# **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

DECISION DENYING INVESTMENT ADVISER REGISTRATION TO MICHAEL DAVID MARANT FINAL

The decision of an administrative law judge denying the application of Michael David Marant, also known as Herbert Marant, doing business as Light Investment Company of Englewood, Colorado, for registration as an investment adviser has become final.

Marant is currently serving concurrent prison sentences for first degree murder and conspiracy to commit murder. According to the law judge's decision, Marant, in his application for registration, made material misstatements with respect to the fact that he is currently serving a prison sentence, the names he has used, his criminal convictions, and his intended advisory services. ## **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

#### LEADERSHIP PROPERTIES, INC. ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on March 25 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Leadership Properties, Inc. of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The Judgment restrained and enjoined Leadership from failing to file timely and in proper form accurate and complete periodic reports and Notifications of Late Filing.

In its December 29, 1986 complaint, the Commission alleged that Leadership, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended May 31, 1986 and its Quarterly Report on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarter ended August 31, 1986. Leadership, consenting to the Court's Judgment, admitted that it failed to file or filed late 17 Annual and Quarterly Reports and failed to file 12 Notifications of Late Filing. (SEC v. Leadership Properties, Inc., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 86-3528). (LR-11385)

#### NAHUM VASKEVITCH, OTHERS PRELIMINARILY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on March 30 Judge Robert W. Sweet, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, entered an Order preliminarily enjoining Nahum Vaskevitch, David Sofer, Plenmeer, Ltd., and Meda Establishment from violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. At the same time, the court entered an Order Freezing Assets, an Order for an Accounting, and an Order Preventing Document Alteration or Destruction.

The Commission's March 11 complaint alleged that Vaskevitch, then a managing director in the mergers and acquisitions department of the London office of Merrill Lynch Pierce Fenner and Smith, provided material, nonpublic information to Sofer, who then directed the purchase and sale of securities through, among others, accounts in the names of Plenmeer and Meda. The defendants realized over \$4 million in illegal profits as the result of the fraudulent scheme. (SEC v. Nahum Vaskevitch, et al., USDC SDNY, Civil Action No. 87 Civ. 1630, RWS). (LR-11386)

#### COMPLAINT NAMES THE ROLFITE COMPANY

The Commission filed a civil injunctive action on March 31 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against The Rolfite Company of Miami, Florida. The complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief.

The Commission alleges that Rolfite, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended December 31, 1985, and its three most recent Quarterly Reports on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarters ended March 31, June 30, and September 30, 1986, and five Notifications of Late Filing. The Commission requests that the Court order Rolfite to file its delinquent Annual and Quarterly Reports and enjoin it from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. The Rolfite Company, USDC DC, Civil Action No. 87-0881). (LR-11387)

# **INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

NARRAGANSETT VENTURE CORPORATION; NARRAGANSETT CAPITAL CORPORATION

Orders have been issued on separate applications by Narragansett Venture Corporation and Narragansett Capital Corporation declaring that they have eased to be an investment companies. (Rel. IC-15647; Rel. IC-15649 - March 27)

#### INTERNATIONAL HERITAGE FUND

An order has been issued on an application filed by International Heritage Fund and International Heritage Securities, Inc. permitting the assessment and waiver of a contingent deferred sale charge. (Rel. IC-15648 - March 27)

#### FLAG INVESTORS CORPORATE CASH TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 20 to request a hearing on an application by Flag Investors Corporate Cash Trust for an order exempting it from the provisions of Section 19(b) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 19b-1 to permit monthly distributions of long-term capital gains from certain options transactions. (Rel. IC-15650 - March 27)

### **HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

#### COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing Columbia Gas System, Inc. (Columbia), a regis-Columbia Hydrocarbon Corporation, Columbia Coal Gasification Corporation, The Inland Gas Company, Inc., Columbia Gas Transmission Corporation, Columbia Gas of Kentucky, Inc., Columbia Gas of Maryland, Inc., Columbia Gas of New York, Inc., Columbia Gas of Ohio, Inc., Columbia Gas of Pennsylvania, Inc., Columbia Gas of Virginia, Inc., Columbia Gulf Transmission Company, Columbia Gas Development Corporation, Columbia Gas Development of Canada, Ltd., Commonwealth Gas Pipeline Corporation, and Commonwealth Gas Services, Inc. (collectively, the Subsidiaries), to engage in a refunding program in 1987 and 1988. The Subsidiaries will refund to Columbia certain high cost promissory notes, up to an aggregate principal amount of \$334,979,466, with interest rates from 10.2% to 15.6%, and issue to Columbia a like principal amount of lower cost, unsecured installment promissory notes with interest rates approximating those of a corresponding debenture issue by Columbia. (Rel. 35-24349 - March 18)

An order has also been issued authorizing Columbia to amend its Certificate of Incorporation (Charter) to adopt a limitation on directors' liability for money damages for breach of the duty of care, permitted by recent amendments to the Delaware General Corporation Law, and to include revised director, officer and employee indemnification provisions. In addition, Columbia is authorized to solicit proxies from its common stockholders in connection with the aforementioned amendments to its Charter. The proposed amendments will be submitted to Columbia's stockholders for approval at the next annual meeting. (Rel. 35-24350 - March 19)

## **SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS**

#### IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A rule change filed by the Options Clearing Corporation has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed rule change (SR-OCC-87-2) revises OCC's fee schedule concerning settlements of exercises and assignments of options on foreign currencies. (Rel. 34-24271)

The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NASD-87-5) that would add a new paragraph (c)(3) to Article III, Section 35 of its Rules of Fair Practice. The new paragraph requires members to file with the NASD advertising and sales literature concerning direct participation programs (DPPs) within ten days of the member's first use or publication of that advertising; it further recommends that members file such advertising before use or publication. The new paragraph exempts members from filing advertising previously filed by the DPP sponsor, general partner or underwriter, or by another member. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of March 30. (Rel. 34-24272)
