COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

COMMISSION STAFF ISSUES SAB 101A TO PROVIDE REGISTRANTS WITH ADDITIONAL TIME TO IMPLEMENT GUIDANCE ON REVENUE RECOGNITION

On March 24, the staff of the Securities and Exchange Commission announced that registrants with fiscal years that begin between December 16, 1999 and March 15, 2000 may take an additional three months to implement Staff Accounting Bulletin (SAB) No. 101. SAB 101 provides guidance on the recognition, presentation, and disclosure of revenue in financial statements filed with the Commission.

Since the issuance of SAB 101, the staff has received requests from a number of groups asking for additional time to study that guidance. In addition, the staff is aware that many companies have calendar fiscal year-ends and may need more time to perform a detailed review of the SAB since its issuance on December 3, 1999. Registrants with fiscal years that begin between December 16, 1999 and March 15, 2000 would be given the option of implementing SAB 101 in the second quarter of their fiscal year beginning after December 15, 1999, instead of needing to implement in the first quarter, as originally provided in SAB 101.

Lynn E. Turner, the Commission's Chief Accountant, stated, "The staff at the Commission is interested in assuring that the business community be provided with the additional time necessary to get this done right."

SAB 101A has been issued to reflect the change, and is available on the SEC website at www.sec.gov. SABs are not rules or interpretations of the Commission; they represent interpretations of existing rules, standards, and practices followed by staff of the Office of the Chief Accountant and the Division of Corporation Finance in administering the disclosure requirements of the federal securities laws.

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

BRENT WAGMAN, WARREN DONOHUE, AND MARGARET SWINNEY CHARGED WITH SECURITIES FRAUD

On March 21, a grand jury in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas (Dallas Division) returned an indictment against Brent A. Wagman, Warren L. Donohue and Margaret F. Swinney charging the defendants with two counts of securities fraud. The indictment stems from the fund-raising activities of Redbank Petroleum, Inc. and AmeriTech Petroleum, Inc., two Dallas-based companies that sold nine-month promissory notes to the general public from November 1996 through June 1999. The indictment alleged that the defendants made material misrepresentations and omissions to the public to encourage investments in Redbank and AmeriTech.

Mr. Wagman, the former president of Redbank and AmeriTech, is presently in the custody of federal authorities. On March 10, 2000 he was arrested in Panama and brought back to the United States to face criminal charges. He and his family had fled to Panama last summer after he was named in a parallel civil action brought by the Securities and Exchange Commission.

The Commission's complaint alleged that Redbank and Ameritech, at Wagman's direction. offered and sold approximately \$30 million in so-called high interest corporate notes to investors in numerous states. The corporate notes were offered to retirees and others as risk-free investments with above market rates of return, and backed by an unconditional guarantee by an independent insurance company. In fact, no such guarantee existed. Rather than using investors' monies for the stated purposes, funds were diverted to fund the operations of several other entities under Wagman's control, and for personal expenses of Wagman. The defendants also used investors' funds as "Ponzi" payments to lull existing investors and to lure new ones. [SEC v. JUDGMENT ENTERED AGAINST ATTORNEY IN INSIDER TRADING ACTION

On March 8, the Honorable Edward Rafeedie, United States District Judge for the Central District of California, entered a judgment of permanent injunction and other relief against Raymond G. Kolts. The Commission charged Kolts with insider trading in the stock of Trimedyne, Inc. The judgment permanently enjoins Kolts from violating the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The judgment also orders Kolts to disgorge his ill-gotten gains in the amount of \$30,187.50, plus prejudgment interest in the amount of \$6,643.68, and imposed civil penalties of \$30,187.50.

The Commission's complaint, filed June 22, 1999, alleged that Kolts, an attorney, purchased shares of Trimedyne while in possession of confidential corporate information, which he acquired during the course of representing a Trimedyne employee in a deposition.

