COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

CHANGE IN WEEKLY CALENDAR

The Senate Appropriations Hearing scheduled for April 24 at 9:30 a.m. in Room S-146, U.S. Capitol, has been postponed. The hearing has not yet been rescheduled.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

RUSSELL G. DAVY BARRED FROM COMMISSION PRACTICE

The Commission denied Russell G. Davy, a San Francisco accountant, the privilege of appearing or practicing before it. The Commission found that, in his certification of financial statements of SNG & Oil Energy Company that were included in a registration statement filed with the Commission in 1979, Davy violated antifraud provisions of the securities acts and engaged in improper professional conduct.

The Commission found that Davy had no reasonable basis for certifying SNG's ownership of real estate and mineral rights that accounted for the bulk of its purported assets, or for certifying the company's income statement showing substantial sales when he knew that SNG had no business operations. The Commission also found that Davy ignored information that he received both before and after his audit that should have put him on notice that SNG's financial statements contained materially false information.

In determining to bar Davy from practice before it, the Commission stated: "[Davy did not exercise] the independent judgment required of a certified public accountant. ... [His] abdication of his professional responsibility as an auditor cannot be condoned. Such breaches of professional responsibility 'jeopardize the achievement of the objectives of the securities laws and can inflict great damage on public investors.'" (Rel. AAE-53)

TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN COELCO, LTD.

The Commission announced the temporary suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of CoElco, Ltd., a Nevada corporation with offices located in Fountain Valley, California, for a ten-day period beginning on April 23 and terminating at midnight (EDT) on May 2, 1985.

The Commission suspended trading in CoElco's securities because of a lack of adequate and accurate public information concerning, among other things, its assets, financial condition, transactions with affiliated companies, and preparation and certification of its financial statements.

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SOUTHEASTERN GROWTH FUND, INC.

An order has been issued granting Keystone Provident Life Insurance Company, KMA Variable Account, Keystone Provident Financial Services Corp. and Keystone Massachusetts Distributors Inc. an exemption from the provisions of Sections 26(a) and 27(c)(2) to permit them to deduct a mortality and expense risk charge from the account value of certain variable annuity contracts.
