DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

K & M SECURITIES REVOKED, LESLIE KATZ AND ALBERT J. MARENGO BARRED. The SEC has revoked the broker-dealer registration of K & M Securities Corporation of New York, N. Y., and barred Leslie Katz, its president, and Albert J. Marengo, its vice president, secretary and treasurer, from association with any broker or dealer.

The revocation and bars were based on findings that during various periods from July, 1970, to March, 1971, K & M, aided and abetted by Katz and Marengo, violated provisions of the Exchange Act by filing a false report of financial condition, effecting securities transactions while its aggregate indebtedness exceeded 2,000 percent of its net capital and its net capital was less than \$5,000, and by filing false and misleading amendments to its registration application.

The Commission order was issued pursuant to an offer of settlement in which respondents, without admitting or denying the allegations in the order for proceedings, consented to findings of violations as alleged and to the revocation and bars. (Release 34-9317)

ZENITH SECURITIES REVOKED. The SEC has revoked the broker-dealer registration of Zenith Securities Ltd., New York, N. Y. The action was based on findings that the firm had violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Acts. It was found that during the period August 1969-Jenuary 1970, the firm had offered and sold unregistered stock of Diston Industries, Inc., and had arranged for certain securities firms to publish quotations for the stocks of Diston and Stern-Haskell, Inc. at prices not reasonably related to their value and sided and sbetted others to dominate and manipulate the market for them by effecting transactions intended to influence the market price and create a false appearance of activity. It was also found that the firm made false and misleading statements respecting the distribution of and scheme to manipulate the market in those stocks. The Commission's action was taken pursuant to the firm's consent, in which it consented to the findings and revocation without admitting or denying the charges. (Release 34-9319)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC ORDER CITES MIDWESTERN SECURITIES. The Commission today announced proceedings against Midwestern Securities, Inc., Columbus, Ohio, and its president, Daniel Arthur Jacobs based upon the allegations of the Division of Trading and Markets that the respondents violated and aided and abetted violations of the financial reporting and the net capital provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Division also charged the respondents with having failed to reasonably supervise in connection with the aforementioned alleged violations. The Commission also ordered proceedings to determine whether, pending final determination of the issues set forth above, it is necessary or appropriate in the public interest or for the protection of investors to suspend the registration of registrant.

Hearings will be scheduled by further order to afford respondents an opportunity to refute the staff's allegations and to establish any defenses, and to determine, what, if any, remedial action is appropriate in the public interest.

SEC ORDER CITES KEENER SECURITIES. The Commission today announced proceedings against Keener Securities, Ferndale, Mich. and its president, John W. Keener based upon the allegations of the Division of Trading and Markets that the respondents violated the credit balance, bookkeeping and financial reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Division also charged the respondents with having failed to reasonably supervise in connection with the above violations.

A hearing will be scheduled by further order to afford respondents an opportunity to refute the staff's allegations and to establish any defenses, and to determine, what, if any, remedial action is appropriate in the public interest.

WOODLAWN LEASING REG A SUSPENDED. The Commission has issued an order permanently suspending an exemption from registration under Regulation A of the Securities Act of 1933 with respect to an offering of 250 bonds at \$1,000 per unit for an aggregate of \$250,000 by Woodlawn Leasing Corporation, Alexandria, Va. On June 22 the Commission temporarily suspended the exemption asserting at that time that among other things, (1) the Issuer had failed to disclose the offer and sale of unregistered securities of its affiliates, (2) had exceeded the \$300,000 ceiling limitation existing at that time, and (3) had failed to file a letter offering the bonds to shareholders of Universal Holding Corporation, an affiliate under the revised terms.

SEE RISE IN 1971 PLANT AND EQUIPMENT OUTLAY. Business investment in new plant and equipment is projected at \$81.4 billion in 1971, 2.2 percent above 1970, according to the survey taken in late July and early August by the Office of Business Economics of the Department of Commerce and the SEC. Actual capital outlays were at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$81.6 billion in the second quarter, 3 percent above the first quarter; this advance followed a rise of about 1 percent from the fourth quarter of 1970 to the first quarter of 1971. Businessmen are expecting outlays to rise to an annual rate of \$82,4 billion in the current quarter with little change in the final quarter of the year. (For further details, see Stat. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

