DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

ARGODALE, ANDREWS AND LOVITT SANCTIONED. The SEC has issued an order barring Constantine G. Argodale, Tulsa, Okla., from being associated with any broker-dealer, and suspending George G. Andrews and Allen B. Lovitt, Tulsa, from such association for nine months. The Commission's order further provides that Argodale may, after nine months, be employed in a supervised capacity by a broker-dealer which the Commission may determine is capable of proper supervision, and that such order shall not preclude the subsequent employment of Andrews and Lovitt in the securities business in a non-supervisory capacity upon an appropriate showing to the Commission that they will be adequately supervised. The sanctions are based on findings of violations or aiding and abetting violations of the registration, antifraud and record-keeping provisions of the securities laws, and take effect on the date of the Commission's order.

According to the decision, during the period July 1969-May 1970, Argodale, Andrews and Lovitt sold unregistered stocks of First General Corporation, Viclad Industries and Vista Petroleum Corporation, published artificially created quotations for such stocks, disposed of such securities on behalf of favored customers who wished to liquidate their positions, and failed to disclose material information concerning, among other things, the speculative and unseasoned nature of the securities and the facts that First General was making a market on behalf of those selling customers, and that the market price of First General's stock was not independently determined. Those persons were also found to have made additional misrepresentations in connection with the offering of First General's common stock.

Argodale, Andrews and Lovitt consented to the findings and sanctions in offers of settlement without admitting or denying the charges. (Release 34-9262)

HOWETT, INC. SUSPENDED PENDING PROCEEDINGS. The SEC today suspended the broker-dealer registration of Howett, Inc. of Greenville, Ill., pending final determination of administrative proceedings before the Commission. The issues in the proceedings relate to charges by the Commission's staff that the firm and its president, Vernon F. Wetter, violated antifraud, net capital, and record-keeping provisions of the securities laws. The interim suspension order was issued pursuant to the firm's consent. (Release 34-9263)

NEW RULES AND RULE PROPOSALS

SEC PROPOSES RULE RE RETROACTIVE REGISTRATION OF CERTAIN INVESTMENT COMPANY SECURITIES. The SEC has proposed adoption of a new Rule 24f-1 to implement the first two sentences of Section 24(f) of the Investment Company Act, as amended by the Investment Company Amendments Act of 1970. The proposed rule would apply to securities issued by a face-amount certificate company, open-end management company or unit investment trust where the number of shares which have been sold exceeds the number of shares included in the registration statement of the company under the Securities Act of 1933 in effect at the time of sale. The rule would provide a procedure whereby such companies may, under the circumstances set forth in the rule, elect to have the registration of certain excess shares, sold within six months prior to the payment of the fee required by the rule, deemed effective as of the time of sale of such excess shares.

The printing and distribution of this release to the Commission's mailing list will be somewhat delayed. Therefore, the Investment Company Institute, the Association of Mutual Fund Plan Sponsors, the American Life Convention and the Life Insurance Association of America have undertaken to distribute copies to their members and make copies available to other interested persons. The release will also appear in the Federal Register within the next few days. All interested persons are invited to submit their views and comments on the proposed rule in writing to the SEC, Washington, D. C. 20549 on or before September 7, 1971. All such communications should refer to File No. S7-405 and will be available for public inspection. (Release 33-5174)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC ORDER CITES WELLINGTON HUNTER ASSOCIATES. The SEC has ordered administrative proceedings naming Wellington Hunter Associates, Inc., Jersey City, N. J., based upon allegations of violations of the broker-dealer registration provisions of the Federal securities laws. The Commission postponed until August 20, 1971 the effective date of the broker-dealer registration of Wellington and set a hearing for August 13, 1971 on the question of whether or not to postpone until the conclusion of the administrative proceeding the effective date of an application by Wellington to become a registered broker-dealer. A hearing will be held to take evidence on the staff allegations and afford the respondents an opportunity to offer any defenses thereto and to determine if the allegations are true and if so, whether any action of a remedial nature should be ordered by the Commission.

COMMISSION ENTERS BECK INDUSTRIES PROCEEDINGS. The SEC announced today that it has filed a notice of appearance in proceedings under Chapter X of the Bankruptcy Act for the reorganization of Beck Industries, Inc. pending in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York. Beck's voluntary petition was approved on May 27, 1971 by Judge John M. Canella, who appointed Leon Leighton and Irving Kirschenbaum co-trustees. Beck makes and sells shoes and wearing apparel for men and women. An unaudited balance sheet which accompanied Beck's Chapter X petition showed total assets of \$45.5 million on January 30, 1971 as against approximately \$58.8 million in liabilities on that date. Beck's 3,286,000 outstanding shares of common stock are held by about 1,970 persons.

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTION

AIRLINE VALET BAGGAGE ENJOINED. The SEC Denver Regional Office announced August 2 that on July 27 the U. S. District Court in Denver, Colo., permanently enjoined Airline Valet Baggage, Inc., formerly Western Plains Oil & Gas Co., d/b/a A.A.R.T. Communications Corporation from violation of the registration provisions of the Federal securities laws. (LR-5120)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONAL CAPITAL INVESTMENTS. The SEC has issued a notice under the Investment Company Act giving interested persons until August 25 to request a hearing upon an application of National Capital Investments, Inc., Boston closed-end, non-diversified management investment company, for an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. National Capital Investments represents that it has no shareholders that no public offering or sale of its common stock has been or is intended to be made. It has no assets of any kind. (Release IC-6661) 1/

HOME LIFE. The SEC has issued a notice under the Investment Company Act giving interested persons until August 26 to request a hearing upon an application of Home Life Insurance Company, New York mutual insurance company and its wholly-owned subsidiaries to which it acts as investment adviser, Home Life Equity Fund, Inc., Baltimore mutual fund, for an order exempting a proposed transaction from certain provisions of the Act. Home Life issues certain variable annuity contracts under Separate Account B, which account is excluded from registration as an investment company. Home Life proposes to transfer all of the assets of Account B to the Fund in exchange for Fund shares. The exemption is sought because under the Act it is unlawful for an affiliated person of a registered investment company, acting as principal, knowingly to sell property to such company. THE ALBERTA GOVERNMENT TELEPHONES COMMISSION (the Commission), (U.S.Agent: Hon. Bruce I. Rankin, Canadian Consulate General, 680 Fifth Ave., New York 10019), filed a registration statement on July 30 seeking registration of \$25 million of debentures, due 1996 (guaranteed unconditionally by the Province of Alberta) to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by Halsey, Stuart & Co., Inc., 123 South LaSalle St., Chicago, Ill 60690. The Commission operates telecommunication systems in the Province. Net proceed policy applied to the cost of the Commission's construction program. (File 2-41352)

SI HANDLING SYSTEMS, INC., Kesslersville Rd., Easton, Pa., 18042, filed a registration statement on July 30 seeking registration of \$2.5 million of convertible subordinated debentures, due 1991, to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by C.
