## **RULES AND RELATED MATTERS**

### ADOPTION OF RULE 205-3

The Commission adopted Rule 205-3 under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The rule will permit registered investment advisers to charge fees based on the capital gains on, or capital appreciation of, client accounts when certain provisions have been met. (Rel. IA-996)

### ADOPTION OF NEW FORM N-14

The Commission adopted new Form N-14 for the registration of securities issued by registered management investment companies and business development companies in business combination transactions, and a new rule and rule amendments for the filing and processing of the form. (Rel. 33-6611)

REINSTATEMENT OF THRESHOLD PERCENTAGE TESTS FOR RULE 14a-8(c)(12)

The Commission has reinstated the threshold percentage tests in effect prior to January 1984 for Rule 14a-8(c)(12) under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, pursuant to a district court order. The reinstated provisions state that a shareholder proposal is eligible for resubmission if it receives a 3 percent vote the first time it is included in a registrant's proxy material or a 6 percent vote the second time it is included. The 10 percent vote required for resubmission of proposals included three or more times remains unchanged. Effective date: (Upon publication in the Federal Register). # **HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

## EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 9 to request a hearing on a proposal by Eastern Utilities Associates (EUA), a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries, Eastern Edison Company, Blackstone Valley Electric Company and Montaup Electric Company (collectively "the Operating Companies"). The Operating Companies will issue short-term notes to banks in aggregate amounts outstanding at any one time not to exceed \$10 million for Eastern Edison, \$30 million for Montaup and \$10 million for Blackstone. EUA also requests authorization to make a capital contribution to Blackstone of not in excess of \$5 million. (Rel. 35-23905 - Nov. 14)

## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

#### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (SR-NASD-85-28) which amends its Rules of Fair Practice to clarify the supervisory and oversight responsibilities of member firms when a person associated with a member engages in private securities transactions. The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the Midwest Securities Trust Company (SR-MSTC-85-4) amending its By-Laws to allow for staggered three-year terms for members of the Board of Directors. (Rel. 34-22622)

# TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

### CITICORP

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 9 to request a hearing on an application filed by Citicorp under Section 310(b)(1)(ii) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939. The application declares that the trusteeship of The United States Trust Company of New York under four existing indentures, and a pooling and servicing agreement dated September 1, 1985 under which certificates evidencing interests in a pool of mortgage loans have been issued, is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify the Trust Company from acting as trustee. The Trust Company's four existing indentures are dated: February 15, 1972, involving the issuance of floating rate notes, due 1989; (2) March 15, 1977, involving the issuance of various series of unsecured and unsubordinated notes; (3) August 25, 1977, involving the issuance of rising-rate notes, Series A; and (4) April 21, 1980, involving the issuance of various series of unsecured and unsubordinated notes.
