ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

FORMER CFO SENTENCED TO JAIL FOR INSIDER TRADING

The Commission announced that on July 2 the Honorable William L. Osteen, Jr., U.S. District Court Judge in the Middle District of North Carolina, sentenced Thomas F. Lanier to thirty-five months confinement and ordered him to pay a fine of \$50,000. On March 4, 1996, Lanier was convicted on a five-count criminal indictment alleging insider trading violations in connection with transactions in the stock of Salem Carpet Mills, Inc.

The indictment alleged that in January 1992, Lanier, while then chief financial officer and a director of Salem Carpet Mills, improperly disclosed to William Clarke Lindley, his Burlington, N.C.

neighbor, material, non-public information relating to Salem's confidential merger negotiations with Shaw Industries. The merger was announced on February 10, 1992. The indictment alleged that Lindley and Lanier had agreed for Lindley to pay Lanier 35% of his trading profits from the inside information and that Lanier received \$27,500 pursuant to this agreement.

The Commission previously announced the filing of a civil action on May 24, 1995, based on the same set of facts (LR-14507). That matter is still in litigation. [U.S. v. Thomas F. Lanier, MDNC, Criminal No. 95-317] (LR-14983)

PETER TOSTO ENJOINED

On July 1, the United States District Court for Colorado issued a Final Judgment by consent against Peter C. Tosto of New York, New York enjoining him from future violations of the securities registration, antifraud and the broker-dealer registration provisions of the federal securities laws. Tosto was order to pay disgorgement and prejudgment interest in the amount of \$56,791.99 and a second tier civil penalty of \$15,000.

The complaint alleged that from July 1991 through December 1992, Tosto and two other defendants sold shares of Balance for Life, Inc. (BFL) to 15 investors for proceeds of \$328,000 while there was no registration statement in effect and misrepresented that BFL would publicly trade on Nasdaq, earn \$0.85 per share and \$2.14 per share in 24 and 36 months, and soon trade at \$17 to \$45 per share, when in fact BFL did not have sufficient assets for listing on Nasdaq, had no operations, and a net loss in 1990 of \$177,000. It also alleged that Tosto operated an unregistered broker-dealer and used cold-callers and lead lists to sell the securities of Balance for Life. [SEC v. Balance for Life, Inc., Richard K. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

TREND CAPITAL CORPORATION, INC.

Trend Capital Corporation, Inc. (Trend) has been granted a permanent order under Section 9(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Trend from Section 9(a) of the Act. The order relieves Trend of any ineligibility resulting from Trend's employment of an individual who is subject to a securities-related injunction. (Rel. IC-22079 - July 17)

VAN ECK TRUST

An order has been issued under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that Van Eck Trust has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-22080 - July 17)

SIRROM CAPITAL CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 12 to request a hearing on an application filed by Sirrom Capital Corporation for an order under Section 57(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting applicant from Section 57(a)(1) of the Act. The order would permit Sirrom to purchase a limited partnership interest in Harris Williams & Co., L.P. from Sirrom Ltd., an affiliated person of an affiliated person of Sirrom. (Rel. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE SOUTHERN COMPANY, ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing The Southern Company (Southern), a registered holding company, SEI Holdings, Inc. (Holdings), Southern Electric International, Inc., Mobile Energy Services Holdings, Inc., and certain other nonutility subsidiaries of Southern, an extension of time until June 30, 1997, to complete transactions authorized by order dated February 2, 1996 (HCAR No. 26468). The supplemental order also authorizes Holdings and certain of its nonutility subsidiaries to pay dividends to parent companies, from time to time through June 30, 1997, out of capital or unearned surplus to the extent permitted under applicable corporate law and governing documents. GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION, ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing General Public Utilities Corporation (GPU), a registered holding company, and its electric utility subsidiary companies, Jersey Central Power & Light Company, Metropolitan Edison Company and Pennsylvania Electric Company, to effect short-term borrowings in an aggregate outstanding principal amount of \$250 million under an amended credit facility, through May 6, 2001. Under the facility the operating companies may borrow up to the limitations on short-term debt contained in their respective charters and GPU may increase such borrowings from \$200 million to \$250 million. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Options Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change (SR-OCC-96-05) that will amend OCC's by-laws and rules to provide for the issuance, clearance, and settlement of new equity derivative products referred to as Dividend Value of Stock, and Options with Limited Stock and Residual Interest in Stock. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of July 22. (Rel. 34-37438)

The American Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-Amex-96-28) to list and trade indexed term notes on a portfolio of equity securities representing the ten highest yielding stocks in the Dow Jones Industrial Average. Publication of the notice is expected in the Federal Register during the week of July 22. (Rel. 34-37444)

The <u>American Stock Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-Amex-96-27) relating to the listing and trading of Indexed Term Notes based in whole or in part on changes in the value of twenty-nine healthcare/biotechnology industry securities. Publication of the notice is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of July 22. (Rel. 34-37447)

The <u>Pacific Stock Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-PSE-96-15) and an amendment thereto relating to investment company units. Publication of the notice is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of July 22. (Rel. 34-37452; IS-1006)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change submitted by the <u>Chicago Stock Exchange</u> (SR-CHX-96-18) to extend until December 31, 1996 its system enhancement relating to the automatic execution of non-marketable limit orders, and extend until August 31, 1996 the deadline for filing a report to the Commission describing the Exchange's experience with the program. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of July 22. (Rel. 34-37442).

The Commission approved on an accelerated basis a proposed rule change (SR-NYSE-95-42), as amended, by the <u>New York Stock Exchange</u> that establishes uniform listing and trading guidelines for narrow-based stock index warrants. Publication of the Order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of July 22. (Rel. 34-37445)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change filed by the <u>Chicago Stock Exchange</u> to allow the addition of an odd-lot dealer CUSIP fee to Section (o) of its Membership Dues and Fees Schedule (SR-CHX-96-17) has become effective. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of July 22. (Rel. 34-37443)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the <u>American Stock Exchange</u> (SR-Amex-96-16) to extend a pilot program that permits a specialist to effect liquidating transactions under certain circumstances until September 23. (Rel. 34-37448)

The Commission approved a proposed rule change submitted by the <u>New York Stock Exchange</u> (SR-NYSE-96-11) to amend Section 202.06(B) and Section 202.06(C) of its Listed Company Manual to require the NYSE's listed companies to disseminate to Bloomberg Business News information or news which might reasonably be expected to materially affect the market for their securities. Publication of the order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of July 22. (Rel 34-37450)

TEMPORARY APPROVAL ON AN ACCELERATED BASIS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted temporary approval on an accelerated basis of a proposed rule change (SR-OCC-96-06) filed by The Options Clearing Corporation. The proposal will extend the order granting temporary approval of OCC's use of its Theoretical Intermarket Margin Syster for calculating clearing margin positions in equity options through November 30. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of July 22. (Rel. 34-37449)
