NINA GROSS APPOINTED DIRECTOR OF LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS

Chairman Ruder announced that he has selected Nina Gross to be Director of the Office of Legislative Affairs. Ms. Gross succeeds Cecile Srodes who has held the position for the past three years. Ms. Gross has extensive experience on the Hill. She has served as a legislative assistant to Senator Durenberger and as a lobbyist for a major trade association. Currently, she is associated with a Washington, DC law firm in which her major focus is to provide legislative advice on securities, trade, and banking issues.

Ms. Gross is a 1977 graduate of the George Mason University School of Law. She obtained a BA degree from George Washington University in 1974. She will join the Commission staff on November 2.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES SHIMON LEV

The Commission filed a Complaint on October 22 seeking injunctive and other equitable relief in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York against Shimon Lev. The Complaint alleges that Lev violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws by trading in the options of Colt Industries, Inc. while in possession of material non-public information concerning a proposed recapitalization obtained from his relative, Israel Grossman. [In a separate pending action, the Commission alleged the same violations against Grossman and others. Grossman was convicted of these violations in a criminal action on August 18 and has been sentenced to two years imprisonment.] (SEC v. Shimon Lev, USDC SDNY, Civil Action No. 87 CIV 7520). INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE THAI FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 16 to request a hearing on an application filed by the Thai Fund, Inc., a closed-end fund, for an order exempting it from the provisions of Section 12(d)(1)(A) of the Investment Company Act to permit the Fund to purchase beneficial interests in an investment pool in Thailand which invests exclusively in equity securities of Thai companies. 5600, INC.

An order has been issued on an application filed by 5600, Inc. exempting from all provisions of the Investment Company Act certain existing and future investment vehicles owned or controlled by the Reckefeller Family. (Rel. 10-16067 - Oct. 21)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALABAMA POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Alabama Power Company, Georgia Power Company, Gulf Power Company, and Mississippi Power Company, subsidiaries of The Southern Company, and Southern Electric Generating Company, a subsidiary of Alabama and Georgia, to acquire and retire up to the respective aggregate total outstanding amounts of \$1.419 billion of first mortgage bonds, \$290 million of preferred stock, and \$1.825 billion of pollution control or industrial development bonds. A supplemental order has been issued approving the issuance and sale of up to \$200 million of first mortgage bonds and \$100 million of Class A Preferred Stock by Alabama. Jurisdiction has been reserved over the issuance and sale of an additional \$325 million of Bonds and \$10 million of Preferred Stock, and the financing of pollution control facilities in an amount of up to \$125 million, pending completion of the record. CENTRAL POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY

The proposal (SR-NASD-87-34) amends Part 5 of Schedule D of the NASD's By-Laws to reduce the charge payable by non-professional subscribers for access to combined NASDAQ Level One and NASDAQ/NMS Last Sale Information service supplied through authorized vendors from \$12.00 per interrogation device per month to \$4.00 per interrogation device per month. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
