansas Power & Light Company (AP&L), subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to explore and negotiate the possible sale of all of the common stock and a subordinated note of Associated Natural Gas Company, subsidiary of AP&L, following an exception from the competitive bidding requirements of Rule 50 under Subsection (a)(5). SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved proposed rule changes filed by the New York, Midwest, and Boston Stock Exchanges (SR-NYSE-85-37; SR-MSE-86-4; SR-BSE-85-8) authorizing them to provide facilities for trading securities for settlement on an expedited basis. MSE's proposal also would authorize trading facilities for transactions that settle between six and 60 days after trade execution, at the seller's option. (Rel. 34-24161) The Commission granted accelerated approval of a proposed rule change by: <u>The Midwest</u> <u>Stock Exchange</u> (SR-MSE-87-4) and <u>The American Stock Exchange</u> (SR-Amex-87-5) to permit use of the revised General Securities Representative (Series 7) Examination and their study outline to qualify persons seeking registration as general securities representatives. (Rel. 34-24162; 34-24163)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Pacific Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-PSE-87-4) that would require members and member firms to notify the Exchange of any changes in their respective addresses within 60 days of such change. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of March 9. (Rel. 34-24164)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

SMITH BARNEY CAPITAL CORP.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 7 to request a hearing on an application by Smith Barney Capital Corp., a Delaware corporation, under Section 310(b)(1)(ii) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939.