The final judgment enjoins Kolts from future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. Kolts consented to the entry of the final judgment without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations. [SEC v. Raymond G. Kolts, Civil Action No. 99-06363, RZx, C.D. Cal.] (LR-16486)

INSIDER TRADING CASE AGAINST ANDREA CAPUTO AND GERARD BELL

On March 9, the Commission filed an insider trading case against Andrea Caputo and Gerard J. Bell for trading in advance of the Thomson Corporation's tender offer for MEDSTAT Group, Inc. The complaint charges them with violations of Exchange Act Section 14(e) and Rule 14e-3. The complaint alleges that Caputo, who already owned some Medstat stock, learned of Thomson's plans to acquire Medstat when a close friend and Thomson insider warned her not to buy any more or tell anyone about it because Thomson had an interest in acquiring Medstat. Ignoring the warning, Caputo purchased more Medstat stock for herself and tipped her friend Bell. Caputo and Bell also recommended the stock to others who also bought it. Simultaneously with the filing of the complaint, Caputo settled the action by consenting to the entry of a permanent injunction and agreeing to pay a combined total of approximately \$237,000 in disgorgement of illegal profits, prejudgment interest, and penalties, without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations. The complaint seeks approximately \$167,950 in disgorgement from Bell plus prejudgment interest and penalties. [SEC v. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

STI CLASSIC FUNDS, ET AL.

An order has been issued on an application filed by STI Classic Funds (STI Funds), ESC Strategic Funds, Inc. (ESC Funds) and SunTrust Banks, Inc. for an order under Section 17(b) of the Investment Company Act exempting applicants from Section 17(a) of the Act. The order permits certain series of STI Funds to acquire all of the assets and certain stated liabilities of the series of ESC Funds. Because of certain affiliations, applicants may not rely on Rule 17a-8 under the Act. (Rel. IC-24365 - March 24)

SELIGMAN PORTFOLIOS, INC. AND J.W. SELIGMAN & CO., INC.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Seligman Portfolios, Inc. (Seligman Portfolios) and J.W. Seligman & Co., Inc. (Seligman) from the provisions of Sections 9(a), 13(a), 15(a) and 15(b) of the Act, and Rules 6e-2(b)(15) and 6e-3(T)(b)(15) thereunder, to permit shares of Seligman Portfolios

and shares of any other open-end investment company that is designed to fund insurance products, and for which Seligman or any of its affiliates may serve, now or in the future, as investment adviser, administrator, manager, principal underwriter or sponsor to be sold to and held by: (1) variable annuity and variable life insurance separate accounts of both affiliated and unaffiliated life insurance companies; and (2) qualified pension and retirement plans outside of the separate account context. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ENTERGY CORPORATION, ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a proposal by System Energy Resources, Inc., a utility subsidiary of Entergy Corporation, a registered holding company, to pay increased fees in connection with obtaining letters of credit. (Rel. 35-27157)

AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, INC., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 18, 2000 to request a hearing on a proposal by American Electric Power Company, Inc., (AEP) a registered holding company, and AEP Resources Service Company (RESCO), a wholly owned service subsidiary of AEP. Applicants seek an exemption under certain circumstances from the "at cost" requirements of Rules 90 and 91 for authorized services RESCO or its subsidiaries render to any partially owned projects that relate to the generation, transmission and distribution of electric power and for services rendered to any subsidiary of AEP Resources, Inc., a nonutility subsidiary of AEP. Applicants also propose to: 1) extend the authorization period of AEP's guarantee authority ("Guarantee Authority") from December 31, 2001 to June 30, 2004; 2) increase AEP's Guarantee Authority of RESCO's debt to third parties from \$51 million to \$400 million; and 3) increase the Guarantee Authority to issue guarantees and assumptions of liability on behalf of RESCO to third parties from \$200 million to \$400 million. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

FILING OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> filed Amendment No. 4 to a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-99-53) under Rule 19b-4 of the Securities Exchange Act relating to the establishment of the Nasdaq Order Display Facility and to modifications of the Nasdaq Trading Platform. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of March 27. (Rel. 34-42573)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change submitted under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NASD-99-37) by the <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> to permit the use of "Hard to Borrow" lists to comply with affirmative determination requirements for short sales. Publication of the order in the <u>Federal Register</u> is expected during the week of March 27. (Rel. 34-42571)
