CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST DAVID J. SWAIN AND ALVIN R. BROERMAN

> The Chicago Regional Office announced that on August 26 Judge Charles Norgle of the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, entered an Order of Permanent Injunction against David J. Swain from future violations of the securities and broker-dealer registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws, and on August 27, against Alvin R. Broerman from future violations of the securities registration and antifraud provisions of the securities registration and antifraud

The July 1 complaint alleges that from about February 1984 to about July 1984, Swain, Broerman and others offered and sold unregistered securities in the form of partnership interests in oil and gas wells to hundreds of investors nationwide and raised several million dollars. The complaint further alleges that the defendants made misrepresentations and omissions concerning, among other things, the history of sanctions entered against them by various state agencies and state and federal courts, the cost of the wells, the investment risks, the identity of the drilling company, the sales commissions and the misuse of investor proceeds. Additionally, the complaint alleges that Swain and others acted as unregistered securities brokers. (SEC v. Alvin Petroleum, Inc., et al., Civil Action No. 85C 06032, filed July 1, 1985). (LR-10859)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

BLACKSTONE VALLEY ELECTRIC COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 23 to request a hearing on a proposal by Blackstone Valley Electric Company (BVEC), subsidiary of Eastern Utilities Associates, to permit the issuance or assumption by BVEC of unsecured indebtedness having maturities of less than ten years. This proposal requires the consent of a majority of the preferred stockholders because the terms of the preferred stock restrict the amount of unsecured debt that can be assumed by BVEC. In connection therewith, BVEC proposes, and is hereby authorized, to solicit proxies from the holders of its preferred stock. (Rel. 35-23810 - Aug. 30)

GEORGIA POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Georgia Power Company, subsidiary of The Southern Company, to finance pollution control facilities in an amount not to exceed \$200 million. Jurisdiction has been reserved over additional pollution control financing and/or the issuance and sale of first mortgage bonds in an amount not to exceed \$200 million and the issuance and sale of up to \$100 million of preferred stock. THE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a proposal by The Columbia Gas System, Inc., a registered holding company, and its subsidiary, Big Marsh Oil Company, whereby Columbia will purchase any shares of Big Marsh common stock offered for sale by minority shareholders through February 28, 1986 at a per-share price of \$1,775. MIDDLE SOUTH UTILITIES, INC.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NYSE-85-27) to extend the NYSE trading day one-half hour by opening trading at 9:30 a.m. as of September 30, 1985. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of September 2. (Rel. 34-22338)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved proposed rule changes filed by the Options Clearing Corporation (SR-OCC-85-9 and SR-OCC-85-11) authorizing OCC to issue, clear and settle European-style options (options that can be exercised only on their expiration date). The proposals also establish on a permanent basis OCC's "Delivery-Versus-Payment" foreign currency option exercise settlement procedure and make that procedure available to all foreign currency clearing members.
