HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASE

JERSEY CENTRAL P&L RECEIVES ORDER. The SEC has issued an order under the Holding Company Act (Release 35-16828) upon an application of the Jersey Central Power & Light Co. ("Jersey Central"), Metropolitan Edison Company ("Met-Ed"), and the Pennsylvania Electric Co. ("Penelec"), subsidiaries of the General Public Utilities Corp., permitting Penelec to join Met-Ed and Jersey Central in financing a nuclear generating station on the Three Mile Island located on the Susquehanna River below Harrisburg, Pa., at an estimated cost aggregating \$420 million. Upon completion, the generating station will be owned by them as tenants in common with Met-Ed having an undivided 50% interest and Jersey Central and Penelec having an undivided 25% each.

WASHINGTON GAS LIGHT HEARING SET. The SEC has set September 15 as the date for hearing on the proposal of Washington Gas Light Company, which owns 336,961 of the 339,325 outstanding shares of common stock of Shenandosh Gas Company, to acquire the remaining 2,364 outstanding shares by a cash payment of \$6.50 per share.

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASE

STEADMAN FUND RECEIVES ORDER. The SEC has issued an exemption order under the Investment Company Act (Release IC-6183) on application of the Steadman American Industry Fund ("American"), Steadman Science & Growth Fund ("Science") and Consumers Investment Fund, Inc. ("Consumers"), permitting Science and Consumers to transfer substantially all of their assets to American for shares of American common stock. Steadman Security Corporation or one of its subsidiaries is the investment adviser and principal underwriter of each of the three funds.

SECURITIES ACT REGISTRATIONS

OTIS ELEVATOR TO SELL DEBENTURES. Otis Elevator Company, 260 Eleventh Ave., New York 10001, filed a registration statement (File 2-38338) with the SEC on September 9 seeking registration of \$50,000,000 of debentures due 1995, to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by The First Boston Corp., 20 Exchange Pl., New York. The interest rate, offering price and underwriting terms are to be supplied by amendment.

The company is engaged in the engineering, manufacture, erection and service of elevators and escalators. The net proceeds to be received from the bond sale will be applied to the repayment of a like principal amount of short-term notes outstanding under a revolving credit agreement with certain banks or outstanding under other short-term agreements. Ralph A. Weller is president.

WARWICK HOTEL CO. PROPOSES OFFERING. The Warwick Hotel Mortgage Company ("the Partnership"), 60 East 42nd St., New York 10017, filed a registration statement (File 2-38339) with the SEC on September 9 seeking registration of \$2,250,000 of general partnership interests, to be offered for public sale at \$10,000 per unit. No underwriting is involved. The company is a New York general partnership consisting of Lawrence A. Wien and Peter L. Malkin. Proceeds from the sale will be loaned to Warwick Hotel Associates, a New York general partnership and owner of the Warwick Hotel in Philadelphia, to be applied to repayment of the outstanding balance on the existing first mortgage on the Hotel and to pay all expenses relating to such repayment and all expenses incurred in placing a new first mortgage.

ITAT PROPOSES OFFERING. International Telephone and Telegraph Corp., 320 Park Ave., New York 10022, filed a registration statement (File 2-38341) with the SEC on September 10 seeking registration of \$100,000,000 of sinking fund debentures, due 1995, and \$50,000,000 of notes, due 1975, to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by Kuhn, Loeb and Co., 40 Wall St., and Lazard Freres and Co., 44 Wall St., both of New York. The interest rate, offering price and underwriting terms are to be supplied by amendment.

The company is engaged directly and through subsidiaries in the development, manufacture, sale, leasing and service of electronic and telecommunications equipment and industrial and consumer products and in other consumer financial and business services activities. Of the net proceeds of this financing, approximately \$130,000,000 will be applied to the reduction of bank borrowings and the balance will be used primarily for plant construction and expansion of facilities. Such bank borrowings have been incurred principally for the purpose of providing increased working capital and for financing a portion of the company's capital expenditures. Gross capital expenditures are estimated at \$650,000,000 for each of 1970 and 1971. In addition to indebtedness and preferred stock, the company has outstanding 66,013,548 shares of common stock. Harold S. Geneen is chairman and president.

NATIONAL ENERGY PROPOSES OFFERING. National Energy Corp., 1130 Lincoln Tower Bldg., <u>Denver. Colo.</u> 80203 filed a registration statement (File 2-38343) with the SEC on September 10 seeking registration of \$6,000,000 of limited partnership interests in two partnerships, the National Energy-1971 and 1971 Year-End Partnerships, which will engage primarily in the exploration for oil and gas. The interests will be offered for sale in \$10,000 units; participating NASD members will receive a 6% selling commission with an additional cash commission equal in total amount to 1% of production from properties of the partnerships, proportionate to the interests of the partnerships. National Energy and Marvin Wolf, its president, will be the general partners.

NEW JERSEY NATURAL GAS PROPOSES OFFERING. New Jersey Natural Gas Company, 601 Banks Ave., Asbury Park, N. J. 07712, filed a registration statement (File 2-38344) with the SEC on September 10 seeking registration of \$15,000,000 of first mortgage bonds, due 1995, to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by Salomon Brothers, 60 Wall St., New York. The interest rate, offering price and underwriting terms are to be aupplied by amendment. A public utility, the company proposes to utilize the net proceeds from the bond sale to reduce short-term borrowings, the proceeds of which have been expended for construction purposes. Construction costs for the fiscal year ending September 30 are estimated at \$7,000,000 and for the succeeding five years at \$24,500,000.

MISCELLANEOUS

CONTINENTAL OIL RECEIVES ORDER. The SEC has issued an order under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 determining, on application of Continental Oil Company, that the trusteeship of Morgan Guaranty Trust Company of New York under the indentures securing five issues of Continental Oil debentures is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to call for the Bank's disqualification.

CONTINENTAL VENDING TRADING BAN CONTINUED. The SEC has issued an order suspending trading in securities of Continental Vending Machine Corporation for the further ten-day period September 13-22, inclusive.
