

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

ROBERT DEBIASSE SENTENCED

The Philadelphia Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania announced that on February 26 Robert E. DeBiasse was sentenced by U.S. District Court Judge Joseph S. Lord, III, to three years imprisonment to be followed by five years probation. On December 2, 1987, DeBiasse pled guilty to two criminal counts - racketeering (RICO) and obstruction of a Commission investigation. The Commission had filed an injunctive action against DeBiasse and others on November 13, 1986, and DeBiasse had been indicted on that date on 25 criminal counts. Both actions arose from the financial fraud surrounding the initial public offering of Computer Input Services, Inc. (CISI) in April 1982. DeBiasse was president and chairman of CISI and sole shareholder before the public offering.

In addition to the guilty plea, DeBiasse agreed to forfeit \$1 million to the United States pursuant to the RICO provisions, to be distributed to those victimized by the fraud. DeBiasse also consented to an injunction in the Commission's action, which was entered on December 2, 1987, permanently enjoining him from future violations of the antifraud, reporting, books and records, and internal controls provisions of the securities laws. JOHN E. WORTHEN INDICTED

The U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of California, the Denver Regional and Salt Lake City Branch Offices announced that a federal grand jury in San Diego, California returned a sealed indictment charging John E. Worthen, also known as John Walton of Salt Lake City, with 12 counts of criminial contempt. The indictment was unsealed on February 1. The indictment charges Worthen with conduct violating an injunction obtained by the Commission on July 10, 1974 [SEC v. Royal Airline, Inc., John E. Worthen, aka John Walton, et al., SDCA, Civil Action No. 74-202N], which enjoined him from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

The indictment alleges that Worthen, among other things, engaged in a scheme to defraud investors involving the sale of unregistered stock of Western Pacific Technology, Inc. and Nordic Limited, Inc., both Nevada corporations. Worthen allegedly manipulated the market price of the stock of both companies through a series of manipulative securities transactions using nominee accounts and false statements and omissions concerning the assets and operations of the companies.

A warrant was issued for Worthen's arrest. (U.S. v. John E. Worthen, aka John Walton, USDC SDCA, Criminal Action No. 87-1387N). (LR-11667)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

METLIFE-STATE STREET EQUITY TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 30 to request a hearing on an application filed by certain series of the Metlife-State Street Funds and their adviser, Metlife-State Street Investment Services, Inc. for an order permitting such series to enter into deferred fee arrangements with their directors or trustees and to effect certain transactions incident to such arrangements. DELAWARE GROUP CALIFORNIA TAX-FREE FUND, INC.

An order has been issued declaring that Delaware Group California Tax-Free Fund, Inc. has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-16303 - Mar. 7)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GEORGIA POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 28 to request a hearing on a proposal by the following company filed under Release 35-24593, dated March 3: <u>GEORGIA POWER COMPANY</u> - subsidiary of The Southern Company, to issue and sell by December 31, 1989 first mortgage bonds, preferred stock, pollution control revenue bonds, and effect borrowings in the form of term loans, in an aggregate amount up to \$1,050,000,000 with specified sub-limits for each security.

Georgia proposes to issue and sell from time to time, on or prior to December 31, 1989, short-term notes to banks and commercial paper to dealers in an aggregate amount at any one time outstanding of up to \$1 billion. Georgia also proposes to enter into interest rate swap agreements covering an underlying principal amount of debt not to exceed \$1 billion.

The Options Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change (SR-OCC-87-24) that would make permanent a temporary rule that enables it to waive clearing member margin requirements in certain circumstances. TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

SIGNAL CAPITAL CORPORATION

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application by Signal Capital Corporation that the trusteeship of Continental Illinois National Bank and Trust Company of Chicago under two Signal indentures is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary in the public interest or for the protection of investors to disgualify the Bank from acting as trustee under either indenture.