F-D CAPITAL FUND. The SEC has issued an order under the Investment Company Act rescinding a prior order of the Commission dated August 28, 1970 (Rel. IC-6178) which permitted F-D Capital Fund, of Boston, to (1) suspend the right of redemption of its outstanding redeemable securities and (2) postpone the date of payment for shares submitted for redemption but upon which payment had not been made as of the date and time of the order, until either ten days after the Fund gave the Commission notice of intention to resume redemptions and payments therefor, or (3) the Commission on its own initiative rescinded the order. The rescission is effective at the end of the day on September 10. On August 20, the Fund notified the Commission that it had determined the fair value of the remaining amounts due to Fund from First Devonshire Corporation, its former principal underwriter and parent of the former investment adviser which had been adjudged a bankrupt. Accordingly, the Fund notified the Commission of its intention to resume redemptions and payments therefor as soon as possible, but not earlier than a time to be determined by the Commission. (Rel. NORRIS GRAIN CO. The SEC has issued an order under the Investment Company Act upon in application of Norris Grain Company, Chicago, exempting from certain provisions of the Act the purchase by Norris (a) from New England Merchants National Bank of Boston (acting on behalf of Waltham Resources Corp.) of 690,000 shares of common stock of Waltham Industries Corporation for \$2,518,500 (\$3.65 per share) and (b) from Chemical Bank of New York (acting on behalf of Waltham Resources) of 10,000 shares of common stock of Industries for \$36,500 (\$3.65 per share). The purchases by Norris were consummated without first obtaining an exemptive order under the Act after the parties requested and obtained a "no-action" letter from the Commission's staff. (Rel. SECURITIES ACT REGISTRATIONS

MUNICIPAL INVESTMENT TRUST FUND, FIRST MICHIGAN SERIES, filed a registration statement on August 26 seeking registration of \$12,600,000 of units. The Fund was created by a trust agreement under which Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Inc., Bache & Co. Inc. and Walston & Co., Inc. act as sponsors, United States Trust Company of New York acts as trustee and Standard & Poor's Corporation acts as evaluator. The Fund consists of the diversified tax exempt bond portfolio of interest-bearing obligations issued by or on behalf of the State of Michigan and counties and municipalities therein and authorities and political subdivisions thereof, the interest on which is, in the opinion of recognized bond counsel, exempt from certain Michigan taxes and all Federal income tax under existing law. MADISON FUND, INC., 660 Madison Ave., New York 10021, filed a registration statement on August 20 seeking registration of 1,014,000 shares of common stock. These shares may be issued by the Fund in payment of dividends and distributions, or for investment of contributions under retirement plans established under The Self-Employed Individuals Tax Retirement Act of 1962, or may be issued in connection with acquisitions. The Fund is closed-end, management investment company which invests principally in common stocks. (File 2-41519)

RAYNE INDUSTRIES, INCORPORATED, 350 Hudson St., New York 10014, filed a registration statement on August 27 seeking registration of 150,000 shares of common stock, and 50,000 common stock purchase warrants, to be offered for public sale in units, each consisting of three shares and one warrant. The offering is to be made through underwriters headed by Cannon, Jerold & Co., Inc., 77 Water St., New York 10005. Also included in this statement are 16,500 outstanding shares of common stock which may be offered for sale from time to time by the holders thereof at prices current at the time of sale (*\$4.75 per share maximum). The company is engaged in various aspects of the graphic arts industry and activities incidental thereto. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, \$300,000 will be used for equipment for subsidiaries and the balance for expansion of a subsidiary. (File 2-41603)

ARMIN POLY FIRM CORPORATION, 301 West Side Ave., Jersey City, N. J. 07305, filed a registration statement on August 27 seeking registration of 300,000 shares of common stock, of which 150,000 are to be offered for public sale by the company and 150,000 (being outstanding shares) by the holders thereof. The offering is to be made (*at \$15 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by Edwards & Hanly Securities, Inc., One Whitehall St., New York. The company is engaged in the design, manufacture and sale of polyethylene products and the importing and assembling of watches and watch movements. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, \$650,000 will be used for the purchase of additional machinery and equipment and the balance for working capital and other corporate purposes. (File 2-41604)

THE COCA COLA BOTTLING COMPANY OF MIANI, INC., 3601 N. W. 55th St., Miami, Fla. 33142, filed a registration statement on August 27 seeking registration of 500,000 shares of common stock, to be offered for public sale (*at \$21 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by Eastman Dillon, Union Securities & Co., Inc., One Chase Hanhattan Flasa, New York 10005. The company, after making certain acquisitions, will engage in bottling and marketing of Coca-Cola and other soft drink products. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, \$6,131,355 will be used to discharge a 5% promissory hote of one of the companies acquired and the balance for working capital and other corporate purposes. THE KROGER CO., 1014 Vine St., Cincinnsti, Ohio 45201, filed a registration statement on August 27 seeking registration of 135,000 outstanding shares of common stock, which may be offered for sale from time to time by the holders thereof at prices current at the time of sale (*\$31.75 per share maximum).
