U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

HENRY A. PAWLIK CITED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Section 14(b) of the Securities Investors Protection Act of 1970 against Henry A. Pawlik. Simultaneous with the institution of those proceedings, Pawlik submitted an offer of Settlement, which the Commission accepted for the purpose of disposing of the issues raised by these proceedings. Pawlik, without admitting or denying the allegations, consented to Findings and an Order Imposing Remedial Sanctions which find that he violated Sections 17(a)(1), (2), and (3) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5, and aided and abetted violations of Sections 15(c)(3) and 17(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 15c3-1, 15c3-3, 17a-3, and 17a-4.

The Commission permanently barred Pawlik from association with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser, or municipal securities dealer. On March 23, Pawlik consented to an order of permanent in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois enjoining him from violating or aiding and abetting violations of any of the above provisions. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

ORDER OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST PAUL E. SHERROD

> The Denver Regional Office announced that on June 18 Chief Judge Sherman G. Finesilver, U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado, signed an order of permanent injunction against Paul E. Sherrod, formerly of Denver, Colorado. The order, among other things, enjoins Sherrod from violating the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Sherrod consented to the permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the Commission's complaint. The complaint alleged, among other things, that Sherrod and Paul T. Van Winkle, also of Denver, violated the antifraud provisions by causing Time Technology, Inc., a Colorado corporation head-quartered in Grand Rapids, Michigan, to file a false and misleading registration statement for the initial public offering of the company's stock, and a false and misleading quarterly report on Form 10-Q for the quarter ended May 31, 1985. An order of permanent injunction was entered against Van Winkle on March 27. (SEC v. Paul T. Van Winkle and Paul E. Sherrod, USDC CO, Civil Action No. 87-F-378). (LR-11488)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

PRINCIPALS FOR BROOKS HAMBURGER SATNICK, INC. SENTENCED FOR CRIMINAL CONTEMPT

The New York Regional Office announced that on June 23 Chief Judge Charles L. Brieant, Southern District of New York, sentenced Marvin Hamburger, Jan E. Brooks, and William P. Satnick to a fine of \$4,000 each based upon their pleas of guilty to one count of criminal contempt based upon violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities

The defendants' activities involved an offering in 1983 of common stock of American Technology Management Corporation (ATM) and untrue statements of material facts regarding, among other things, the nature and extent of ATM's operations. IDS MUTUAL, INC.

An order has been issued exempting the IDS Mutual Fund Group (Applicants) from Section 32(a)(1) of the Investment Company Act permitting the Applicants to file financial statements signed or certified by an independent public accountant selected at a board of directors meeting held within 90 days before or after the beginning of each Applicant's fiscal year. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

VERMONT YANKEE NUCLEAR POWER CORPORATION

An order has been issued authorizing Vermont Yankee Nuclear Power Corporation, subsidiary of New England Electric System and Northeast Utilities, to issue and sell short-term notes to banks to evidence its borrowings under lines of credit with those banks up to a maximum amount of \$16 million through December 31, 1988. CONNECTICUT LIGHT & POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Connecticut Light & Power Company, subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, to extend the time in which to issue and sell up to \$175 million principal amount of its first and refunding mortgage bonds by competitive bidding until December 31, 1988. NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes have been filed under Rule 19b-4 by: Midwest Clearing Corporation (SR-MCC-87-3) that would permit the implementation of a policy to guarantee all pending Continuous Net Settlement (CNS) trades as of 11:59 p.m. (EST) on the day they are reported to Participants, as compared. In addition, the proposal would modify MCC's existing methods of calculating Participant Fund contributions. (Rel. 34-24705); and MBS Clearing Corporation (SR-MBS-87-6) is designed to permit it to offer clearing and settling services on option contracts where the underlying contract concerns the purchase or sale of selected government securities, i.e., U.S. Treasury bonds and notes.
