COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENT

PICKARD & LIFTIN NAMED SPECIAL COUNSEL TO CHAIRMAN. Chairman William J. Casey of the SEC today announced that Lee A. Pickard and John M. Liftin were appointed to his staff effective August 4 and August 9, 1971, respectively, in the positions of Special Counsel to the Chairman.

Mr. Pickard, a member of the Bar and a native of New York, was born on November 5, 1938. He received his A.B. from Colgate University in 1960 where he was Phi Beta Kappa and an Austin-Colgate Scholar, and his LL.B. from Harvard Law School in 1963. Immediately prior to joining the Commission's staff, Mr. Pickard was associated with the firm of Mudge Rose Guthrie & Alexander in New York City.

Mr. Liftin, a member of the Bar of New York and a native of Washington, D. C., was born on June 25, 1943. He received his A.B. from the University of Pennsylvania in 1964, and his LL.B. Cum Laude from Columbia Law School in 1967, where he was a Stone Scholar. Immediately prior to joining the Commission's staff, Mr. Liftin was a law associate with the firm of Sullivan & Cromwell in New York City.

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

MANHATTAN-WEST CORP., OTHERS ENJOINED. The SEC Denver Regional Office announced August 5 that the Federal Court in Utah preliminarily enjoined from violation of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in the offer and sale of stock of Mountain States Development Company by the following: Manhattan-West Corp., Los Angeles, Edward H. Ashdown, Robert H. Collins III, Leon Fromkess, Larry C. Mills and William Z. Nathan, all of Los Angeles, Calif.; and Maxwell Bentley, W. D. Nebeker, Jr., and Ted Poulsen, all of Salt Lake City, Utah.

The Court also permanently enjoined, by default, Irvin Cobb of El Paso, Texas, from the above mentioned violations. A motion for summary judgement in favor of defendant William Stein of Los Angeles, was granted. (LR-5129)

A.R. HENDERSON AND JOHN SWAVING CONVICTED. The SEC Denver Regional Office announced August 6 that the Federal Court in North Dakota had convicted A.R. (Bobby) Henderson on two counts of securities fraud and two counts of mail fraud and John A.O. Swaving on two counts of securities fraud in connection with the offer and sale of securities of Shoppers Charge Plan, Inc. (LR-5130)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASE

FUND OF LETTERS. The SEC has issued a notice under the Investment Company Act giving interested persons until August 26 to request a hearing upon an application of Fund of Letters, Inc., a closed-end, diversified investment management company, Computer Machinery Corp. (CMC), James K. Sweeney, John L. Moser, Peter F. Zinsli and Arthur J. Elias, all of Los Angeles, permitting them to jointly sell 1,200,000 shares of CMC, of which CMC would offer 850,000 shares, the Fund up to 300,000 and the balance by other applicants. The Fund owns 7.78% of the outstanding common stock of CMC, Sweeney, president of CMC 28.6%, Moser and Zinsli, vice president, owns 10.6% and 10.5% and Elias, an employee, 6.2%. Because the Fund is an affiliated person of CMC and Sweeney, Moser and Zinsli, and Elias are affiliated persons of an affiliated person of the Fund, Commission approval of the transaction is required. 1/ (Release IC-6671)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASE

ARKANSAS POWER. The SEC has issued an order under the Holding Company Act authorizing Arkansas Power and Light Company, Pine Bluff, subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to amend its charter to include in the resolution creating any future series of the company's preferred stock appropriate provisions restricting redemption thereof and to solicit proxies from holders of its preferred stock in connection therewith. SECURITIES ACT REGISTRATIONS

KUSTOM ELECTRONICS, INC., 1010 W. Chestnut, Chanute, Kans. 66720, filed a registration statement on August 9 seeking registration of 450,000 shares of common stock, of which 100,000 are to be offered for public sale by the company and 350,000 (being outstanding shares) by the holders thereof. The offering is to be made (*at \$10 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by First California Company, Inc., 555 California St., San Francisco, Calif. 94104. The company manufactures and distributes products used in the mesic industry and in connection with law enforcement. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale plus \$630,000 expected to be received from debtors to the company, \$815,000 will be used to repay certain short and long-term debt and the balance primarily for payment of Federal income taxes. The company is engaged in franchising independently owned specialty food stores, Net proceeds of its stock sale will be used to create a fund to provide loans to franchisees (\$400,000) to provide a revolving fund for the installation of specialty stores (\$275,000) and for working capital and other corporate purposes.
