COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

MARK-UPS ON ZERO-COUPON SECURITIES

The Commission issued a release reminding broker-dealers that the Commission's mark-up policy applies to zero-coupon securities. Broker-dealers must recognize that sales of zero-coupon securities with mark-ups that are excessive and undisclosed violate the securities laws, and the rules and regulations of the Commission. Further, excessive mark-ups, whether or not disclosed, violate the rules of the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. and the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board. (Rel. 34-24368)

COMMISSION FILES BRIEF IN ZERO-COUPON BOND MARK-UPS CASE

The Commission's General Counsel, Daniel L. Goelzer, announced that the Commission filed a friend-of-the-court brief in Ettinger v. Merrill Lynch, a case pending in the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit. The case is a private suit under an antifraud provision of the securities laws by a purchaser of zero-coupon bonds from Merrill Lynch for losses arising from the purchase of the bonds at alleged undisclosed excessive mark-ups. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

RULE 2(e) PROCEEDING INSTITUTED AGAINST WILLIAM D. SAUERS

The Commission issued an Order Instituting Proceedings and Opinion and Order under Rule 2(e) of its Rules of Practice against William D. Sauers, a California-based attorney who practices in Palo Alto, California. The Order denies Sauers the privilege of appearing or practicing before the Commission for 18 months.

The Order finds that Sauers has been permanently enjoined under a court order. Sauers consented to the injunction and to the Commission's Order without admitting or denying any violations of law. The court order enjoined him from violating the antifraud and proxy provisions and from aiding and abetting violations of the registration, issuer reporting, and securities ownership reporting provisions. PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST E. MICHAEL FURLONG

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Edward Michael Furlong, formerly a registered representative with the now defunct Union Securities of Pasadena, California. The Order for Proceedings alleges that on October 20, 1986, in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California, Furlong was found guilty, upon his plea of guilty, of one count of securities fraud, in violation of Title 15 USC, Section 78j(b). This conviction was based upon Furlong's participation in a scheme to fraudulently manipulate the share price of Abex, Ltd. common stock while he was associated with Union. A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against Furlong are true and, if so, what, if any, remedial action is appropriate. (Rel. 34-24335)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES JERALD MOSKOWITZ, OTHERS

The Philadelphia Regional Office filed a Complaint on April 9 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Maryland for injunctive relief against Jerald Moskowitz, Lee Richards, and Walter Wilowatyj. The Complaint alleges violations of the securities laws in connection with the improprer recogfnition of revenue by Psych Systems, Inc. (PSI). Specifically, the Complaint alleges that Moskowitz and Wilowatyj caused PSI to prepare and file with the Commission a materially false and misleading Form 10-K for the fiscal year ending November 30, 1983, in which PSI's revenue was overstated by \$1,060,000. The Complaint further alleges that Moskowitz and Richards violated the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act by misleading Alexander Grant & Co. during its audit of PSI for fiscal year 1983 and by inducing customers to return false audit confirmations to Alexander Grant. (SEC v. Jerald Moskowitz, et al., DMD, Civil Action No. 87-862). (LR-11409)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SANTA BARBARA FUNDING II, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 11 to request a hearing on the application by Santa Barbara Funding II to amend an existing order (Rel. IC-15201, July 14, 1986) granting exemption from all provisions of the Investment Company Act so that it may issue variable and floating interest rate mortgage-backed securities. (Rel. IC-15692 - April 17)

INTEGRATED ARROS FUND I

An order has been exempting Integrated ARROs Fund I, Integrated ARROs Fund II (Funds), and IR Pass-through Corporation (collectively, Applicants), from the provisions of Sections 10(h)(1), 10(h)(2), 14(a), 16(a), 17(a), 17(d), and 32(a) of the Investment Company Act to permit the Funds and future Integrated ARROs Funds organized by IR Pass-through Corporation to acquire and hold specified real estate lease-related contract rights which represent amounts payable to their sponsor from its privately offered real estate limited partnerships. (Rel. IC-15693 - April 21)

E.F. HUTTON MORTGAGE CAPITAL INC.

An order has been issued exempting E.F. Hutton Mortgage Capital Inc. (Depositor) and certain trusts it may form from time to time from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in connection with the issuance by the Depositor and the Trusts of mortgage-backed securities and the sale of beneficial interests in such Trusts and the Depositor. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

WISCONSIN ENERGY CORPORATION

A supplemental order has been issued exempting Wisconsin Energy Corporation (formerly WEPCO, Inc.) it from all provisions of the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935 except Section 9(a)(2), subject to certain conditions. (Rel. 35-24267A - April 13)

NORTHEAST UTILITIES

An order has been issued authorizing Northeast Utilities (NU), a registered holding company, to invest up to \$10,001,000 in securities of Executive Risk Incorporated (ERI), a nonassociated Delaware company, in order for NU's subsidiary, Northeast Utilities Service Company, to obtain directors' and officers' insurance for the NU system companies. NU proposes to acquire 150,000 shares of ERI common stock for an aggregate purchase price of \$1.5 million, 85,000 shares of convertible preferred stock for an aggregate purchase price of \$8.5 million, and, for an aggregate purchase price of \$1,000, 100,000 warrants to purchase up to 100,000 shares of common stock at an exercise price of \$10 per share. NU will at no time hold 10% or more of the outstanding common stock of ERI. (Rel. 35-24372 - April 15)

JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Jersey Central Power & Light Company (JCP&L), an electric utility subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, a registered holding company, and Energy Initiatives, Incorporated (EII), a wholly owned subsidiary of JCP&L. EII proposes to invest in cogeneration projects in an amount up to \$7 million and related projects through December 31, 1996, and to provide certain associated services for a fee. (Rel. 34-24363); The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (SR-NASD-87-20) to amend the terms of its Pilot Program jointly undertaken with the International Stock Exchange of the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland, Ltd. The Pilot Program provides for the exchange of quotation information between the two entities for approximately 600 securities. The NASD is seeking two-year approval of the linkage.
