COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SECURITIES EXCHANGE ACT WOULD AMEND DEFINITIONS OF "BROKER" AND "DEALER"

> The Commission today released its proposed amendments to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed amendments would amend the definitions of "broker" and "dealer" contained in Sections 3(a)(4) and 3(a)(5) of the Act. They are designed to achieve regulation by function rather than by outmoded industry classification and will ensure that all entities engaged in the securities business will be subject to the regulatory scheme for broker-dealers that Congress has established and charged the Commission with administering.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CHAROLETTE AND EDWARD GARRITY PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on April 21 U.S. District Court Judge Robert A. Grant, Northern District of Indiana, South Bend Division, granted the Commission's Motion for Summary Judgment and entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Charolette Garrity, Edward Garrity, Investments International and Executive I, II, III. The Final Judgment enjoins the above defendents from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws.

The Garritys were preliminarily enjoined from violating the Federal securities laws on October 5, 1984 in connection with their Investments International and Executive I, II, III schemes and Charolette Garrity was held in civil contempt and ordered to disgorge \$581,810 on April 15, 1985 for continuation of those schemes. Both Charolette and Edward Garrity were held in civil contempt and were ordered to disgorge \$295,048 on July 3, 1986 in connection with their International Diversified Corporation scheme. Both of the Garritys were ordered imprisoned on September 16, 1986 for their failure to comply with the above disgorgement orders. In addition, in a related criminal matter, on December 16, 1986 both of the Garritys were sentenced to five years imprisonment each for Federal mail fraud violations in connection with the above schemes. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CHILLICOTHE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 28 to request a hearing on an application filed by Chillicothe Industrial Development Corporation for an order pursuant to Sections 6(c) and 6(e) for exemption from all provisions of the Investment Company Act with certain exceptions. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing National Fuel Gas Company (National Fuel), a registered holding company, to enter into agreements whereby, among other things, it will acquire all of the issued and outstanding capital stock and other assets of Utility Constructors, Inc. ("New UCI"), a Pennsylvania corporation which will provide pipeline construction and replacement, drilling, well maintenance, and related services to other subsidiary companies of National Fuel and to nonassociate companies. As a capital contribution to New UCI, National Fuel will provide \$6 million, of which \$2 million will be for the purchase of stock and \$4 million will be paid-in capital. (Rel. 35-24381)

HAWAIIAN ELECTRIC INDUSTRIES, INC. HAWAIIAN ELECTRIC RENEWABLE SYSTEMS, INC.

An order has been issued regarding Hawaiian Electric Industries, Inc., an exempt public utility holding company, and its electric utility subsidiary company, Hawaiian Electric Renewable Systems, Inc. (HERS), authorizing HERS to acquire all of the capital stock of Lalamilo Ventures, Inc., which operates a windfarm on the Island of Hawaii. (Rel. 35-24382)

THE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a proposal by The Columbia Gas System, Inc. (Columbia), a registered holding company, and certain of its subsidiary companies, including Columbia Gas of Kentucky, Inc. (Columbia Kentucky), Commonwealth Gas Pipeline Corporation (Commonwealth Pipeline) and Columbia Gas of Virginia, Inc. (Columbia Virginia). By order dated December 20, 1985 the Columbia system companies were authorized to extend their Intercompany Financing, External Short-Term Financing and Money Pool Program through December 31, 1987, subject to the approval of state commissions having jurisdiction over the proposed transactions. The supplemental order releases jurisdiction with respect to transactions for which the record is now complete, including the issuance by Columbia Kentucky in 1986 of up to \$3.2 million in long-term promissory notes; the issuance by Commonwealth Pipeline through 1987 of up to \$2 million in short-term debt; the issuance by Columbia Virginia in 1987 of up to \$1.7 million in long-term promissory notes and up to \$7 million in short-term debt; and the investment of excess cash in the Intrasystem Money Pool from time to time in 1987 by Commonwealth Pipeline and Columbia Virginia. The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, proposed rule changes filed by The New York Stock Exchange, Inc.: (SR-NYSE-87-5) to extend the effectiveness of Rule 103A regarding specialist performance evaluation until July 31, 1987 (Rel. 34-24413); and (SR-NYSE-86-37) to adopt, on a six month pilot basis, a rule that would authorize the Exchange to review certain proposed mergers, acquisitions and other combinations between specialist units that raise concentration-related issues. NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the <u>Intermountain Stock Exchange, Inc.</u> (SR-ISE-86-1) which withdraws the current body of ISE rules permitting its operation as a national securities exchange. (Rel. 34-24414)
