### COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENT

SEC ORDER CITES LING & CO. The SEC has ordered administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 involving Ling & Company, Inc. ("Registrant"), of Dallas, which has been registered as a broker-dealer since 1962; Ling & Company ("Applicant"), a Delaware corporation which, as successor to Registrant, filed a registration application on November 16, 1970; Michael F. Ling, president and board chairman of both companies; Arthur S. Miller, William B. Strange, Jr., Joseph B. Northern and Warren K. Steffen, II, vice presidents of each company; and Allyn F. Taylor, vice president of Registrant until September 1970.

The proceedings are based upon allegations of the Commission's staff that between September 1969 and June 1970 Registrant, Ling, Strange and Taylor offered and sold stock of Carterfone Communications Corporation, Inc., a Minnesota corporation, in violation of the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933. It is further alleged (a) that, in connection with their transactions in securities of Carterfone and seven other companies, Registrant, Ling, Miller, Strange, Taylor and Steffen engaged in transactions, acts and practices which violated the antifraud and anti-manipulative provisions of the Securities Act and Exchange Act; and (b) that Registrant, Ling and Northern violated Rule 10b-5 by recommending and selling securities to customers of the firm at a time when the firm did not own such securities, and thereafter failed to promptly deliver the securities paid for by such customers. It also is alleged that Applicant failed to include a timely financial statement in its registration application.

The Commission's order calls for the submission of affidavits not later than December 18, 1970, on the question whether it is necessary or appropriate in the public interest to postpone the effective date of its registration application pending a hearing and determination on the question whether the staff allegations are true and, if so, whether the application should be denied.

#### HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PENN FUEL SEEKS ORDER. The SEC has issued an order under the Holding Company Act (Release 35-16928) giving interested persons until December 23 to request a hearing upon an application of Penn Fuel Gas, Inc., Oxford, Pa. holding company, to acquire all of the 200 outstanding capital shares of Oxford Gas Company, a gas utility company, from John H. Ware, in exchange for 15,609 Penn Fuel common shares. Ware also owns or controls about 92% of the 345,000 outstanding common shares of Penn Fuel. Penn Fuel (which has been granted an exemption from the Act) has 24 public utility subsidiaries, of which 23 are gas utility companies incorporated and doing business solely in Pennsylvania and one is a gas utility incorporated and doing business in Maryland and an adjacent portion of Pennsylvania. Oxford is engaged in supplying gas in Oxford, Pa., where Penn Fuel's headquarters are located, and the surrounding area.

CORRECTION RE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM. The News Digest of December 4 reported the issuance of an order by the Commission with respect to an application by the Columbia Gas System, Inc. (Release 35-16924). Columbia Gas has filed an application for an order with respect to the facts stated in the release and interested persons are given until December 28 to request a hearing thereon.

#### COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTION

BENGTZEN, GUYMON, OTHERS ENJOINED. The SEC Denver Regional Office announced December 2 (LR-4836) that the Federal court in Salt Lake City has issued an order of permanent injunction by default against Bill Bengtzen, John Guymon, Robert W. Shields, and Mick Eby, all of Salt Lake City, and Morris L. Dunlap, of Oklahoma City, Okla. enjoining them from violating the registration provisions of the Federal securities laws in the offer and sale of securities of Power Resources Corporation.

DELISTING GRANTED. The SEC has issued an order under the Securities Exchange Act (Release 34-9039) granting an application of the American Stock Exchange to strike from listing and registration the common stock of Conductron Corporation effective at the opening of business December 7, 1970. According to the application, the company fails to meet the Exchange's standards for continued listing with respect to earnings and net tangible assets. As of December 31, 1969, the company had a net tangible asset deficit of \$19,410,585, and had net losses for its past three years.
